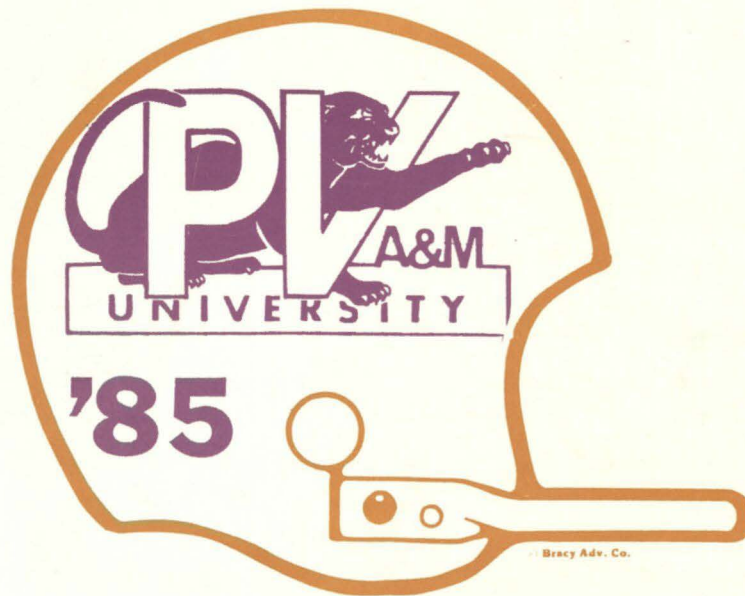

Think about this. When you finish four years of academic study and playing football at Prairie View, wouldn't it mean more to have a degree to go along with your football statistics?

