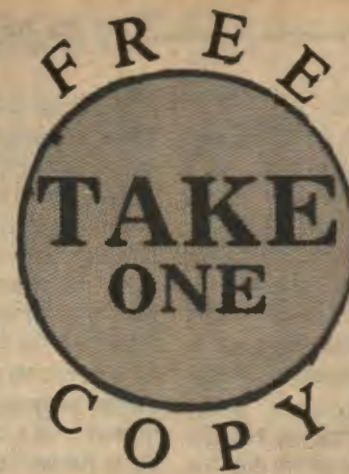



UP-N-DOWN 290

My friend Tom showed up at the house Sunday with a new acquisition that he wanted me to see. Seems as though his son had one more dog than he'd ought to have, so Tom left Victoria with "Mac", an 85 pound Labrador Retriever puppy. Mac is about a year old now, and still growing, so it's a good thing Tom owns a grocery store, because he's going to need it to keep Mac fed. Lord knows how big that "puppy" will be when he gets his growth, but he shows all the signs of being large enough to ride while working cows.

Mac is the usual lab, curious, loving and beautiful, but not long on training. I can't help but remember when I bought my lab, "Duke" many years ago. I did a fair amount of waterfowl hunting in those days, and had the opportunity to gun over some truly fantastic dogs, so I made up my mind that I was going to have a really well-trained hunting companion in Duke.

He was just a little ball of black fur when I got him, so I had plenty of time to read several good training books by famous gun dog trainers, and Duke & I set off on a program of getting each other trained to hunt together.

We went through several months of the usual puppy training exercises, and all went according to plan, more or less. Labs are very smart dogs, and Duke was no exception, so my job was relatively easy. All of the authors agreed on the early steps of basic discipline training, and Duke & I were going by the books.

I even took a couple of weekend trips to regional Lab Field trials to see just what was expected of a well-trained gun dog, and I always came home with renewed enthusiasm to share with Duke.

At the most critical point in Duke's training, my company informed me that it would be necessary for me to go over to Europe for a few months on business. As we couldn't take a dog into Europe without long quarantine periods, my company agreed to board Duke here for a while.

Trimble, Hart and Phillips Elected To W.I.S.D. Board

Dr. Gerald Slater, superintendent of the Waller Independent School District, has announced the outcome of the Saturday, Jan. 19, election for School Board Trustees.

In position five, Mrs. Jo Trimble was elected with 518 votes. Evelyn Moore received 22 votes as a write-in candidate.

Maurice Hart Sr. was elected by 496 votes in position six, defeating Felman Sorsby, who garnered 46 votes and Andrew Malveaux, who received 22 votes as a write-in.

In position seven, Raymond Phillips was elected to the board with 520 votes, while Marion Henry received 27 write-in votes.

Trimble, Hart and Phillips will serve three-year terms on the board.

Slater said that the 565 votes cast in the election was an extremely low number, adding that usually

between 15 and 18 hundred turn out to cast ballots.

The day I got back, I went straight to the handler to get my dog. The handler took my money, then sent the boy to kennel 19 to get Duke. The boy put him through a few paces out in the pasture, to show me how much my dog had learned, and I watched through the window, not wanting Duke to see me until I had seen what he had learned.

He was magnificent, going through the paces with precision. I was impressed, but for some reason, he didn't look quite right to me. Of course, I had been gone for 3 months, dogs do grow and change, and he was quite a good distance off in the field, but...

At last, reunion time was at hand. I called his name, and he perked up his ears, raised his head, recognized me, and came bounding up to me with his tail wagging. Only when he rolled over for a belly-scratch did I discover the reason why he didn't look quite right to me. Female!

The handler was quite embarrassed and confused. He could have sworn that my dog had been kept in kennel #19 all summer. One famous handler recommended that while a pup is still quite young, when he misbehaves or won't pay attention, grab him by the loose skin

on his rump and shoulders, holler "no, no" in a firm voice, pick him up clear of the ground and give him a vigorous shake, then set him down firmly. This will really show him who's boss. Sounds good.

I sure would like to be around when Tom decides to show his 85-pound puppy who's boss. Should be quite a show.

Well, it's time to go to work now, so I'll be seeing you up-n-down the road.

Dr. Richard Redfield Answers Questions About

The Eyesight Of Texas

Dear Dr. Redfield,

After my mother's last eye examination, she was told that she had cataracts. What exactly are cataracts?

Eldon Hughes

Dear Mr. Hughes,

A cataract is an opacity or a darkening of the clear focusing lens which is located directly behind the iris or colored part of the eye.

Cataracts have been known since the beginning of medical history and are the leading cause of blind-

ness throughout the world.

Cataracts are not a disease. In most cases, they occur as a normal change in the tissue that makes up the focusing lens. However, cataracts may also be the result of trauma or due to some other underlying factor such as diabetes or certain drug therapies.

Many professionals believe that "old-age" cataracts are due to the harmful rays of light, called ultraviolet rays, that are found in sunlight. These "harmful" rays of light

(which are more intense in the sun-belt) enter our eye through the pupil and react with the lens tissue and result in opacification or cataract development.

Recently, a new type of ophthalmic lens, called the U-V 400 (for ultraviolet), has been developed to help slow cataract progression. This lens is designed to filter out harmful rays of the sun that may be responsible for cataract development.

Many of my patients who have

beginning cataracts have their prescriptions made with this new lens. Even some of my younger patients have their sunglasses made with the U-V 400 lens.

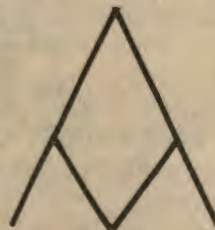

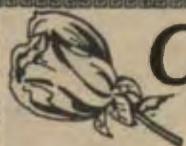
