1. we have the reemployment of the full time wearo field man.

2. Je can have a revision of the report making system so that A and A college may know first hand the part that Negro agents and Field men are playing in the program.

3. Clerical help- full or part time.

4. Compensation for field expanse for Negro agents when incurred while working directly

with the form labor program.

These recommendations are not necessarily solutions to probless because the farm labor program in Tarrant county worked smoothly last year but at a sacrifice on the part of the Pagro agents. I fear that even the '80 per cent of the laborers sent to farmers were sent through our office that A and L. was given the intelligence that the other county personel did the work because all reports Went in from the office and we were merely required to report our activities to them and of course to you for your records. If the work had been reportd through other channels in its entirety I fear that there would have been duplications and probably conflict.
