

Dear Mrs. Rowan:

I have just returned from Waxahachie where I interviewed the County Judge. The Judge, Mr. Colvin, is a former Superintendent of Schools at Ennis, Texas. During the time that he worked there, he secured funds to put into the Negro schools there, a splendid Home Economics department, according to his statement.

I recite this, in order to say that he is very favorably impressed with this type of work. He desires that a Representative from our Department meet the Ellis County Court on Friday, afternoon, April 27 at 2:00 o'clock to explain the Extension program to the group. He thinks that the request for funds to finance our work in the county will be favorably received by the Court. I had planned at this time to be at Prairie View. I could change my program so as to make this appeal and travel to Prairie View later; or it might be well to ask Mrs. Hodge to meet the Court in this instance. I shall await your advice concerning this matter. I am inclosing the Ellis County information to be forwarded to her in case she will go to Ellis County. If you think it well that I go, you will not need to send me anything. Some outstanding points in Dallas County work, an adjoining county, and Mrs. Herring and Mrs. Hodges or whatever other friends whom you have been able to make there, would be a splendid escort for the person who goes to this Court.

I also talked with the County Judge in Hill County, as well as the Commissioners. If it were possible to get someone in Hill County who is interested enough or who would be interested enough to raise funds to begin the work in the county it would be possible to get the Court to take the work over in six months, according to their statement. This seems to be the way that the other group was able to put on an agent there.

4. The hours usually run from 10:00 A.M. to 8:00 P.M. with a special program rendered on or about 2:00 P. M.
5. All result demonstrations in said community are ready for inspection on this day.

RALLY DAY

1. Rally day usually come late in November or very early in December.
2. All demonstrators make their report for the year.
3. Prizes or awards are given to those excelling.
4. Adult and 4-H Rallies are held seperately.


