TODAY'S GAME

PRAIRIE VIEW — (Special) —

What is worse than catching a Tiger by the tail? PVU head football coach will say preparing for an Alcorn Braves attack.

Today the Prairie View Panthers host the nation's number one small college power, Alcorn Braves, in a Southwestern Athletic Conference contest.

The 8-0 Braves of Coach Marino Casem boast the number one defense in the nation against the rush. They have held the opposition to a mere 43.1 yards rushing per game, while themselves averaging 199.5 a game rushing and 137.3 passing.

The Braves offense is directed by William Wooley, a 5-11, 197 pound All SWAC quarterback. Wooley is the team's total offensive leader with a 100.5 game average. He has completed 73 of 140 passes for 983 yards and 10 touchdowns.

Wooley looks to running backs Augusta Lee and James Jackson for most of the running. Lee, a 5-11, 213 pound sophomore is SWAC's second leading rusher with a 93.2 game average. Jackson has a 78.3 average.

On defense, big Lawrence Pillers, 6-4, 215 defensive end leads the charge. He has 111 tackles in 8 games.

The Panthers are hoping for a big upset as Hoover Wright will depend on such stat leaders as David Bohannon, Maurice Gindratt and Tommy Gay.

This will be the 18th meeting between the two schools. PV leads the series 9-8. PV last won in 1965, 17-14. Alcorn won last year 44-0.

