Dear Mr. Mayo:

I wish to call your attention to my letter of November 1st concerned with discontinuing the activities in Austin county in the Sears 4-H Swine Program and the matter of starting a Sears Swine Program in Lavaca county.

No representative of the Sears Roebuck Foundation was present at the committee meeting at which the committee voted to take Lavaca county into the Program. Since such action would involve the expenditure of funds by the Sears Roebuck Foundation, it is naturally necessary that the Sears Roebuck Foundation give its approval. The committee has no authority to make commitments involving the expenditure of funds without the approval of the Sears Roebuck Foundation.

It therefore is necessary that you take no step in starting a Program in Lavaca county until the Sears Roebuck Foundation has approved the committee recommendation. Likewise no pigs or money should be taken from the boys in Austin county until the whole matter is cleared.

Please take such immediate action as is necessary to notify your Lavaca county agent so that he will not do anything until the new Program has been approved.







Gentlemen:

This year, the Division of Agriculture has attempted to use students as full time laborers in certain of our departments. At present, we have five (5) such students employed. They receive \$103.10 per month from which maintenance is deducted. They live in the dormitories, eat in the student's dining hall and have certain student privileges. Each one is saving \$50.00 per month. I think they have used some of their income for clothing and other necessities. These men were selected from your high schools from the spring producing classes. There are two positions open for students who would like to work now and enter school next September. They will be employed on the roads and grounds. They will do such general work as mowing grass, watering beds, removing trash from campus, planting shrubbery and flowers, and maintaining lawns. If you can recommend a prospective student, who would be interested in this type of arrangement, kindly notify me immediately.

TO ALL DISTRICT AGENTS:

December 1 is the opening date for enrollment in the Rural Neighborhood Progress Contest for 1950. The Farmer-Stockman magazine will carry entry blanks in the December issue.

The Rural Neighborhood Progress Contest offers an excellent means of enrolling neighborhoods under their own leadership. This will be helpful to all Extension agents in carrying out an effective county Extension program. Enrollment for 1949 was below what we anticipated and we are calling the enrollment time to your attention early this year so that we may have a wider interest among rural leaders.

This interest and the number of neighborhoods enrolled is likely to be in proportion to the interest of district agents. It would be desirable to have at least one neighborhood in each county in the State as a demonstration in rural neighborhood progress work. Fitting in with this neighborhood, it would be well to consider a Farm Unit Demonstration family. To me, it seems that the two would work along perfectly in at least one neighborhood in each county as a beginning.

Those district agents who have neighborhoods enrolled in the contest for 1949 are urged to follow through with their agents so that we might have a one hundred per cent completion of the number enrolled. We wish to call your attention to the fact that there are twenty monies offered in the contest this year, and since we have only about 40 neighborhoods enrolled, it is very important that they all complete their work.
