We call your attention to an account we have against the above party who we are informed is in your employ. This covers a balance of \$102.00 due the National Radio Institute, a considerable part of which is now overdue.

Although he has been given many chances to settle on a friendly basis, he has made no effort to co-operate, in spite of the fact that the obligation and the school's insistence upon immediate payment have been fully explained to him.

This party signed a contract promising to pay monthly until the tuition was paid in full. These payments were to be made monthly regardless of progress with the course. The school has faithfully carried out its part of the contract. It is still ready and willing to give the balance of the instruction. As you will realize, failure to study is no legitimate excuse as National Radio Institute has maintained instructors and costly facilities all of this time and debtor fully understood the payments were to be made monthly whether or not the course was regularly followed.

While a considerable sum is overdue, in order to be more than fair, we are willing to accept nominal monthly payments of \$6.00. According to our information, debtor is working steadily and we believe you will agree these terms are more than fair.

We feel sure that if you discuss the matter with your employee and explain the inviolability of a signed contract, this employee may resume study, which can be of such great value, and take care of this obligation squarely and promptly.

Any assistance or information you can give which will enable us to bring this matter to a satisfactory close will be sincerely appreciated.
