
In all, 1038 citizens went to the polls April 6, to cast their ballots in two contested and one uncontested races.

Herbert Johnson won re-election by a 356-vote margin over his opponent, Connie King, in Position 5. The final tally for King was 317 votes, with Johnson winning 673.

Bobby Repka, running unopposed for Position 3, received 757 votes of confidence, with minor numbers of votes being cast for a variety of others as write-ins.

James Woodley won re-election to the council in Position 4 by receiving 627 votes to his opponent's 370. John Busby, a newcomer to Hempstead politics, was defeated by 257 votes in his first bid for election.

Recommendations Waller County Sheriff Ronnie L. Sitton, reports that much progress has been made in recent weeks toward a final solution of Waller County Jail prob-

"With the Texas Commission on Jail Standards putting additional pressure on the Waller County Commissioners Court, after the 2.6 million dollar bond issue was defeated on Feb. 6. the Commissioners Court took positive steps toward solving the iail problems on March 25. Modular Jail Systems, Inc. of Humble, was commissioned to prepare a bid package to present to the Jail Standards Commission for their approval," Sitton stated in a recent press release.

"This action was taken after

Patrick Graham, with Modular Jail Systems, Inc., presented his company's jail plan to the Commissioners Court. Graham presented plans that would provide Waller County with a 65inmate capacity jail, along with administration space for the Sheriff's Department. This is a 15-inmate greater capacity than the bond issue plans which would have cost \$2.6 million to build. Graham's proposed cost was less than \$1 million."

Sheriff Sitton added that the Graham proposal also included several other benefits, such as lease purchase of the building on a five-year plan, which would actually save the county money over the cost of housing inmates in other counties.


Another advantage of Graham's proposal, according to Sitton, would be that the jail would be ready for occupancy in less than one half the time of the jail under the bond issue plan.

But, Sitton points out, the greatest advantage of the plan is that Waller County would not put out any money until the jail was complete and accepted by him and the Jail Standards Com-

After meeting with Commissioners Court and getting their approval on Monday, March 25, Graham went to Austin and met with members of the Jail Standards Commission that same afternoon. The Jail Commission approved the schematic design of the jail, which allows Graham to proceed to the next stage of development.

On Wednesday, March 27, County Judge A.M. McCaig, Sheriff Sitton and Patrick Graham met with the Texas Jail Commission at their regular bimonthly meeting. Although the Jail Commission reduced the capacity of the present Waller



County Jail to 18 inmates, they expressed their approval of the latest developments in solving Waller County's overcrowding problem.

On Wednesday, April 3, Sitton and Graham again went to Austin to meet with the Jail Commission staff, where more progress was made toward the final plans for a new jail for Waller County.

The structure proposed by Graham will consist of administration area, built using traditional building construction on a slab base with the jail area being made up of seven modules, which will be constructed at the Modular Jail Systems plant in Humble. These modules will be trucked to Waller County and placed on concrete beams and attached to the Administration area. This type of construction has many benefits, including the capability of additions later at minimum cost, as the need arises.
