

FACTS ABOUT PRAIRIE VIEW

PRESIDENT - Dr. A. I. Thomas

NAME — Prairie View A&M University

FOUNDED — 1876 by the Fifteenth Legislature of the State of Texas

LOCATION — Prairie View, Texas. A college town located forty-five miles northwest of Houston on U. S. Highway 290.

ADMINISTRATION AND TYPE — A part of The Texas A&M University System. A Public state supported senior college. A Land-Grant College.

SPECIAL CHARACTERISTICS — A residential college which houses practically all of its students in dormitories. The college community is self-sufficient, having its own hospital, fire department, steam plant, water system, electrical system, sewer system, security system, telephone and telegraph system, U.S. Post Office, college exchange store, laboratory training schools and all other services to efficiently operate a small town.

ENROLLMENT — 5,500 co-educational (Students are currently enrolled from Texas, 29 other states and 6 foreign countries).

FACULTY AND STAFF — The faculty is versatile, well trained and experienced. Numbering 216, the present faculty members hold doctoral and master's degrees from the leading colleges and universities of the nation and world. The support staff consists of 502 persons.

ACCREDITATION — The college is accredited by the Texas Education Agency, The Southern Association of Secondary Schools and Colleges, The Association of Texas Colleges and the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education. All programs in engineering are accredited by the Engineer's Council for Professional Development.

ACADEMIC YEAR — The academic year consists of two semesters, each approximately 18 weeks in length. The summer session consists of two six-week terms.

LIBRARY — The W. R. Banks Library (named for a former president of the college) houses in excess of 150,000 volumes. It now has study space for 600 students simultaneously. A new addition was completed in September, 1968. The addition has doubled the capacity of the present library both in volume and study area. A complete renovation of the original portion was completed in September of 1969.

Dr. Alvin I. Thomas has served as President of Prairie View A&M College since November, 1966.

Born in New Orleans, Louisiana, Dr. Thomas has been a resident of Texas since 1949 when he began service at the University in the Division of Industrial Education and Technology.

He attended the public schools of New Orleans and completed two years of liberal arts work at Xavier University. He received the Bachelor and Master of Science Degrees from Kansas State College in 1948 and 1949, respectively.

After studying at Pennsylvania State College, he enrolled at The Ohio State University where he earned the Ph.D. Degree in

1957. He also attended The University of Michigan in 1963 and the University of Nebraska in 1965.

Dr. Thomas has had a wealth of experience as a teacher, supervisor, and administrator. He has also served as a consultant to the Foreign Operations and Administration and completed a study entitled, "Technical Education in Liberia." Since 1964 he has served as a consultant to Dow Chemical Company, Litton Industries and Westinghouse Management Services. In recent years, Dr. Thomas was appointed to the White House Conference on Children and Youth; The Governor's Commission on Rural Development; and, Chairman of the Board of Directors of the Federal Reserve Bank of Dallas (Houston Branch).

Dr. Thomas is married to the former Iris Butler and is the father of two sons and twin daughters.


Contribution to the advancement of our free society and the continued progress of our civilization are major goals of the University.

HEAD FOOTBALL COACH ATHLETIC DIRECTOR

Hoover J. Wright, a native of Maryland, became Prairie View's fourth head football coach since Billy Nicks stepped down in 1965.

Wright, a 1948 graduate of Maryland State, came to Prairie View in 1961 as an assistant football coach to Billy Nicks.

When Billy Nicks stepped down in 1965, nicks named Wright to succeed him, and in his first season (1966) Wright posted a 5-3-1 record.

In 1968, Wright stepped down from football to devote more time to track, of which he has been head coach since 1961. He was a member of the 1972 Olympics coaching staff and is currently President of the NAIA Track Coaches Association. In track, he has been named NAIA and SWAC coach ot the year and has coached the Panther track teams to four national and two SWAC titles. He was inducted into the NAIA Track Coaches Hall of Fame in May of 1976.

In 1973, then Panther head football coach T. Danzy, was stricken with a heart attack and Wright was asked to serve the year out.

Wright will direct the 1979 Panther team and bring his 13-year head football coaching record (7 at PV) of 61-75-2.

Wright was born in Hebron, Maryland and graduated from F. D. St. Clair High School in Cambridge, Maryland, where he was a member of the soccer team, captain of the basketball team and a star sprinter in track.

He attended college at Maryland State (now Marland Eastern Shore) where he was a star halfback on the 1947 undefeated team. He was basketball captain as a junior and senior, outfielder in baseball and sprinter in track.

He received the Master of Education degree from Penn State in 1951, with emphasis on Physical Education. He has done advanced study at the University of Iowa and North Texas State.

After several years of playing semi-pro basketball, working with Boy Scout troops and attending graduate school, Wright began coaching college athletics at Shorter College at North Little Rock, Arkansas in 1951. He was an instructor of physical education, football coach, men and women's basketball and track coach.

In 1952, he went to Paul Quinn in Waco, where he later became head coach and won championships in every major sport.

In 1961, he came to Prairie View as an assistant to Billy Nicks.

Wright was married in 1951, to Miss Eloise McCreary of Waco, Texas. They have three daughters and one son.

