Waller County Sheriff Ronnie Sitton and Hempstead Chief of Police Randy Johnson will go trunk to trunk on Friday, March 1 at 12:30 p.m., when they will compete in an elephant race on Austin Street in Hempstead. Although both admit to never having ridden an elephant before, both say they are confident that they will come out "on top."

And, as if watching these two brave men race wasn't enough, the winner will be challenged by Channel 13's own Mr. Clean, Marvin Zindler. That's right, folks! The man in white will climb aboard a pachyderm to race either Sitton or Johnson when that race is over.

Although the exact race course has not yet been established, it has been rumored that it will take place on Austin Street, in order to draw a larger audience. Hempstead Police Department spokesman Jerry Falcon suggests that elephant race enthusiasts just plan to be downtown at the appointed time and "watch for the elephants."

The race will precede the appearance of the Ford Brothers 5-Ring Circus, which will give two shows on Friday, at 5 and 8 p.m. at the Lions' Field on Blasingame Road.

Answers Questions About

The Eyesight Of Texas

Q. Dear Dr. Redfield: Our daughter's teacher thinks our six year old is color blind. Isn't it true that only boys can be color blind? Mitch Felzien.

A. Color vision problems occur more often in boys than girls, but some girls do have them. A male has a 16 times greater chance of having a color vision problem than a female. Approximately 8% of all males have some type of color vision disorder.

Since color-coded learning materials are widely used in school, your daughter's color vision should be checked. In fact, all young people should have their color vision evaluated before making a career decision. In some professions, such as aircraft piloting or electricianry, normal color vision is imperative. Your eye care professional should have a variety of tests to evaluate a patient's color status accurately.

If your daughter does have an existing problem, she will probably be found to be color-deficient, not color blind. Very few people see only black and white. Trouble seeing red or green is the most common color vision problem. Confusion with yellow and blue is rarer.

Color vision problems from birth cannot be corrected, although red tinted contact lenses (the X-chrome lens) help some people. Most color deficient persons can be taught to adapt, once they know the problem exists.

