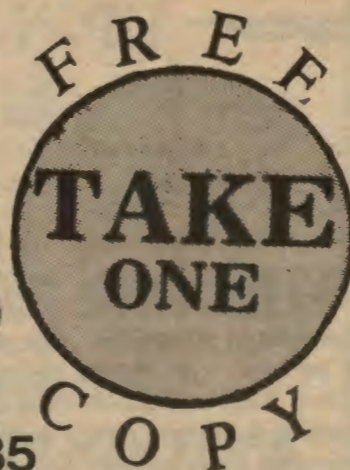

War on Drugs Conference

they can to prevent the
spread of drug abuse in our
area. His message will
have particular interest for
youth as he shares that
"youth are the key".

and is open to the public.

Kyle Barkley was playing
near his home when he

in the gutter along the

took it home to his garage,
where he and his brother
Kevin opened it, only to
discover over \$1,200.00
in cash and checks inside.
The two boys' heads swam
with thoughts of what
could be done with this
much money at Christ-
mastime, but they quickly
decided that honesty is the
best policy, so they took
the bag in the house and
gave it to their folks.

Their mom searched
through the bag and found
a Bill of Lading which
showed who the owner of
the bag might be, and as it
was a business in Tomball,
they called the Tomball
Police who soon located
the distressed owner of the
money. A woman had
taken a child home in
Hempstead, and thought
that she had the bag secure
in the car, but it must have
slipped out when the door

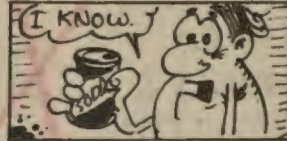

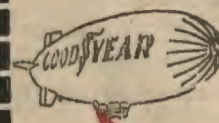

Selecting Safe Toys

"It's always a dangerous assumption to think that anything made and sold for children is reasonably safe."

"Federal regulations governing toy safety cannot totally protect children." "So adults who do the buying must take re-

sponsibility for keeping a child's playtime safe-time."

The Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) currently has specific regulations only on baby rattles, squeeze toys, dolls and stuffed animals, lawn darts, baby bouncers, toy caps, clacker balls, baby cribs, and bicycles.

When shopping for toys, ask the following questions: *Are there detachable parts on the toys that could be swallowed? *Is the toy breakable, so that there might be wooden

splinters or sharp pieces of plastic? *If it's painted, is the paint non-toxic? *Are there any points that could be stuck in the eye or nose? *Is the toy suitable for the child's age? *Does an electrical toy carry the Underwriter's Laboratory Seal of Approval? This certifies that the parts meet certain minimum standards.

"If your child receives an unsafe toy from a well-meaning friend or relative, don't risk an injury to spare the feelings of the gift giver."

"If you can't return the toy, discard it."

Growing Vegetables For Local Market Sales

This is the first of a 2 part series on Growing Vegetables for our local market. This series will cover definitions and climate. Part Two of this series will feature Economics of Production.

Home Gardening: The home garden is a principal source of fresh vegetables for a large part of our total population. Today, the importance of fresh vegetables and the economics of growing these vegetables are important in urban areas.

Market Gardening: As cities become larger and more congested, residents of the outskirts begin to produce larger gardens and sell the surplus to those living in the more fully occupied areas. This market-garden industry produces and assortment of vegetables for local markets and roadside stands. Most markets are no longer local. As a result of competition, these small growers have been forced to change to meet the needs of the consumer.

Commercial Production: The increasing demand for fresh vegetables throughout the year, rapid transportation, and uniform refrigeration facilities led to the production of special crops in relatively large quantities for distant markets. Truck farming is more extensive and specialized than market gardening. The location of truck-growing regions is determined primarily by climatic factors and soils favoring special crops. With the rising costs of long distance, refrigerated transportation, local production of vegetables has increased. Farmer markets, roadside stands, grocery stores, and even supermarkets are outlets for seasonal supplies of locally produced vegetables.

Vegetable Forcing: Vegetable forcing is the production of vegetables out of their normal season. Greenhouses are utilized both in the north and in our area with high volume crops such as tomatoes,

cucumbers, lettuce, etc. Other forcing methods are the use of transplants, clear or black plastic mulch, and hot tents or plastic vented tunnels. As a result of these practices, we can get earlier production for eager fresh vegetable consumers.

Climate is the most important limiting factor in producing vegetables. Temperature and humidity, rainfall and good soils contribute to the adaptation of a crop to a specific area. Nearly all the important vegetable producing regions of the South and Southwest are important because the climate of those regions have production during winter and spring when other areas cannot produce vegetables. Approximately 50% of vegetables are consumed fresh in U.S. vs 38% canned and 12% frozen. Most salad vegetables are increasing in per capita consumption with many more restaurants having large salad bars to accommodate the demand for diet conscience consumer. 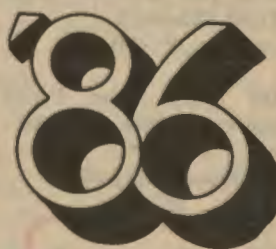

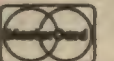
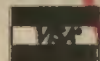

The world famous "ROCKK" nightclub in Houston was the scene of a Christmas Party sponsored for Prairie View students by Mr. R. C. Stone and the Rockk.

During the week of Dec. 8-14, on the campus of PVAMU, the talk of the students, besides final exams, was "what time are you going to the Rockk Friday night?" As fast as the prized invitations could be put on the Information Desk in the Student Center, they would vanish to the dormitories and classrooms for distribution. If you made it to the ROCKK after nine o'clock, you encountered a capacity crowd of P.V.ites and Houstonians shaking off the final exam stress and celebrating the yuletide season.

In a tremendous gesture of its good faith support of higher education, the "ROCKK" will donate a \$1,000.00 scholarship to Prairie View A&M University.

The recommendation from the Prairie View Industrial Development Corporation to issue an Industrial Development bond for \$9,800,000.00 was approved by a majority vote of the Prairie View City Council. The bond will serve as an inducement for the Texas Tissue Company to build its manufacturing plant in the City of Prairie View. Prairie View is in competition with the cities of Sealy and Houston for the tissue plant that will produce household and service paper products from recycled paper. The company will bring no less than 151 jobs to the city and provide much needed revenue in franchise and property taxes. The site selection will be made during the first part of 1986.

Pounds of food and clothing were collected during December by students and civic organizations for distribution to needy families in Prairie View and Waller County. The community, in an

outpouring of love and goodwill, collectively believed that they could make a difference in solving local problems associated with poverty. Those that participated were Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc., Mega Omega Beta Social Club, and the TrailBlazer-Good Sams Recreational Vehicle Club. The donations were collected at the Memorial Student Center and distributed by Mrs. Willie Smith working with the county's welfare office. In making this a MERRY CHRISTMAS for others, these citizens have effectively demonstrated that "People can make a difference!"

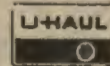