PANTHER COACHES



CLIFTON GILLIARD Backfield

Cliff joined the Panther staff in July, 1974. He came to PV from Galena Park High School in Galena Park. Texas.

He is a former PV All-SWAC halfback on the Panther 1958 National Championship team. He lettered three years at PV.

Cliff was a standout high school athlete at Fidelity Manor where he lettered in football, basketball and track. He began coaching at Fidelity in 1960. In 1970 he went to Galena Park as an assistant.

JOHN TANKERSLEY Line Coach

Tankersley joined the PV staff in January, 1974. He came to PV from Wiley College in Marshall, Texas. He previously coached at PV from 1970-72.

He is a former all around athlete from Booker T. Washington High School in Dallas, Texas. He was an All-American tackle at Wiley College.

He has coached at Worthing High in Houston. Yates (Houston) and Booker T. Washington (Houston).

He coached PV to the N.A.I.A. zone title in baseball in 1969, '70, '74, and '75. His team won the district in 1970. His 1975 team was second in SWAC in hitting.





CORNELIUS COOPER Line Coach

Cooper joined the Panther staff in July, 1974. He came to PV from Jefferson County High School in Monticello. Florida.

He is a former PV All-SWAC performer and was drafted by the Miami Dolphins in 1969.

He was assistant coach at Jefferson County High four years where from 1971-73 the team won 33 games and lost 2. They won the Florida Crown title in 1971-73 and the class 2A state in 1972.

JESSE H. HURST Assistant Coach & Scout

Hurst joined the Panther staff in September, 1974. He is a former Oklahoma State standout football and baseball star, where he graduated in 1963. His is a native of Houston, Texas, and attended Jack Yates High School, where he played football and baseball, making all-city in both sports. He played Army football and baseball, also.

Assistant Coach • Defensive Line

Kinney came to Prairie View with Coach Hillyer's staff in 1971, and has a variety of experience. He is a graduate of Lanier High School in Jackson. Mississippi, where he was an all-round athlete. Kinney attended college at Wiley in Marshall, Texas. At Wiley he was a mainstay tackle for the late legendary "Pop" Long. His senior year he was named to the *Pittsburgh Courier* All-American team.

After graduating from Wiley in 1965, he signed with the Kansas City Chiefs. He returned to Wiley in 1965 and joined the staff as head defensive coach, golf coach and Dean of the Athletic Dormitory. In 1966, he served as assistant football coach and head golf coach. When Wiley dropped football, Kinney went to Arkansas



A.M.&N. at Pine Bluff as assistant defensive coach and remained until coming to Prairie View.



J. C. WILLIAMS Assistant Coach

Williams came to PV in 1972 as an assistant. He was a two-time All-SWAC linebacker at Alcorn. where he graduated in 1967.

He attended high school in Ruleville. Mississippi. where he was All-Big 8 in football three years. and two years in basketball. He captained Alcorn's 1966-67 team and was voted the Best Defensive player in his senior year.

He served as assistant coach at Rosa Temple, in Vicksburg, Mississippi, from 1967 to 1971, where the team went 40-0-2. In 1971, he went to South Vicksburg High as assistant, where the team went 7-3.



THE 1979 PANTHERS

The Panthers' head football coach and Athletic Director Hoover Wright has made several key changes in an effort to get the Panthers off and running to a great season during the 1979 campaign. The changes could very well put the Panthers into a contending role for the conference championship.

Prairie View returns a well-balanced group with 11 defensive lettermen and 11 offensive lettermen. The offensive group having the greatest number of starters returning.

On offense, Charles Weatherspoon and Howard Grant should compliment each other very well to provide the Panthers with a potent running attack. The passing attack should be just as potent with the likes of Tracy Jones, Tommy Dunson, Eugene Scott and Bobby Baker.

The defense could have its best year ever with great leadership coming from Robert Alexander and Andrew Winzer in the secondary and up front from Milton Hall, Matthew Teague, Larry Jackson, Sammy August and others.

THE OFFENSIVE LINE

The key to the Panthers successful running and passing attack lies up front with the returning of a well seasoned veteran line. Tackles Harold Norfleet and Keith Albury; Guard Dale Clark, Center Gerald Davis and James Hicks, Jesse Nelson should prove to be an adequate replacement for the spot vacated by Gerald Holman. Kendal Clark will serve as swing man for both guard and tackle.

TIGHT ENDS

The Panthers return both tight ends, Eugene Scott and Bobby Barker who compliment each other very well in the blocking and receiving. Wright feels that Scott and Barker provide the team with the stability needed at such a key spot in the offensive attack.

WIDE RECEIVERS

All American Candidate Tracy Jones returns from a great performance last season to lead the Panthers in this catagory along with the move of Tommie Dunson for added strength to the wide receiver spot.

THE 1979 PANTHERS

QUARTERBACKS

Kenneth "JoJo" Jones readies himself to step into the leading role as field general for the Panthers. However, contending for the starting job is Darrell "Pop" Jackson who had a great spring and south paw Maurice Mitchell. All three quarterbacks possess great ball handling and passing abilities and fit very well into the Panthers offensive scheme. The battle for the starting role should be very interesting.

