Dear Mr. Williams:

In checking the State Extension Inventory, we are unable to locate one power syrup mill, which is the property of the State of Texas.

Information concerning the mill is as follows:

- 1. The mill was purchased on Account Number 315-7 Farmer's Short Course from J. D. Tidwell, Nacogdoches, Texas, July 12, 1939, at a cost of \$35.00.
- 2. The account covering we cost of the mill was paid to J. D. Tidwell, Nacognoches, Texas, on Voucher 315-7, Department Number 8856, July 12, 1939, amounting to 435.00.
- 3. There is no record on file in the office authorizing the sale of the mill by the Board of Directors of the A & Maystem of colleges.
- 4. In checking the cash records, there is no evidence that \$35.00 has been turned over to the Treasurer's office for the sale of the Power Syrup Mill.

I have been advised by H. S. Estelle, District Agent, that the Power Sy up Hill in question has been in the custody of the Negro Austin County agricultural Council since 1939, and that you negotiated the transaction for them.

In view of the fact that the Syrup Mill is the property of the State of Texas, it will be necessary that it be returned immediately to be accounted for on the 315 Farmer's Short Course Inventory.







This equipment was paid for by cashier's check with a belonce left over. This purchase was made with the understanding that this equipment was in good shape. However it was found that the engine had been frozen and the head bursted, and an attempt to fix same was made before the purchase was made. This was not found out until the mill was in operation, which caused much loss time. The cost of the repairs and travel to get the mill in operation exceeded the




