





teaches in the ag department. Holt, who is dedicated to the value of vocational training in Texas schools, points out that he would have been a high school dropout if he had not been involved in FFA and 4-H competition, Instead, he graduated and went on to college, making good grades so that he could compete in steer and bronco riding on the intercollegiate level. As a result, when he was ready to retire from the rodeo circuit, he was also ready to teach and he shares this with students in an effort to keep them in the system and inspire them to continue their educations after high school.

There's a comraderie among the kids we take to shows all over

Texas that's special. Wherever we go, we're representing our school and our community and the kids are very much aware of this. They meet kids from all over and make friendships that will last forever, but they stick together as a team and help each other out. I can't over emphasize the importance of pro-



"HAVILAND" CHINA

One of the most popular and most sought after China is the famous "Haviland."

The Haviland China Company was formed in 1840 by David Haviland, a New York China importer. He searched for a pure white, non-porous clay for porceand this led him to Limoges. ce. The natural deposits of this fine clay had already attracted other China manufacturers. The fine hand-painted China that he produced there was translucent and meticulously decorated, with eac piece fired in an individual sagger

It has been estimated that as many as 60,000 China ware patterns were designed. Each piece was marked with one of several back stamps. "H & Co." was used until 1890. A law was passed making it necessary to mark the country of origin and many different marks have been used since that time, including "Haviland, France," "Haviland and Co., Limoges," and "Decorated by Haviland and Co.

In 1892 Theodore Havland left the firm to start his own business. Later logos included "Horse Shoe," "A Shield," and various uses of his initials and name in 1941. this branch moved to the U.S. The wares that are produced here are marked 'Theodore Haviland, N.Y.' or Made in America

The older pieces are rather rare and quite expensive, but the renowned graceful beauty makes if a treasure Maybe you can lind the age of your "Haviand" by some of these descriptive dates and owners of the company at that time