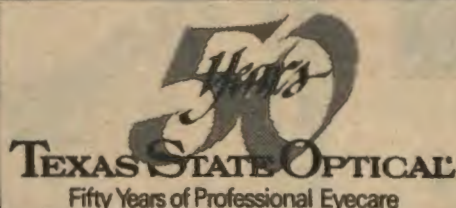

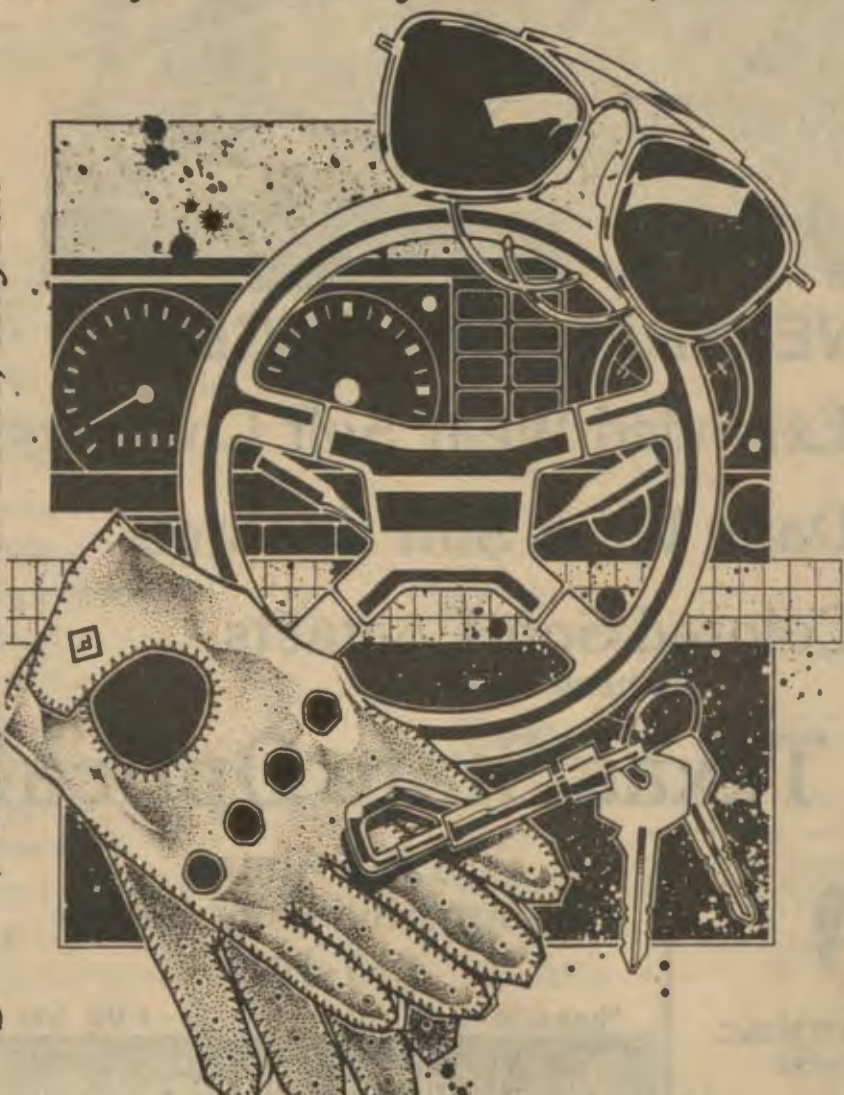



ANTIQUES, YESTERDAY AND TODAY

American Oak - America's Top Choice For Antique Furniture
 The first American frontier settlers, concerned as they were with shelter and survival in the 17th century, had only basics. There were benches, tables, beds and chests. By 1725, improved living condi-

tions, plus immigration of expert joiners and carpenters brought about wood-working specialties. A settlement was lucky to have a resident making essentials as boxes, chums, barrels, spoons and such. One in a while, the man of the household made his own furniture, which accounts for the primitive

looking pieces still occasionally seen. The most often used wood was oak, as it is easily pressed and curved when done with direct steam. Oak could be fashioned right from the drying kiln. Long reigning walnut was over cut by the 1880s. Oak climbed through the 1870s and crashed

into first place, where it continued until 1930. In an effort to conserve oak, people began to use it more often as ornamentation on other woods. More abundant and less costly woods, usually elm and hickory, began to be used as backs, drawers, hidden frames and legs, supplementing the oak. Backs

were usually rough and unfinished. These are now treasured. Pine was first used in our American colonies as a secondary wood, making shelves, lids for chests and table tops, wherever the strength of oak was not needed.

Ash ranked second in value to oak. Ash rings are wide and regular, with broken lines. Oak has a less pronounced grain, more broken lines and rings that are wide apart. Sharing equally in the timber classification, was chestnut, which was very susceptible to powder-post beetles and which was devastated by an Asian blight in the 1870s. This pushed oak one step higher as the "ideal" of furniture manufacturers. Oak became the conventional furniture for the "middle class," pleasing to the eye, well constructed, moderately priced to fit medium incomes.

The most sought after finish was and remains "Golden Oak." English oak is darker and is often mistaken for American walnut. False graining is not new. It has been used for centuries. Craftsmen imitating oak and other costlier woods, chemically stained varieties of soft material, such as maple and poplar. To help detect this, look on the inside of a door to be sure that the natural grain continues on through the wood.

Veneers can be trimmings or completely cover the tops or fronts of furniture. Veneers are replaceable if they have become split, broken or raised up. They may be mended with glue in a syringe and needle, clamp and let dry.

John Henry Better was a distinguished name among private furniture makers of the 19th century. In 1856 he patented a process of steam-heating thin sheets (4 to 16) under pressure in order to better carve stronger furniture. He worked principally in rosewood and oak. Furniture never became too splendid for the luxury-loving Victorians.

Age can be noted where 19th century craftsmen hand cut their own dove tails. Factory dove tailing was precise and all regular pins were the same size as the tails. It is best to have the original pulls, but if they are too bad, good replacements are available.

Pieces with signatures, original paper tags, labels and brass plates command premium prices.

Of the American choices of wood furniture, oak was and still is a choice in wood furniture. There were plenty of American oak pieces yesterday and there are still plenty today.

