At this time of the year the most important thing which a State Committee can do is to select county and local chairmen so that they can get to work on their local programs just as soon as possible. We will, of course, send Guidebooks and other campaign materials to each local and county chairman.

After you have had opportunity to look over the material which we have sent to you, please let me know of any questions which it may raise in your mind or of any further information which you may need.

We deeply appreciate your cooperation in the National Better Homes Movement as Secretary of the State Committee for Texas and believe that you will find this a form of public service of exceptional interest and lasting value.

We have made a note of the persons whom you have invited to serve on your State Committee and, as soon as we learn of their acceptance from you, we will write to each of them sending a copy of our 1925 Guidebook.

The persons listed in Mrs. Rowan's letter to you have all been recorded as 1933 chairmen for their respective counties, with the exception of Mrs. I.O.V. Hodge, of Dallas (Dallas County), and Mrs. M. E. Bledsoe, of Crockett (Houston County). In Dallas County our records show that Mrs. Annie B. Fields, Route 5, Box 92-A, Dallas, is serving again this year as County Chairman; and Mrs. Mabel P. Langrum, P.O. Box 402, Crockett, who also served last year, has accepted the County Chairmanship again for 1933. Thank you very much for your letter of May 5th, and the accompanying report blank which you filled out.

This white questionnaire was sent to you with the accompanying form letter to county and local chairmen so that you might be informed of the type of report blank, which we sent out to our local chairmen for their use in reporting on Better Homes demonstrations. Since you have filled this out for the community of Hineral Wells, we assume it indicates the work which was conducted in that community, although our records do not show that we have an accepted chairman there. If you have appointed a local chairman for Hineral Wells kindly let us have her name and address so that our records may be complete.