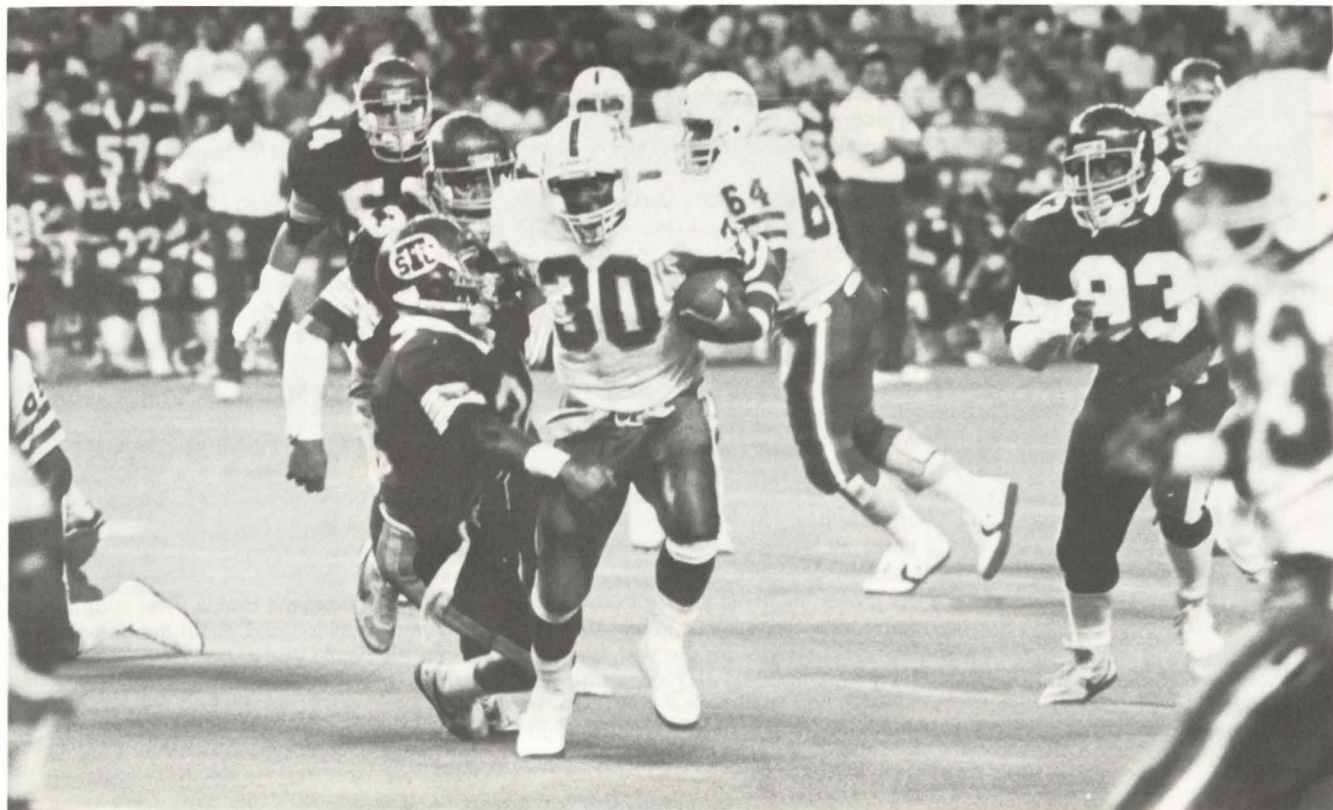

Like all teams we want to be winners. The mission of Prairie View is to produce winners on and off the football field. We will help you get where you want to go.

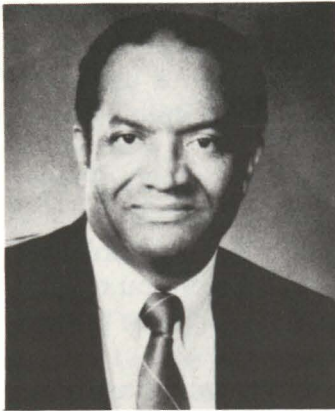
We are currently building a strong foundation for a winning football team, and the Productive, Proud, Panther, Person, you can be.

## DR. PERCY PIERRE, President



Prairie View A&M has been successful in providing for the optimal development of the students it serves. Students at the University represent all sections of the state, with the highest percentages coming from Southeast Texas. A total of 29 other states and six foreign countries are also represented in the student body of 5,381. The enrollment includes 88% black, 11% white, and 1% other races.

Student development at the University has and will continue to take into account the hard facts concerning the socio-economic backgrounds of students enrolled. For a student clientele characterized by all the limitations that economic poverty brings, Prairie View provides opportunities for socio-cultural development as an integral feature of the student's education.

## MR. BRUTUS N. JACKSON, Athletic Director



When Brutus N. Jackson was named Prairie View A&M University's new Director of Athletics in January 1984, he said at the time, "I'd like to rebuild a first class athletic program...I am looking forward to the challenge of directing the athletic program at a great university with great tradition."

Approaching his second year on the job, Jackson has done exactly that. He has begun to build a strong program of first class quality. To his new job, he has brought many vibrantly fresh ideas and a very business-like approach to accomplishing the objectives he set out for himself and the department.

Already, the entire Prairie View community as well as the metropolitan Houston area and the Southwestern states have begun to see and feel the impact of his efforts. PV's twelve varsity Athletic sports programs began making inroads as one of the SWAC (Southwestern Athletic Conference) fearsome competitors. The women's track team has won two national championships and two conference championships in the last two years; while the women's basketball team was the number seven most improved team in the NCAA in 1984. The men's basketball team has come full-tilt over the past year to become a strong competitor in the conference, and will travel to play Marquette University in Wisconsin this season. Revenues from football are on the rise along with the spirit of the football players and coaching staff. The other five men's sports are making progressive strides towards excellence; while 1985 will be the first year for women's volleyball and women's tennis will be reinstated.

Within the department, there is a new sense of excitement and optimism about the future. Fund-raising has increased significantly. Exposure locally, regionally and nationally has increased. New staff members have been hired to enhance the betterment of individual sports respectively and the entire athletic department as a whole. New lines of duties and responsibilities have been delegated; all of which has led to more efficiency and productivity. Revenues from football and basketball are increasing and interest in and an awareness of PV athletics has grown markedly among students faculty, staff, alumni and the Prairie View community.

From day one, Jackson has strong convictions about Prairie View as an academic institution and about the potential for greatness of its athletic department. Jackson's presence for the past seventeen years on the newly landscaped campus of Prairie View A&M has brought him numerous honors, awards, and respect from professional societies in education and business community.