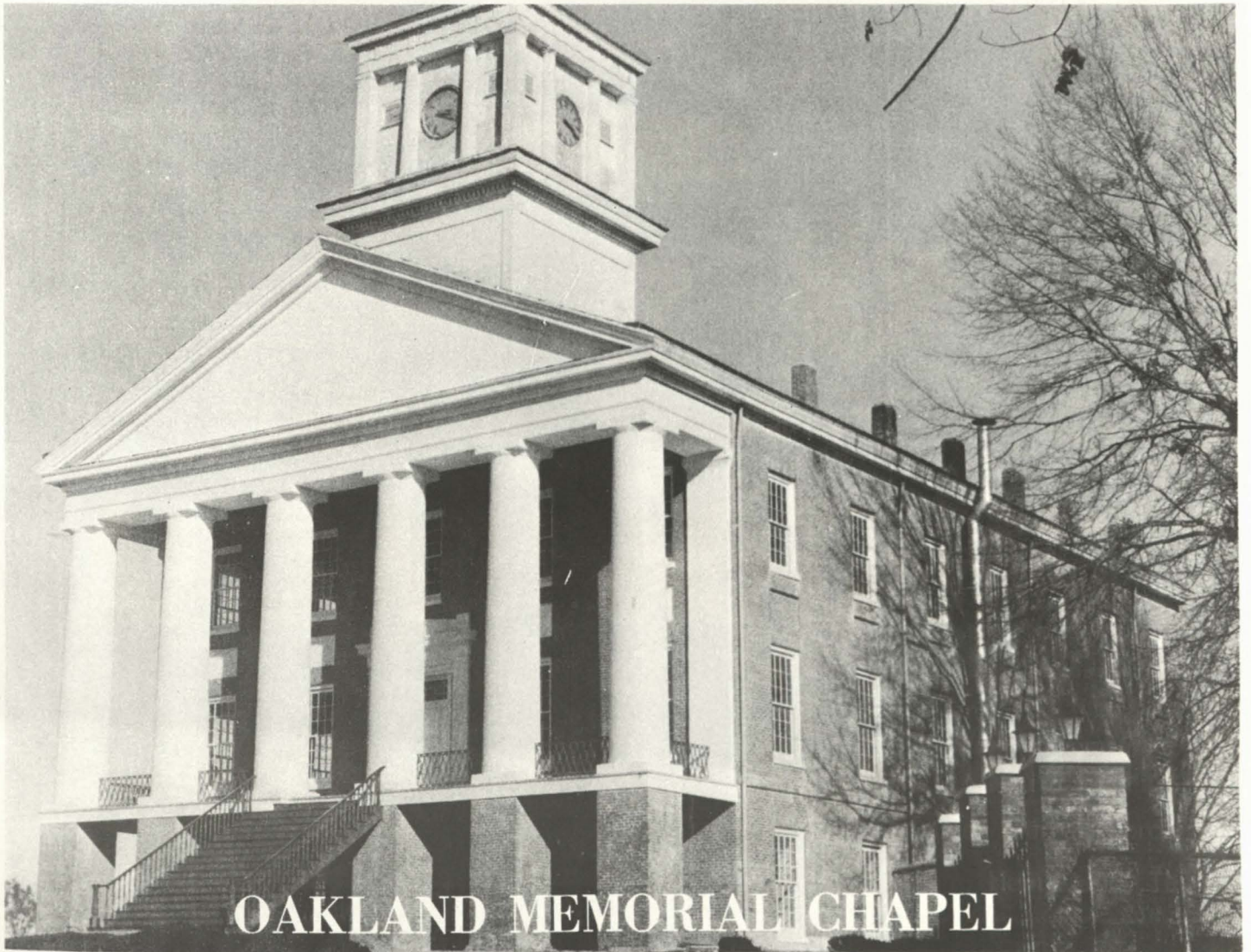

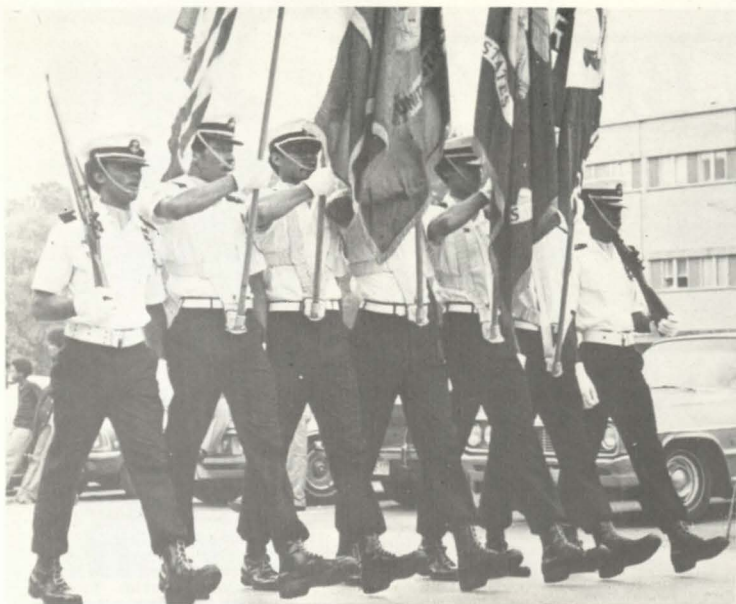

SOUTHWESTERN CONFERENCE (SWAC)

BRIEF HISTORY

The Southwestern Athletic Conference had its beginning as an alliance of small Texas schools in the early twenties. By mutual agreement, representatives from Jarvis, Texas College, Bishop, Prairie View and Paul Quinn met for preliminary consideration of a series of recommendations in 1921. They later acted upon the recommendations, resulting in the formal organization of the SWAC.

The function of the conference, as stated at the time, was to legislate the management and control of all intercollegiate athletics of the schools represented. With the exception of Prairie View charter membership was composed exclusively of church affiliated schools.

Later, Langston (Okla), Arkansas AM&N and Southern University were added by election. They were followed by Grambling, Alcorn A&M and Jackson State in the late fifties.

Wiley College, Marshall, Texas, the only church affiliated school holding membership in the league, dropped out in mid-summer of 1969 and was replaced by Mississippi Valley State, Itta Bena.

Today, the SWAC ranks as one of the nation's strongest small-college leagues. Conference teams have won national championships in basketball, baseball and track. The SWAC also ranks as one of the most prolific producers of professional football players, with Grambling placing next to Notre Dame in the number of active players.

