
Dear Mrs. Rowan:

Last week when I was in Freestone County I met a Mr. W. C. Hale of Oakwood, Leon County, who has a lot of property in Freestone County. He was interested in knowing where some help could be secured for the negro women who live on his farms. He has, I believe, about fifteen families. He seemed especially interested in food preparation.

I told Mr. Hale that I would write you concerning his interest, and that perhaps you could some time come by and talk with him. He might be able to help you get the money to finance home demonstration work there.

We are trying to get white home demonstration work started in the county, but it does not seem probable that the court will make the appropriation. They have been met twice and have virtually refused to consider it. The women have gone to work to make up the money by popular subscription.

am encouraging Mr. Mason to assist with plans for Co. Encampment and preparations for Short Course now - and pushing the idea with "I plan to have my tonsils removed next month and want to get every thing going before it happens"

Will you see if papa decided to let me come home, I'll have every thing in order before leaving. I hope theres no harm in telling a beneficial story. (smile)

I havent find the right material <sup>for dress</sup> here, so seemingly I'll have to try Brenham. I'll get it done - and that soon Its nice I've found to have something to do to keep busy all the while to not have time to think over so many things - anyway in spite of your teasing me I havent cried about being here but one time - yet.

I was in Prairie View Wednesday about 7:00 P.M. and I talked with Prof. Waller. He said that you had a class scheduled for that time is why I failed to see you. Since you left I have not wasted one minute in using every opportunity to get our program over. It happened that Mr. Bertch the man who is in charge of the Relief got tired of me worrying him and sent me to Mr. Lendsy who has charge of the application Department. He thought that he would get rid of me very easily but it happened that Mr. Lendsy is a personal friend of mine so he told me positively that he would handle the matter in this way; the person had to apply for the job ~~of~~ County Supervisor and that person must not be employed and living the county and they were not for sure that they would keep them on more than three months at the rate of \$75.00 per month and I have enough money on hand to guarantee the rest or more if necessary.



He asked me when would we want to begin work and he could fix it up anytime I wished and I told him that I had to write you before I could give him a definite Understanding. Then we will have the person that you recommend to make application through his office. Let me hear from you as soon as possible regarding this matter. He also stated that he would furnish two Cannerns. He wanted to know if I could guarentee the place to do the Canning. I told him that I could.

During the month of June nine (9) counties under our supervision conducted Home Tours, namely: Brazoria, Dallas, Fort Bend, Guadalupe, Harris, Harrison, Matagorda, Victoria and Wharton.

On these tours the party was given a chance to see and study yard, pantry, bed-room, and home improvement demonstrations. Mrs. Conner and I went on five of these tours, a summary of which is enclosed for your information.


Mrs. Rowan:
