

THE PRAIRIE VIEW A CAPPELLA CONCERT CHOIR TENTH NATIONAL TOUR HIGHLIGHTS

On Sunday morning, February 23, 1969, with a projected V549 chartered thrust, a 36 member personnel properly staffed and chaperoned by Mrs. L. C. Phillip, departed for a 15 day Western Tour. With best wishes from Dr. R. von Charlton, the music staff, and chaperone of previous years, Mrs. Gloria C. Anderson, the Prairie View A Cappella Concert Choir was launched into orbit, Dr. H. Edison Anderson, Conductor.

- I. Reflections on the past 10 national tour adventures show a total of 380 concerts and more than 71, 776 miles to date, with an average of 36 concerts per year.
- 2. It was refreshing to know that our concerts were climatic following a spherical orbid from the heart of the South and West through the mountains of Arizona-California and across six states from Texas to California; going by way of San Juan, Old Mexico and returning by way of the Golden Gate Bridge, down the mysterious mountain ranges of Old Mexico and the High Sierras, in a program entitled "Neophonic Telstar of Songs Internationale."
- 3. Encore ovations were seldom less than eight with several standing ovations, among which were audiences at Odessa, Texas; Phoenix, Arizona; Los Angeles, Berkley, and Stockton, California; Tucson, Arizona; and Dallas, Texas with memorable performances at Fresno, California; Amarillo and Tyler, Texas.
- 4. Top highlights of the tour were: A provided tour of Arizona State University by Reverend Benjamin Brooks of Southminster Presbyterian Church, Phoenix, Arizona; a provided tour of Los Angeles through Hollywood, Sunset Strip, Balwin Hills, and terminating in the fabulous Crenshaw Shopping Center by Reverend Edward V. Hill of Mt. Zion Missionary Baptist Church. A cordless light for the accompanist was given Dr. Anderson at his home by Mrs. Berry from Tucson, who in traveling to Florida, stopped by to make the presentation. A citation was given the choir at Hamilton Park High School, Dallas, Texas and a music trophy presented to Dr. Anderson by Mrs. Nancy Self, President of the Band Parents and at which, Mr. Maceo Johnson and Mr. and Mrs. McFarland promised the necessary research and exploration of a choir performance on the Ed Sullivan Program.

It was heart warming to know that our concerts were well received before all of our respective and enthusiastic audiences. Every point in our itinerary played a vivid part in helping us realize the above highlights and successful season.
