

Your silence has given me so much concern until I have asked Mr. McAdams to assist us in making the Houston County appropriation a reality. I was afraid you had become discouraged with having such a long drawn out affair.

I explained to Mr. McAdams that the three hundred dollars (\$300.00) needed for a home Agent was our surest bet on continuing the service in a county during a year. Even though two hundred dollars (\$200.00) will get recognition and a contract, it is understood that in case of retrenchment or in the event no funds are given for expansion the money from counties paying less than three hundred dollars can be transferred to one paying three hundred dollars.

It is my earnest hope that your board will execute the order for the two hundred forty dollars (\$240.00) at their meeting Monday, then if it becomes necessary to go back for the additional sixty dollars (\$60.00) further provisions must be made.

Please talk to Mr. McAdams about this appropriation, at once.







6. Securing the inclusion of the Negroes of Texas in the plans of the Texas Centennial Commission.
