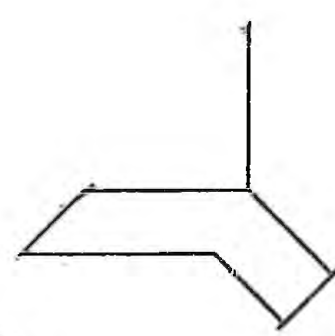
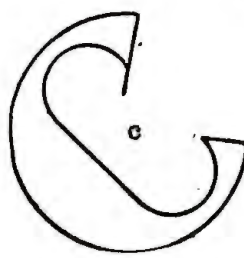
Dear Sirs:

I have the report of the National Conference on Voluntary Leadership which you requested Miss Barry to send me April 8, asking for comment.

I don't know that I have any further suggestions to make except; there seems to be a need for some serious thinking on the question of our general farm labor shortage, caused by migration to defense industries and the Selective draft. For example, if these voluntary neighborhood leaders could be asked to assist in organizing local "Farmers' labor exchanges" I believe much good could be accomplished in the way of obtaining the maximum use of the man, horse and machine power still left on the farm.

In my contacts with extension agents in the field, I have advocated such organizations and hope to make a factual statement on this point in the near future as to what is actually being done.





PIG SHOW MEMO.

The Caldwell County Show will be held at Luling, May 28.

All agents will see that their boys train their pigs so they may be shown to the best advantage, and bring each boy with you to the District Show.

In the county, awards which will be as follows, only one breed of chickens will go to a county.

1st prize - Gilts - 150 chicks
2nd prize - Gilts - 100 chicks
3rd prize - Gilts - 75 chicks
4th prize - Gilts - 75 chicks
5th prize - Gilts - 50 chicks

In the District Show, the first prize, gilts and boars will be a registered Jersey Heifer; the balance will be in cash in each case. Check with your boys and see what breed of chickens they wish and when they want them, June, Fall, or next Spring. Let me have this information as quickly as possible.






