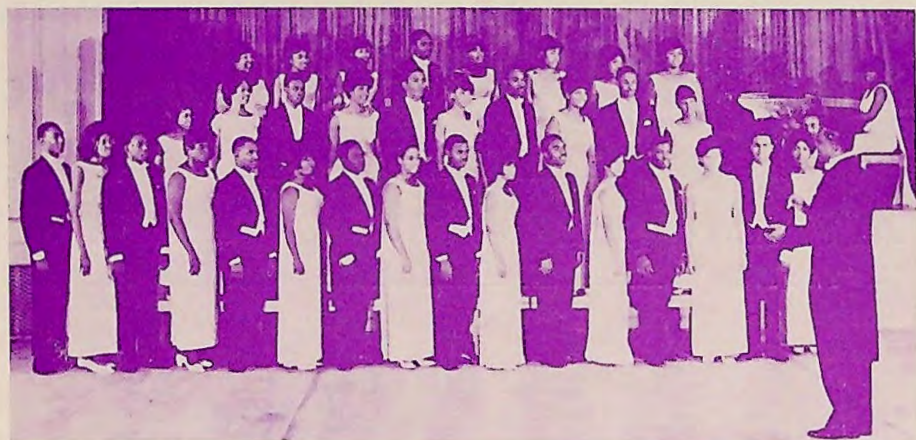

"Races with Strikes and Conflicts in Huge

Itincray Amid Winter Storms in Springtime"

On Wednesday morning, March 13, 1968 to March 30, 1968, with a projected V555 Chartered thrust, a 38 member personnel properly staffed and chaperoned by Mrs. L. C. Phillip, departed for a 17 day East and Middle West Tour. With best wishes from Dr. R. von Charlton, music staff, and chaperone of previous years, Mrs. Gloria C. Anderson, Prairie View A Cappella Concert Choir was launched into orbit, Dr. H. Edison Anderson, Conductor.

Share with us our pride in the following:

1. "Reflections on the Ninth Annual Tour adventures show a total of 390 concerts and more than 66,460 miles to date with an average of 36 concerts per year. In the Spring of 1968 in a program entitled, "Adventura Telstar of Songs Internationale," our concerts were well received before all of our respective and enthusiastic audiences.
2. We are glad to have been able to include Jarvis College, Hawkins, Texas and St. Louis, Missouri in our circle of tours for the first time.
3. "Standing ovations in Port Arthur, Jarvis College, Hawkins, Texas, Memphis, Tennessee, Chicago, Illinois and Kansas City, Kansas; with unforgettable performances at Orange, Texas; Tulsa, Oklahoma; Jasper, Texas; Dallas, Texas; Detroit, Michigan; Houston, Texas and Frankfort, Kentucky.
4. One important highlight of the tour was having been requested by Dr. Martin Luther King to sing at his Citation in Memphis, Tennessee, and we believe we were the last College Choir to have this honor before his assassination. This performance was taped and later televised in a special from Washington, D. C., Channel 8, National and ABC, including Europe.