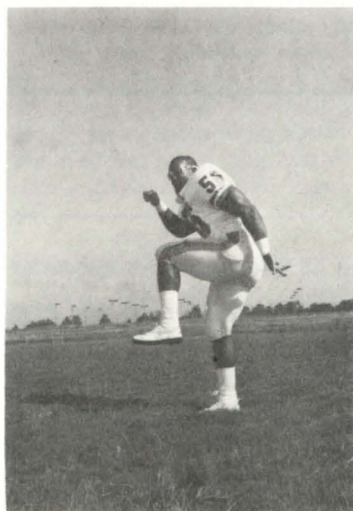

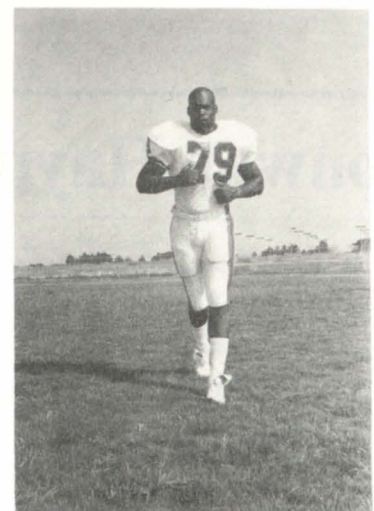

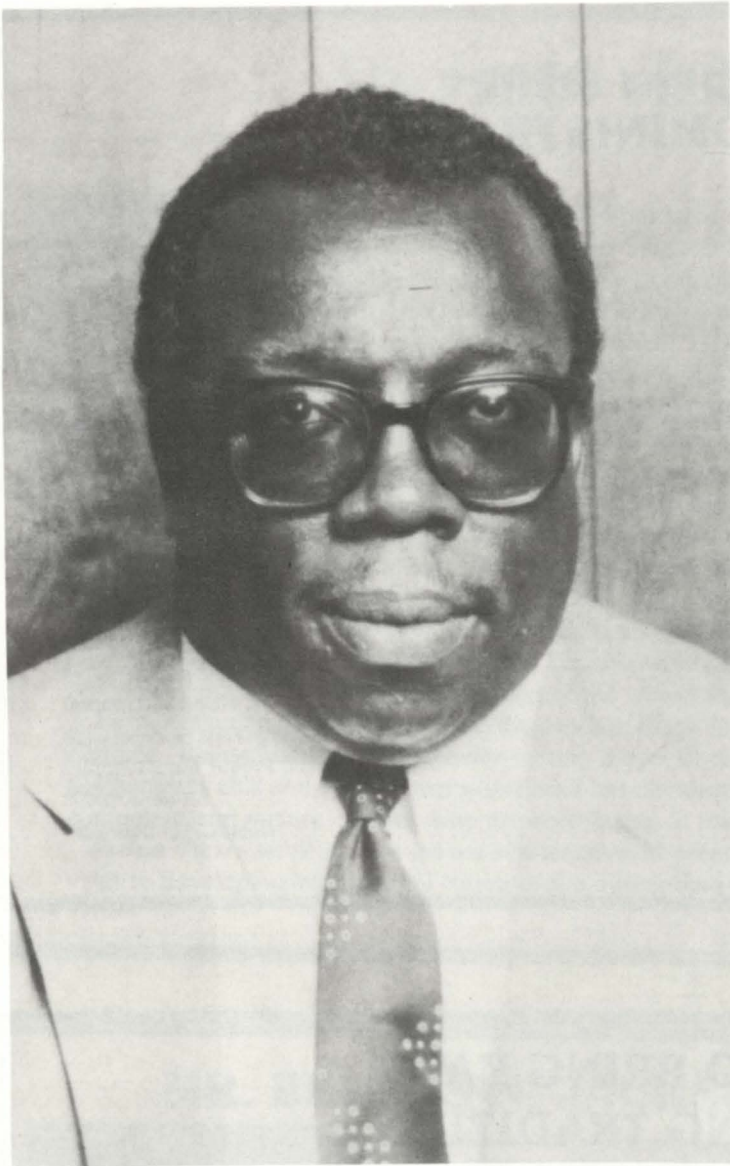

## Quoting Coach Hayman

---

### Evaluate the conference race:

"Mississippi Valley State, Jackson State, Alcorn and Grambling should battle for the conference title. The forward pass will be the predominant focus this year and these teams should vie for the league crown."

