I wish to take this opportunity to express my appreciation for the fine manner in which you made arrangements and conducted the District Pig Show.

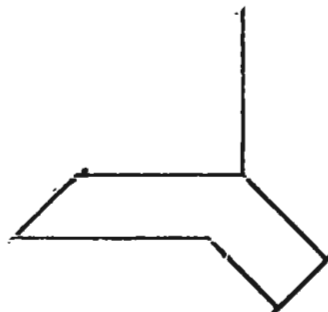
My confidence in you and your farmers' ability to handle such a program was amply justified and the assistance you were able to secure in the form of grounds and feed and ribbons further justified this confidence.