OFFENSIVE BACKS

The Panthers have one of the SWAC's best returning for his final campaign, Charles Weatherspoon. Weatherspoon will be adequately complimented by the bruising red-shirt freshman Howard Grant. Great support is also expected from Gerald Dodge, Darrell Jackson, Ken Reeves, Michael Long and Floyd Richardson.

THE DEFENSIVE LINE

Coach Wright expects the defensive line to be the key to the defensive unit being able to contend for the number one rating in the Conference this year. Returning vets who should give the line this stability are: Sammy August, Milton Hall, Matthew Teague, Larry Jackson, and Alvin Prince.

LINEBACKERS

Complimenting the defensive line at the linebacking position will be returning veterans Kevin Sullivan, Andra Gillam, Alvis Prince, Charles Richard and John Zachary.

SECONDARY

Leading the Panthers in the defensive secondary which should prove to be one of the best secondaries in Panther history are captains Robert Alexander and Andrew Winzer. Supporting this duo will be James Herd, Floyd Richardson and Ellwyn Dean.

KICKING GAME

The place kicking will be handled by Charles Weatherspoon. The punting will be handled by the Jackson boys — Darrell M. Jackson and Darrell "Pop" Jackson.

HISTORY OF THE SOUTHWESTERN ATHLETIC CONFERENCE

One Sunday morning in September of 1920, representatives from Bishop, Wiley, Samuel Huston, Paul Quinn and Prairie View colleges, known collectvely as the "Big Five;" met in Houston at the Old Oriental Hotel on San Felipe street and before the meeting was adjourned, they had founded the Southwestern Athletic Conference.

The purpose of the conference at that time was to coordinate the intercollegiate athletic activity (football and baseball) of the five colleges. In 1922 Texas College joined in the conference and basketball was recognized as an official conference sport.

Later track, tennis and golf were added to the list. Langston, Southern and Arkansas joined the loop in the 1930's.

In the beginning, except for Prairie View, the members of the conference had been church affiliated schools. By the early fifties, the rising expense of college athletic programs plus the cost of staying competitive with state supported institutions caused change in the conference membership pattern.

Bishop, Samuel Huston and Paul Qinn dropped out of the conference to be replaced by TSU in 1956 and Jackson State and Grambling in 1958 and 1959 respectively. Langston ended its affiliation midway in the decade.

Texas College discontinued football following the 1960 campaign and was replaced by Alcorn A&M. By now, Wiley, one of the original charter members, was the only remaining church school and the Wildcats departed in 1967. Mississippi Valley was the replacement.

In 1970, Arkansas joined the Arksansas intercollegiate Conference and the number eight SWAC team has yet to be replaced. SWAC has seven members with Prairie View the only school left of the original group. Southern, gaining admittance in the thirties, is the second oldest member with TSU, Jackson, Grambling, Alcorn and Mississippi Valley following in that order.

The Southwestern Athletic Conference ranks as one of the top collegiate conferences in the nation in its output of outstanding athletics in football, basketball, track and baseball. Its production of pro athletes in football, basketball and baseball is well-known.

PRAIRIE VIEW: SERVING TEXAS AT THE POINT OF ITS GREATEST NEED

One hundred years is a long span in the life of man or an institution. What do the years mean? For man or institution, if they are filled with the honest sweat of service to humanity — with the patient following of that higher law of unflinching fidelity to the dictates of a calling — the years are a benediction.

Prairie View is an institution — a public institution. But an institution is an empty thing without the beating hearts and yearning souls of mortal men. And down the one hundred years of Praire View's existence, men have lived and dreamed here until every blade of grass and every rock, in that wise primordial way in which the primitive earth knows and cares, has joined the choir invisible to bless their memory. For every man whose foot has touched this hallowed soil has found a spirit, and has broadened and deepened it until what started out as an ambitionless meandering stream has become a purposeful river upon whose tide, now turbulent, now tranquil, floats the destiny of countless human hopes and dreams.

The spirit of an institution is the compound of many things — a strange and ofen quixotic amalgam of unrelated, sometimes contradictory, elements. Founded. symbolically, upon the ruins of a slave plantation, this college was authorized in the spirit of fair play of the constitutional convention of 1876 where wisdom would not allow vengeance to triumph over justice. The men of the parent school at College Station, growing ever wiser with the years, have translated that sense of justice into everbroadening channels. The humble student, from every nook and cranny in the land, has the echo of his laughter upon the wind, his hopes within the lurking shadows of our halls and by-ways. The giants, the worldshakers, have stood on our hill to mingle their search for truth with the fledgling's hopes for life. And men of dedication have worked here - worked to bring a new heaven and a new earth often with only faith and their hands — often without the spiritual or material compensation that sacrifices merited — but always with a sense of mission — with sense that somehow, someway, time would reward their efforts - would give to those to whom they had given their minds the victory of a new world — of an enlightened society.

Could we do better at the end of this one hundred years than pay homage to this amalgam, this spirit? Can we do less than dedicate our lives to task of fostering it, nurturing it, stimulating it — that those who will walk this ground, these halls, will know, and be better men because of it?


