CHASE:

Colorado county is a south Texas county located in the gulf coast region. There are 2,092 farms in the county which totals 608,000 acres. The soil types are black waxy, light sandy, alluvial with deep black sandy loam in the river and creek bottoms. Rice is the major cash crop grown, but the majority of the farmers grow cotton, corn, and small grain. A few of the farmers specialize in growing tomatoes, cucumbers, Irish potatoes, peanuts, and watermelons. During the four years that I have served as Negro county agricultural agent of Colorado county I have cooperated with all agricultural agencies in improving and conserving the soil of the farm people. I have also tried to teach the farmers that farming at its best, requires that certain business principles be followed. Farmers who recognize this and do it ~~xx x xxx~~ are, as a rule successful. Those who don't, most often fail. The soil building practices that have been carried out by my demonstrators and cooperators were applying 20% superphosphate, inoculating and planting Austrian winter peas & yellow blossom clover, terracing ditching, and contour farming. In September and October in 1949 my demonstrators and cooperators purchased and applied 40 tons of superphosphate at the rate of 3-400 pounds per acre and planted 4,000 pounds of clover and peas. My 2nd & 3rd year demonstrators state that the growing of crops to be plowed under while still green is very definitely a practical means of replenishing soil organic matter on worn out soil. Catch crops and cover crops are commonly used and preferred because they do not interfere with the regular crops of the rotation. Most of the farmers state that they do not have an adequate supply of barnyard manure, therefore, the green manure can be utilized to best advantage. This morning I have brought with me from Colorado county Gillespie Wilson, a progressive demonstrator, who lives five miles south of Weimar, Texas in the Clear Creek community. Wilson will tell the radio audience some of his outstanding accomplishments.

WILSON:

I'm glad to tell the listeners about some of my recent farming practices that have proven very successful and outstanding. It all dates back to the year of 1944 when I bought a 45 acre run-down farm that was badly eroded and had been out of cultivation for eight years. First, I realized that there are too many farmers who trust wholly to luck in the operation of their farm business, therefore, I decided to actually study the job so as to make farming a paying proposition. I consulted my county agricultural agent as to the best practices to use in improving ~~the~~ and restoring the fertility of my soil. He suggested that I first have the land terraced and some ditching done so as to control the water on the steep slopes.

CHASE:

Wilson, you mentioned terracing and ditching. Will you please tell the audience how you went about getting your land terraced and ditches put in?

WILSON:

My county agent told me that he would run the lines for me without cost and that the county P. M. A. office would reimburse me for a portion of the cost of building the terraces and putting in the ditches. Therefore, my land was terraced and properly ditched for a minimum cost to me.

CHASE: Do you think terracing, ditching, and if you have planted any soil building crops have affected the fertility of your soil and increased its production and yield.

WILSON: Yes, I have planted some soil building crops and all three of these practices certainly have improved the condition of my soil. Before any improvements were made on my land the neighbors said it produced only 15-20 bushels of corn per acre. In fact, the last person to farm this land became disgusted and moved away saying that the land was too poor to raise a fuss on. Since terracing, ditching, applying superphosphate, inoculating and planting yellow blossom sweet clover for two consecutive years the land is now producing more than 55 bushels of corn per acre. Although, these practices have really helped but I wouldn't contribute all of my increase in yield to them because I have also planted certified hybrid seed corn and applied barnyard manure and commercial fertilizer. My cotton yield has increased from  $\frac{1}{2}$  to  $\frac{3}{4}$  bale per acre.

CHASE: Inasmuch as you are operating a small farm would you tell the radio audience all of the crops that you grow and whether you are able to make an independent living on this farm?

WILSON: You are right, my farm is small consisting of only 45 acres, but this past year I grew 15 acres of corn, 5 acres of cotton, 4 acres of combine maize, and 1 acre truck crops. I planted three varieties of corn. Texas hybrid No. # 18, Peppard's hybrid No. # seven-eleven, and Oklahoma yellow dent. Of the three varieties I prefer Peppard's hybrid because the shuck covers the ears better and keeps out the weevil and rain. Both of these hybrids had 2 and 3 ears to the stalk and produced 58 bushels per acre. The Oklahoma yellow dent was excellent as an open pollinated variety of corn and it yielded 45 bus. per acre. With 5 acres of cotton in cultivation it produced 3 and  $\frac{3}{4}$  bales of cotton.

CHASE: That's very good Wilson and I am sure that from what you have said you have encouraged many other small farmers that maybe found among our radio audience. Have you told the listeners what your major farming enterprise is and your number one source of income?

WILSON: No, I haven't told them, but I would like very much to do so. What I would consider my major farming enterprise is raising purebred broadbreasted bronzes turkeys. I developed an early interest in turkeys when the broadbreasted breed first became so popular. Each year for 5 consecutive years I have been increasing the size of my flock. The year just passed I marketed 350 head of turkeys. I am becoming particularly interested in raising special breeding turkeys rather than raising them for local markets. I get \$12.00 a head for my toms and \$7.00 each for the hens. My flock of turkeys that are not desirable ~~as~~ for breeding flock I usually sell them for three or four cents more per pound than regular market price.

CHASE: Thank you very much Wilson for having the Texas A. & M. Farm Review radio listeners the benefit of your turkey success and your other outstanding farming accomplishments. I hope that you and other progressive demonstrators will have the opportunity to appear on radio programs and tell of your successful farm operations.




