We have no directions for chair seating or rug making, but will send you the prices of the cane which we sell by the pound and the prices of the wools for the rugs which we sell in the same way.

The cane for the chair seating is \$1.25 per pound. The wool for the hooked rug making is \$1.50 per, pound, and the wool a little heavier at \$1.65 per pound. The latter is very good for making a firm rug which will lie very flat on the floor *on a 'vine*.

# EFFORTS BEING MADE TO KEEP NEGRO AGENT HERE

---

A committee from Crockett Chamber of Commerce appeared before the commissioners' court last Monday in an effort to get the court to put up the county's required amount that would enable Houston county to retain the services of the negro home demonstration agent, Mrs. M. E. Bledsoe.

Judge Will McLean stated that no one was more in favor of the work being continued than he, but called attention to the fact that so many people are failing to pay their taxes and stated that it is doubtful if the county can keep the other agents unless our citizens assume a different attitude toward the payment of their taxes.

Three different members of the court expressed themselves as being willing to vote for a \$20.00 per month appropriation to retain Mrs. Bledsoe's services next year but neither of them would offer the motion so the matter went by default.

W. E. Keeland, a member of the committee, stressed the fact that a large per cent of our population is negroes and that they produce a large per cent of our agricultural products and wealth. He said we owed them this small service as a matter of simple justice in the first place because they pay a higher per cent of their taxes than the white people do, and furthermore, being largely tillers of the soil they need the intelligent leadership and instruction which a home demonstration agent could give.

Mrs. Bledsoe has been offered a place in another East Texas county but it is still hoped by the agricultural committee that the commissioners' court will find some way to retain Mrs. Bledsoe's services.
