They furnish protection against erosion, add nitrogen, and improve the physical condition of the soil. The loss from cotton root rot is decreased on land where the disease is present.

The enclosed copy of the "Area Map--Soil-Improving Legumes" was prepared by key agricultural agencies; and gives valuable information on the use of legumes in various parts of the State.

TO ALL EXTENSION AGENTS:

The Treasury Department is making a special effort during the fall to sell U. S. Savings Bonds to farmers and ranchers. This effort involves acquainting the rural families of Texas with the value of Savings Bonds as a safe and sound investment that provides (1) a solid hedge against a break in commodity prices, (2) a financial reserve for debt amortization, expansion of operations, or any kind of emergency, and (3) a practical savings plan for old-age retirement, higher education for children, and various other uses.

This office believes that the Savings Bonds program can do a great deal to improve and safeguard the financial and personal welfare of the people who take their living from the soil. I urge you, therefore, to join with the various organizations and individuals throughout the State in making this drive a success.

I especially urge that you send to the farm and ranch people of your county the literature explaining the advantages of Savings Bonds. Samples of the material will be sent you directly from Savings Bonds headquarters in Dallas. Then, just as soon as possible, a Savings Bonds fieldman will call on you to discuss the project.

I will appreciate your being as helpful and as cooperative as possible, as your office is one of the very few direct means for the Savings Bonds Division to reach the farm and ranch people of your region with a message that should be of considerable interest to them.