Prairie View is the only charter member left in the conference.

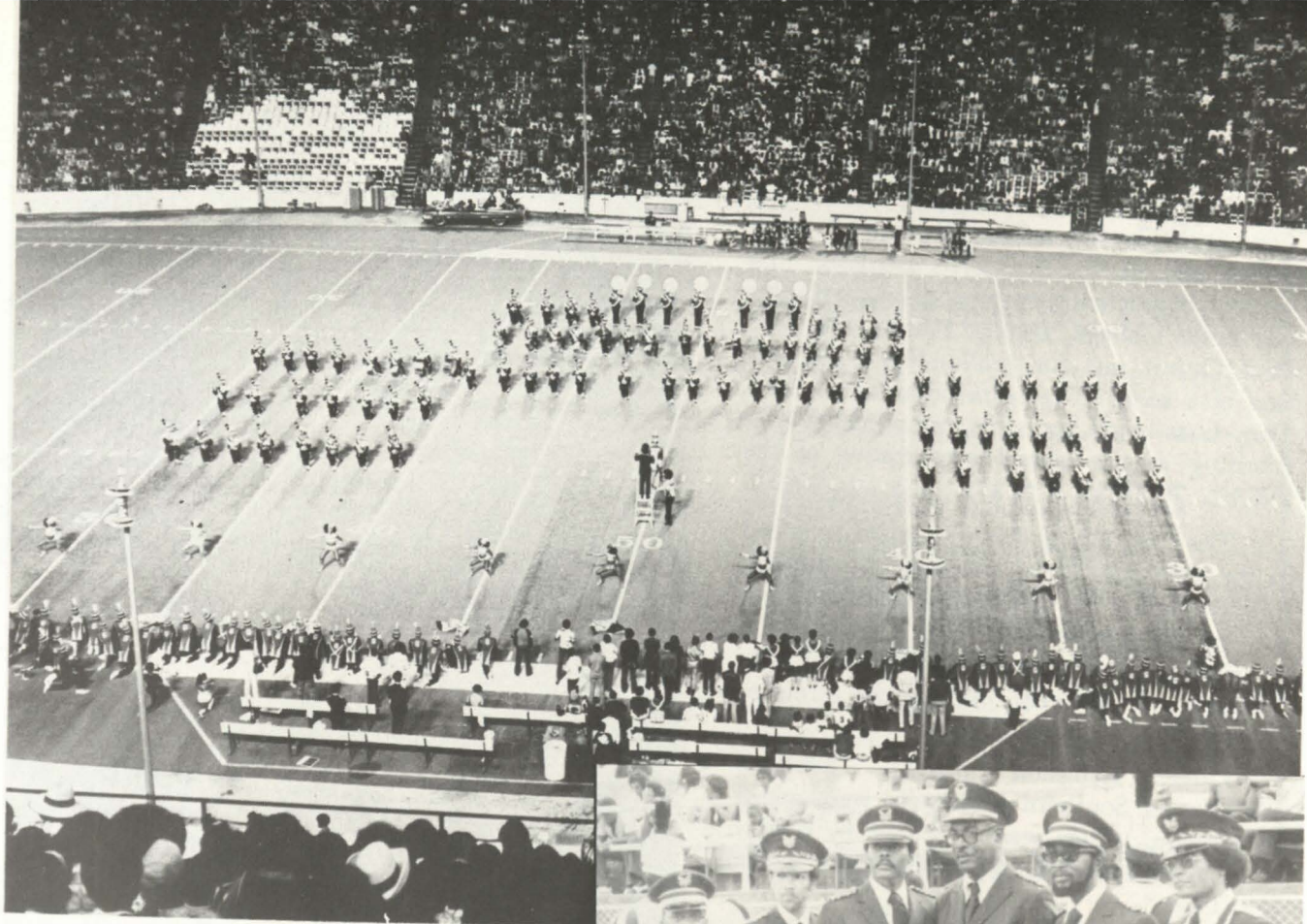