### What do you feel are your team's strengths and weaknesses?

"Our overall strength should be in the area of experience. Our weakness will center around depth and running back."

### How has last year's season affected your outlook toward this year?

"A greater desire to motivate, research and develop the football players and program here at Prairie View."

### Has your coaching philosophy or views on college football changed at all since you took over?

"Yes. I feel the modern athlete needs to be reminded of the intrinsic value of competitive athletics and education. To play college football in order to play pro football is a singular outlook that must be done away with right away."

## Conway Hayman

---

Hayman joined the Prairie View staff in the middle of the 1981 season as offensive line coach. Coach Hayman officially became head coach in January of 1984, as Prairie View's football coach, a position obtained after three years as an assistant. The former Houston Oiler offensive lineman played 14 years and has the reign over a team that posted an 0-11 record last season. "We can't go anywhere but up," he remarked recently. We are going to try and bring a competitive and winning attitude back to football at Prairie View. Hayman has surrounded himself with a number of former professional players who are working around the clock to put some life in panther football.

In college, at the University of Delaware, he was named to the All Conference team twice,

gained All East honors twice and was an All American.

Hayman also played for the Los Angeles Rams, New England Patriots and Washington Redskins. Hayman retired in 1981, the crowning event in his pro-career was to named honorable mentioned All-Conference in 1979.

"I had no aspirations of being a head coach when I first came to Prairie View," Hayman said. "But now things are different." I know it will take a big bite out of myself and others who will join my staff.

"I take a realistic attitude about the position. It has taken 15 or 16 years for the program to get where it is and I know it can't turn around in one year," Hayman said.

# Prairie View

Okay, so maybe Panthers football team came in last place the past season in the SWAC, but that only gives Coach Conway Hayman and his crew something harder to work toward. A First Win! Second Year head football coach Conway Hayman feels he has a more experienced team this season. With 25 lettermen returning and 12 starters returning it's more experience than the Panthers had to work with last season.

Last season was Hayman's first season as head coach, and he inherited a lot of former Panther coach Jim McKinney's headaches. Hayman has rid himself of the guys who did not have the heart to play football, and recruited the men who want to win. "I don't believe we will come in last place this season. The guys are working together harder than before, and that's what it takes—teamwork to win. This Spring we learned you have to work hard to achieve anything. Anything worth while you've got to work hard for," stated Hayman.

## OFFENSE

"Our passing game will improve a lot because we have some vastly improved receivers." Conway Hayman also talks about other changes that were made in Panther Football. "At the tightend position significant changes have been made with the development of converted players." Joe Harris, 6-4, Computer Science major will play tightend as opposed to offensive line this fall.

Returning quarterback Earnest Brow, (6'2, 180) from LaMarque, Texas looked good in Spring practice. Although the coaches played him sparingly in the scrimmage, his moments on the grid iron were well spent. In the opening moments of the game excitement was kicked off. After ten drives Brow threw a touch down pass to tightend Joe Harris for the gold team.

Panthers have depth with the running backs this season as Cravon Rogers, (165 C 501 yds.) leads his fellow running backs Joseph Winston (5'8, 185) and Adrian Haynes (5'11, 200) on the grid iron.

Offensive Lineman Eric Gray, a strapping 6'3, 210 pound senior from Los Angeles is pound for pound the best player in the SWAC. His move to center will fill a void created by loss of Lindsey West. Eric is the fastest OL Lineman Prairie View has seen in many years. His intensity, overall athletic and intelligence make him an All-SWAC Candidate.

Wide Receiver Brian Gardner (5'10, 180) should be one of the premier football players in the SWAC this season. He was a pleasant surprise in 1984 and only the sky is the limit. Brian is also a dean's list student as well.

