He seemed especially interested in food preparation.

I told mr. Hale that I would write you concerning his interest, and that perhaps you could some time come by and talk with him. He might be able to help you get the money to finance home demonstration work there.

We are trying to get white home demonstration work started in the county, but it does not seem probable that the court will make the appropriation. They have been met twice and have virtually refused to consider it. The women have gone to work to make up the money by popular subscription.
