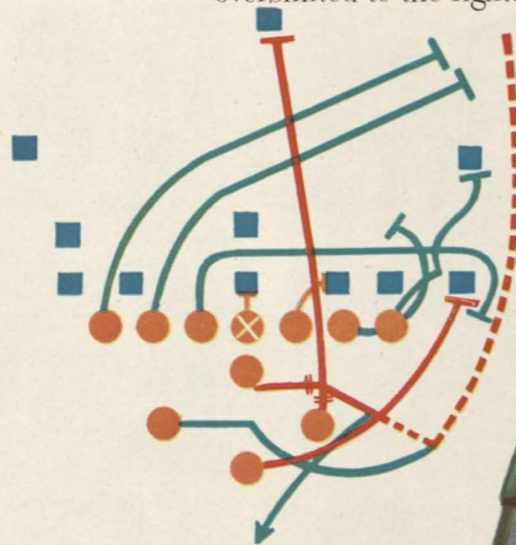

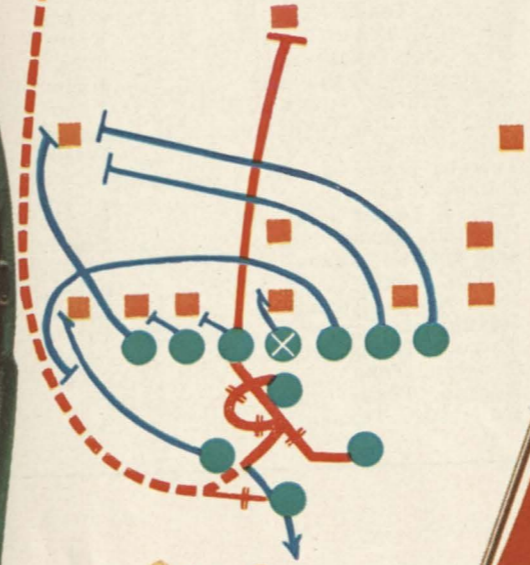
Quick opener, against a normal six-man line.

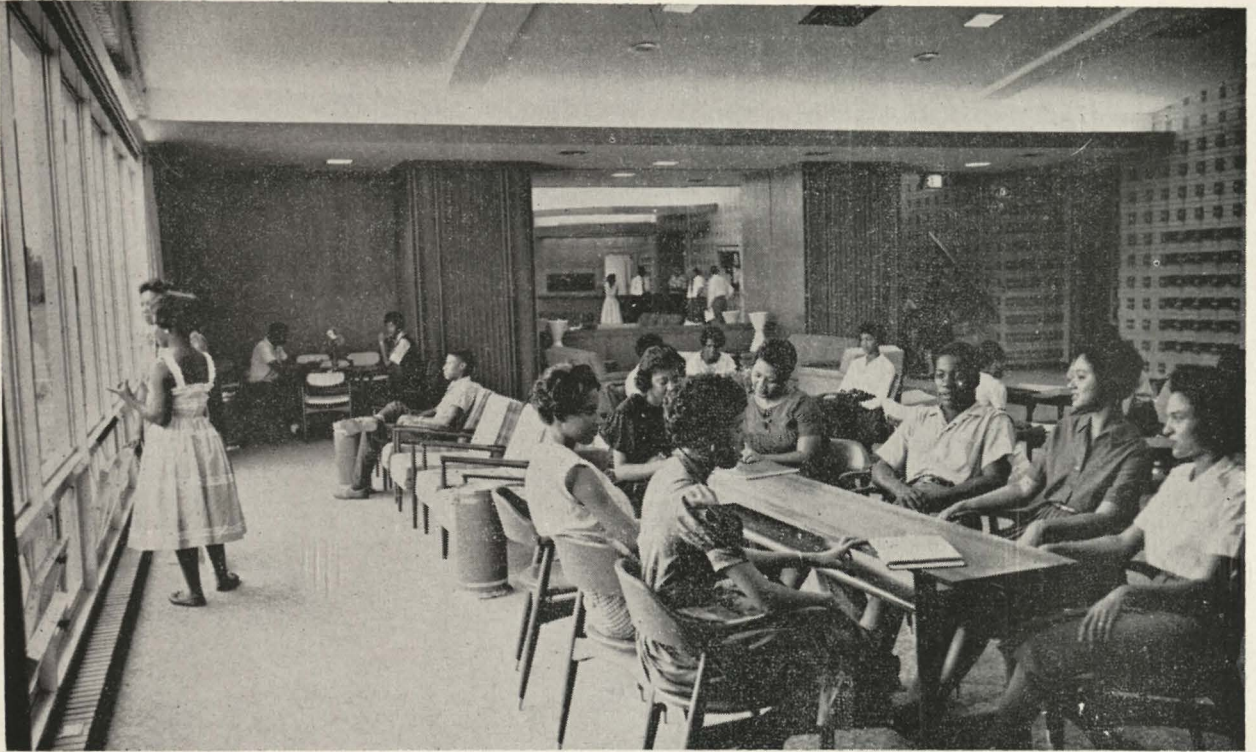