Captain of the Panther team Marcus Currie is our 1984 comeback player. His improvement was a real bright spot in a winless season. Coupled this year with redshirt Clinton Bell, Marcus could form a solid half of a dynamic duo on our left side. Cravon Rogers, Emmerick Jacobs, Milton Austin and Adrian Haynes

## DEFENSE

Defensively, the Panthers are looking better this year with the key being experience. The top returnees defensively are Darryl Lindsey (6'3, 250), Darren McAllister (6'8, 265), Michael Lomax (5'11, 225) and Aaron Longino (6'3, 235).

Captain Lomax, our defensive player of 1984 is expected to return to top form after late season injury. Mike has a rare combination of speed, strength, and intelligence to make him a top athlete in the SWAC this season. Lomax is also a 3.2 Electrical Technology major. While Darren McAllister is possibly one of the best football prospects at Prairie View in 10 years, he needs to put together a highly intense football season without injury. "Big Mac's" performance could determine Prairie View's 1985 fortune.

## KEY LOSSES

Prairie View A&M did not lose a great deal, but the likes of Lindsey West and Benjamin Carter will be missed. West played in the 1985 Freedom Bowl and was All-SWAC second team. Benjamin Carter had 60 tackles last season. D.D. Richardson will return as a Grad Assistant Coach, but the Panthers will miss him as one of their top linebackers.

## SUMMARY

This year's theme is "PANTHERS ALIVE IN '85." The Panthers kickoff their first game of the season against Texas Southern University in what will be the first annual **LABOR DAY FOOTBALL CLASSIC**. The Panthers will

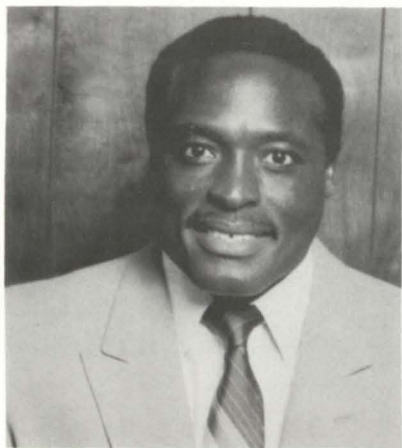
play two other games in the Astrodome this season, making it a **ALIVE IN 85** year.

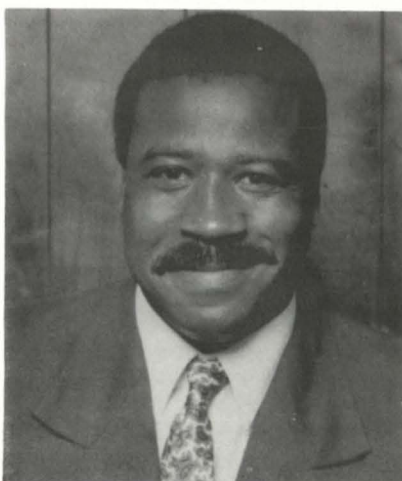
## ASSISTANT FOOTBALL COACHES



RONALD BEARD...Defensive Coordinator...Ron Beard is a 1973 graduate of Eastern Michigan University. Beard was active in athletics at Eastern as a member of the Hurons football and basketball team. His college team had an undefeated season on the gridiron in 1971 and went to the Pioneer Bowl. Beard played professional football with the now defunct World Football League, the Detroit Wheels. Beard's collegiate coaching experience began at Central State University in 1974 where he coached until 1977. After three years at Central State, Beard joined the coaching ranks at North Carolina A&T University in Greensboro, North Carolina. His A&T team appeared in two post season bowl games, the first bowl appearance in the school's history. Beard joined the Prairie View football staff in 1982 while Cornelius Cooper was head coach.

