## NASA and PVAMU say to HBCUs: Join The New Frontier In Telecommunications! by Bryan H. Barrows III

The message came through loud and clear December 5 and 6, at a "Vision 2000... Toward Educational Excellence Through Technology" conference held at the Wyndham Greenspoint Hotel and the Prairie View A&M University Northwest Graduate Center at the Compaq Computer Corporation. The message was to minority institutions ...

come on in ... the water is fine! The Minority University-Space Interdisciplinary Network (MU-SPIN), PVAMU/ NASA Southwest Regional Network Resources and Training Site (NRTS) and the Compaq Computer Corp-oration joined forces to present a glimpse of the 21st Century to Historically Black Colleges and Universities from around the state.


Presiding officer, Dr. John R. Williams of PVAMU, said, "I welcome you to this conference sponsored by the Minority University-Space Interdisciplinary Network. It is important that we form more effective partnerships among ourselves, with business and government if we are to be full participants in the com-munications technology revolution that is occurrings before our eyes." He further stated, "NASA is reaching out to HBCUs to become more involved in it's research and development efforts." One approach involves use of seven Network Resources and Training Sites (NRTS) strategically placed around the country. The training sites provide regional leadership in the development of technology infrastructure on the campuses of HBCUs and other institutions which serve large minority populations. The NRTS site at PVAMU provides leadership to its partners in such areas as installation and/or upgrade of internet resources, computer hardware, staff training, maintenance and support of campus network resources.

Dr. Williams presented James Harrington from the NASA Goddard Space Flight Center (Greenbelt, Maryland)who serves as director of the MU-SPIN Program. Harrington gave a brief overview of the goals and the strategic plan of MU-SPIN. Williams also presented consultant, Dr. Ely Dorsey, professor of information systems within the School of Business at Howard University, who spoke about sociotechnological change. Dorsey noted that initiatives such as MU-SPIN can offer brilliant research and technology but that human systems often tend to stand in the way of their effectiveness. Therefore, he believes that HBCUs must be committed to the concept of change (when it is necessary).

The dinner speaker on Thursday evening was State Representative Sylvester Turner who expressed the necessity for HBCUs to become active players in the technology development efforts of this state.

The Friday morning session was hosted by the Higher Education MarketingDivision of Compaq Computer Corporation. The session included a tour of the production facilities and an overview of emerging technological developments in higher education from a leader in educational technology.

## Nuclear Regulatory Commission Seeks Faculty and Student Participation

The Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCU) Faculty and Student Research Participation Program is seeking HBCU faculty and students for research, education and training opportunities at federal laboratories and for on-campus research.

The purpose of the NRC/HBCU Research Participation Program is to introduce faculty and students from HBCUs to research and development activities of the federal government. Participants conduct hands-on research using state-of-the-art equipment not usually found in most campus laboratories. Projects relate to individual academic majors, professional goals, and the ongoing research and development of the facility. Participants are encouraged to develop partnerships and collaborations that promote research at HBCU campuses, enhance teaching skills of faculty and encourage students to seek advanced degrees in science, engineering and technology.

The program offers research opportunities in more than thirty different areas of study from engineering, health physics, seismology/geotechnology, human factors, hydrogeology, technical writing, structural geology, materials/ metallurgical engineering, computer science, mathematics and risk/ performance assessment.

Full-time undergraduate participants receive stipends of \$300 per week, graduate students receive \$400 per week and faculty members receive monthly stipends equivalent to either their monthly university salaries or \$3,400, whichever is greater.

The application deadline for summer research participation is January 12, 1997, and the deadline for "on-campus" research is ongoing. # Research Expanding At PVAMU

### **Research Expenditures Top \$11 Million**

It is well known among colleges and universities that institutions of higher education either thrive or perish based upon their capacity to perform research. Therefore, it is considered that the amount of research expenditure impacted by such an institution is a sure sign of overall effectiveness. Accordingly, Prairie View A&M University has announced in a report to the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board that the Historically Black University (HBU) has seen a rise in its overall rate of research expenditure from Fiscal Year 1994-95's level of \$7,847,915 to \$11,045,026 in 1996. Such an increase is deemed nothing short of phenomenal.

According to Dr. Willie F. Trotty, Dean of the PVAMU Graduate School and Director of University Research, "We are pleased and delighted that our figures show such a hefty increase in the rate of research expenditure. I congratulate the faculty and staff members who have worked long and hard to make it possible. And, *as an institution of the first class*, we expect to continue to place PVAMU in the forefront of research in the years to come."

Areas showing the largest percentage of research expenditure were engineering, the physical sciences, agricultural sciences, and food/fiber/ agricultural products. Other significant sources of research expenditure were environmental sciences, mathematical sciences, computer science, medical science, the arts & humanities, business administration, education, energy, biotechnology, materials science & engineering, aerospace technology and environmental science.


