Officers Sponsor **Blood Drive**

Members of the Waller County Peace Officers Association have voted unanimously to support a blood drive for the benefit of a young leukemia victim, the son of one of the association's charter members, the decision was reached during the third monthly meeting of the group, held at 7 p.m. Tuesday, April 16, at the Pecan Tree Restaurant in Waller.

According to Secretary-Treasurer Janice Fife of the Hempstead Police Department, Mark Lester, 12-year-old son of Howard Lester, a deputy of the Waller County Sheriff's Department, has received several total transfers of blood since his illness was diagnosed, at considerable expense to his family.

'A bloodmobile unit is willing to come to Waller County on April 29 to collect blood for Mark,"she added, "and the effective ratio would be two pints of blood to every pint he's re-

In response to several questions on procedure, Fife added that blood units collected beyond Mark's needs would be given to other needy people at the request of the donor.

After some discussion, the members present voted to have the drive on April 29 at two sites, with one being held in Brookshire and one in Hemp-

In Brookshire, the drive will take place at Royal High School, from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m.

In Hempstead, the site will be the First United Methodist Church, corner of Main and 7th. from 3 to 9 p.m.

who represent virtually every area of law in Waller County. Members come from the Texas Department of Public Safety. Hempstead Police Department. Brookshire Police Department, Waller Police Department, the Constables and their Deputies from all four precincts, the Waller County Sheriff's Department, Adult and Junvenile Probation Officers, Game Wardens, the Waller County Attorney, Judges and City Attorneys.

According to President Sneed, "We organized this association to provide a central and common direction. Previously, we all spent our time working in our own respective forces and, while we met in the course of our work and shared goals and points of view as individuals, we have never had a middle ground where we could express ourselves as a groun.

"We have plans for scholarships, blood drives, as well as social events that show another side of law enforcement that, perhaps, hasn't been seen before. As an organization, we also will provide citizens of the County an opportunity to individually support some of our projects and support the association as a whole."

One of the ways that Waller County citizens can support the organization is through associate memberships. These are not open to everyone, applicants must be approved by the Board of Directors, but once approved, associate members are entitled to attend the monthly meetings and all social functions. Dues for associate members are \$100 yearly.

Supporting Memberships are also available to approved persons. Dues are \$25 yearly and do not entitle these members to meetings and social functions.

In other action taken during the April 16 meeting, members approved a minor change in the by-Laws which will insure the inclusion of all peace officers, whether appointed or elected.

Also Police Chiefs Johnson, Garcia and Cullins reported that the art departments of their respective high schools, Hempstead, Royal, and Waller, have agreed to participate in a symbol-designing contest. Once one has been selected, it will become the logo for the association and be used on stationery bulletins and on membership plaques.

Members also voted to make the next meeting, scheduled for May 11, a first annual family picnic. The event will be held at Springer Lake



Sam Houston Urged To Fight

After having spent two weeks at the Brazos river encampment, just four miles below Hempstead on the Groce Plantation. Sam Houston began to move his Texan Army eastward. It was on April 14, 1836, that the then Secretary of War, Thomas Rusk, visited General Houston at the Brazos River encampment and admonished him to stop retreating and begin to fight. Sam Houston's reply was, "I consulted none...held no councils of war. If I err the blame is mine."

At any rate, Houston began to move his army out, encamping on the night of April 14-15 on the Donoho Plantation just a few miles southeast of Hempstead. All students of Texas history know of the trek of the Texan Army eastward to the San Jacinto River area where that short-lived battle took place and consummated the independence of Texas, which was declared at Washington On The Brazos on March 2.

Without doubt, Houston's Army was a rags, tags, and bobtails outfit there having been some problem with discipline. Reportedly Houston brought the Army under control at Hempstead by having two soldiers, who disregarded orders and failed to heed disciplinary measures, hanged. Others seemed to have received his message.

And, lest we forget, Waller County will be 112 years old on April 28

REFINISHING TIPS FROM

Q. My neighbor has a lovely dining room set that she bought unfinished, then unfinished. stained herself. I'd like to try it too. Any tips!

A It's as easy as one two, three. First, PREPARE the surface. Sand lightly with



fine per or garnet paper, then lean the piece with denatured alcohol. Apply wood seal

with soft woods like pine keeps the stain streaking. Then, STAIN Brush-on, pigmented stains are ideal for first-time proects. Brush the stain on darker than you want it, wait five minutes, then wipe off the excess until you have the desired shade. Now, FINISH by brushing on a varnish or polyurethane finish to protect your piece And remember-read and follow all label directions for best results







WHEAT LEAF RUST POSING THREAT

Wheat growers in Waller their crop this spring. County need to keep a sharp lookout for leaf rust disease on

Conditions seem to be right for a major leaf rust problem over



much of the state, points out David McGregor, county agent with The Texas Agricultural Extension Service, the Texas A&M University System. Leaf rust is caused by a fugus and appears as small, round orange spots on the leaves. A heavy infection will defoliate the plant and interfere with grain develop-

Many wheat varieties are susceptible to leaf rust fungus, but the incidence of the organism varies greatly from year to year, notes McGregor. One of the best practices for dealing with leaf rust is to plant resistant varieties or at least several different varieties of each year. Then, if the disease becomes a problem, not all varieties may

be affected. producers that plant all their wheat acreage to a susceptible variety generally suffer the greatest losses when a leaf rust epidemic hits.

With good yield prospects this spring because of favorable moisture conditions, producers will need to consider applying a fungicide to their wheat if leaf rust becomes a threat, says McGregor. Using a fungicide is a good alternative if the potential yield exceeds 40 bushels per

Two types of fungicides are available that vary in effectiveness and cost, explains Mc-Gregor. The systemic-type, Bayleton, is quite effective but expensive. Protectant-type fungicides such as Manzate 200

and Dithane M-45 are less expensive for only a short period.

Time of fungicide application is also critical, emphasizes McGregor. A producer must consider the susceptibility of the variety being grown, the potential for continued disease development, and the growth stage of the crop. Generally, the flag leaf should be protected from the time it is formed until the grain is

When the threat of leaf rust is great and potential yields exceed 60 bushels per acre, growers should apply a fungicide prior to the development of the flag leaf. In this case, the systemic-type fungicide should be applied at the time of jointing and again as the flag leaf begins to unfold.

With protectant-type fungicides, additional applications may be needed to get the same level of control, notes McGregor. Actual control level depends on how well the fungicide application is timed, how well it is applied by air, and best results are achieved when the correct dosage is made in 5 gallons of water per acre.

Producers expecting a good

wheat harvest this spring should be able to get a good return on money spent for fungicides to control leaf rust, assuming there are no other limiting factors, says McGregor:
