Attention Agricultural Workers. Surveys by farm labor advisory committees and county agents show excellent Rio Grande Valley cotton harvest begun. More than 250,000 acres averaging three-fourth bale to the acre will need services of several thousand workers for harvest. 2.875 workers or 115 crews needed by last of next week or July 5 at Harlingen, San Benito, LaFeria, Combs and Olmito. 390 crews or 9,750 workers additional needed beginning July 10 to 15. Willacy County, Raymondville, 280 crews beginning July 10. Cameron, San Benito, 100 crews July 10. Hidalgo, Edinburg, 10 now, more about July 20. Crew leaders should contact local county agent or state migratory labor assistants at once. State migratory labor assistants at Falfurries and Rivera Quarantine Stations can give latest daily information to crews passing through station."

Dear \gent:

In most areas in Texas, the 1946 spring garden work is coming to a close. While this work is fresh on your minds, we would like to get a mid-season report which will indicate the extent to which home gardens have been grown in Texas during the current season. We are enclosing copies of D-270, <u>Victory Garden Royort</u>, which should be filled in for your county and copies attached to your July monthly rejort. Although this form is late reaching you, you doubtless have available the information that will enable you to make the report.

The figures given should be the totals of all gardens grown by the Negro residents of the county. The form should be signed jointly by the county agricultural agent and county home domonstration agent. copy should be attached to each set of the July monthly narrative reports submitted to headquarters. Extra copies should be placed in your 1946 county annual report file so that it will not be necessary for you to do additional statistical work related to the spring garden demonstration in your county.

In October, follow the same procedure for fall gardens. The totals of these spring and fall garden reports will be the figures you will use in your annual report.

Much stress is being placed upon the various food production programs, and we hope that you will give this report serious consideration so that it will show all of the garden work done in your county this spring.