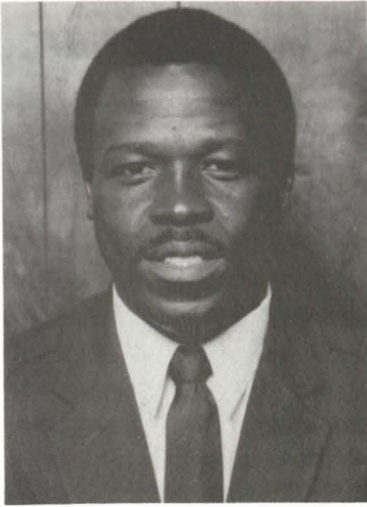


DOUGLAS FOWLKES...Offensive Coordinator is a graduate of Central State University, Wilberforce, Ohio. Doug played football for Central State and was an All-American in wrestling. Before coming to coach at Prairie View, Fowlkes gained experience in coaching high school football in Columbus, Ohio and then returned to Central State as a graduate assistant coach, Fowlkes coached the offensive line at Texas Southern University 1981 to 1984 where he also earned his masters degree. Also the strength coach for the Panthers, the 1985 football team improvement is visible in the bodies of the athletes. Fowlkes is a strong force behind the new attitude of the athletes and the Pride projected in the football program



AL JOHNSON, Quarterbacks, recruiting coordinators — Took charge of quarterbacks at Prairie View A&M on September 1, 1984. A long time teammate of Coach Hayman, Johnson played for the Houston Oilers for seven years and was captain of special teams. Attended Frederick Douglass High School in Baltimore, MD...received his bachelors degree in physical education from the University of Cincinnati. Played baseball, basketball, football at Frederick Douglass and was captain of each sport his senior year. Recruited by UC to play football...Most Improved Athlete his freshman year 1969. Most outstanding Back three years in a row...Returning to Prairie View to improve on his last season record as assistant coach.

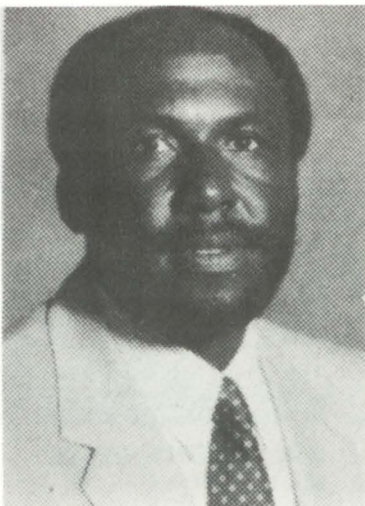
## ASSISTANT FOOTBALL COACHES

AL BASS, Defensive Line, asst. strength coach, counseling. He joined the Panther coaching staff in January 1985 after a brief coaching season at Marshall University, Huntington, West Virginia; the 1984 season finishing with a 6-5 record. Al Bass's coaching experience also includes coaching at St. Bernard High School in Louisiana Morgan City, Louisiana. Bass played 4 years and lettered 3 years at the University of Dayton as a fullback.



BOB ATKINS...Wide Receivers...Bob Atkins is a 1968 graduate of Grambling State University. While at Grambling, Bob Atkins was a three year letterman under the supervision of Coach Eddie Robinson, Bob Atkins now trains his wide receivers to out run and catch the G-Men of Grambling. Atkins played pro football for the St. Louis Cardinals three years, and the Houston Oilers for seven years. Atkins joined the P.V. football coaching staff in 1980. In 1981 Atkins left to coach women's basketball at Sam Houston High School in Houston, Texas for two years before returning to Prairie View to rejoin former Oiler teammate, Conway Hayman. Atkins is also the Head coach of the women's basketball team.

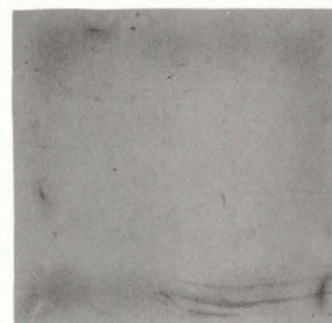

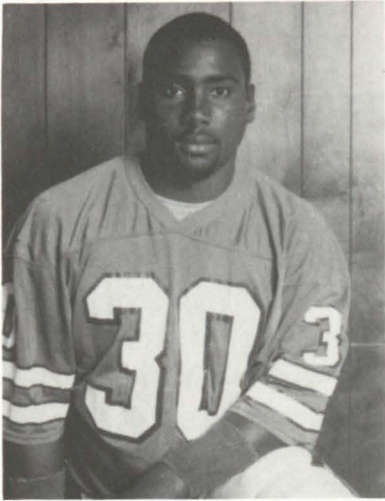
### **66..MARCUS L. CURRIE**