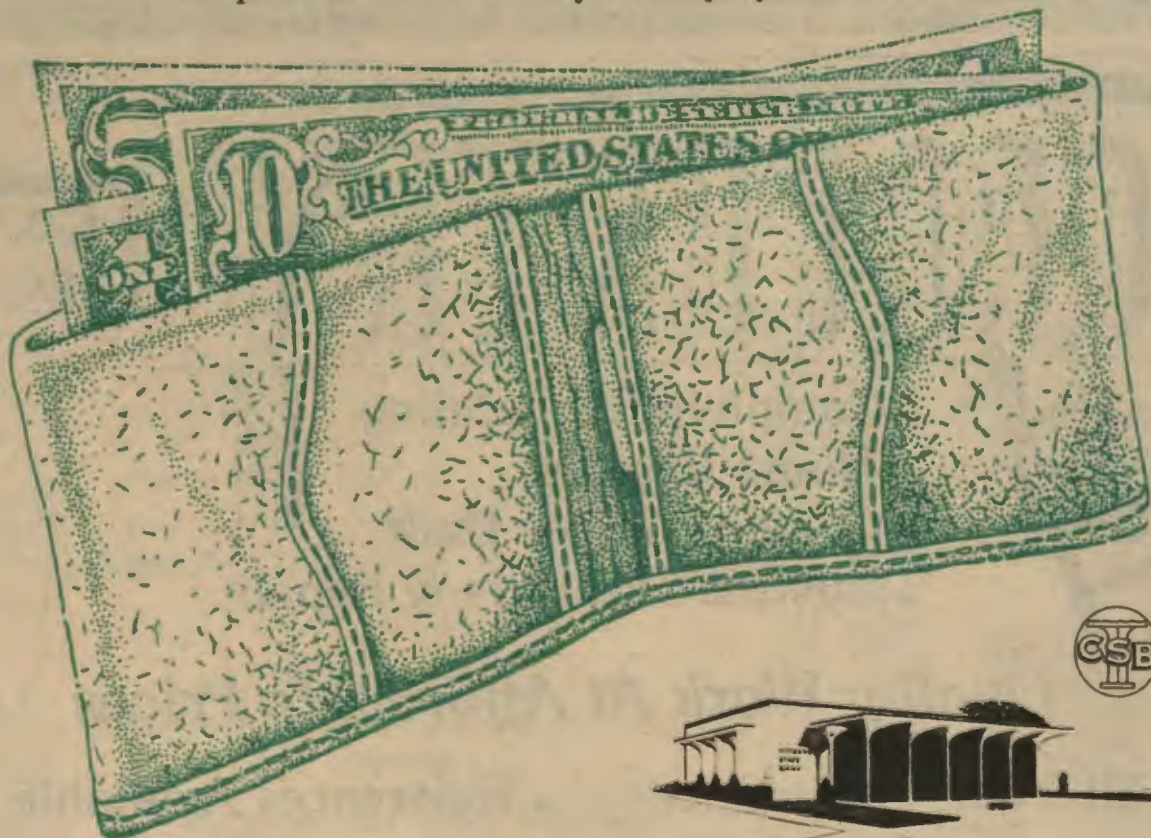

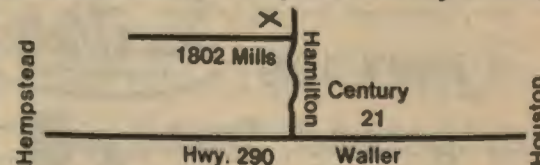

Clear Creek Confederate War Camps

By Mildred W. Abshier

No visible evidence remains of the several Confederate war camps that were established along Clear Creek some two to three miles east of Hempstead.

Though these campsites have not been specifically located, they are known to have existed along Clear Creek in the vicinity of Liendo and near the H & T C (Houston and Texas Central) Railroad, now the Southern Pacific. The creek provided water for the camps and Hempstead, being a railroad town, provided means of bringing men in and out of the camps.

Their erstwhile campsites, during the War Between The States, were

centers of hectic activity - receiving, training and shipping out Confederate soldiers, and holding Union prisoners of war.

Camp Groce, best known of the several camps, stood near the Groce mansion, Liendo. After the war, in 1865, the renowned General George Custer commanded Camp Groce, and 'tis said that Mrs. Groce, being concerned for Mrs. Custer's well being, sent food delicacies as well as a rocking chair down to the

camp for Mrs. Custer.

Though campsites are not specifically known, various written sources name the camps: Groce, Hebert, Carter, Hempstead, Clear Creek. All writers locate them near Clear Creek, near the railroad and near Liendo.

The care and good work of

Col. Edwin Waller Chapter of United Daughters of the Confederacy and Waller County Historical Commission, an historical marker has been applied for and approved for the Clear Creek Confederate War Camps. The marker is at the foundry now and should be ready for raising in the near future.

SALMON MELTS

- 1 can (7-1/2 or 7-3/4 oz.) salmon
- Milk
- 1 tablespoon butter or margarine
- 1 tablespoon flour
- 1 tablespoon minced parsley
- 1/4 teaspoon dill weed, crushed
- 1/8 teaspoon salt
- 1 egg yolk, slightly beaten
- 1 tablespoon grated Parmesan cheese
- 1 tablespoon chopped pimiento-stuffed olives
- 4 slices sourdough French bread
- 1/2 cup shredded Monterey Jack cheese

Drain salmon, reserving liquid; break into large chunks. Add milk to reserved salmon liquid to equal 1/2 cup. Melt butter in small saucepan over low heat. Blend in flour, parsley, dill weed and salt. Slowly stir in salmon liquid mixture. Cook and stir until thick and smooth. Blend small amount white sauce into egg yolk; return mixture to sauce and heat thoroughly. Fold in salmon, Parmesan cheese and olives. Spread approximately 1/4 cup mixture on each slice of bread. Sprinkle top of each sandwich with 2 tablespoons Monterey Jack cheese. Bake at 450°F. 10 minutes or until cheese melts. Slice each sandwich in half diagonally before serving. Makes 4 servings.
