Dear Mrs. Rowan:

According to your request concerning information pertaining to the estimated cost of two doz foot stools, we find that we can get two doz 14 inches high for seventy cents each, (the same size of mine) We can also get two doz nine inches high for fifty cents each. We thought it a good idea to get one half the number the nine inch size and the other half the 14 inch size.

Write us if you advise getting all the same size, or as is suggested above.

We suggest that you get twelve pounds of flat reed $\frac{1}{4}$ inch wide from the Practical Drawing Co. Dallas, Texas, to complete this number of stools. This reed can be bought for 75cents a pound.

Express on the stools will have to be paid on arrival in Prairie View.

Please have a reasonable amount of excelsior on hand to use as stuffing for stools.







Dear Mrs. Rowan:

I have heard from Miss Porter concerning the work with you during short course, and she says th t she will be able to give the demonstration in re-seating chairs on Tuesday afternoon, August 1. I quote from her letter:

"Mrs. Rowan will need a stool or a chair without a bottom for the chair seating work. A stool similar to those that come from the Marshall Products Company is all right but rather large. It would take too long a time to seat a chair completely in rush, so if I am to show her the process of weaving, I shall need quite a lot of small rope about the size of clothes line rope. Rush for seating is cured cat tail leaves. These long leaves are gathered and dried in the shade. If Mrs. Rowan is to do this, she should have had the information a long time before this as I seriously doubt that they will be cured enough by short course time to use. However, I did not know to whom I was to send the information. Perhaps I can bring along with me a little as I can likely get some here that is cured enough."

I have written Miss Porter, asking her to bring some of the rush with her, in case you could not get it cured in time for the work. You can do this work at my house, so if you will be there about 1:30 ~~or 2 p.m.~~ you can begin the work at that time. Write me if I can offer any suggestions that would help you.


