
I wish to take this opportunity to express to you my appreciation for the fine way you cooperated and conducted yourself during last week's meeting.

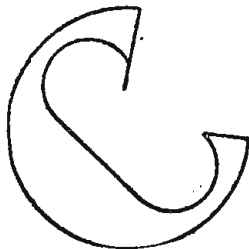
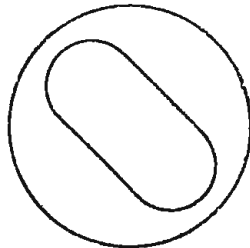


Dear John:

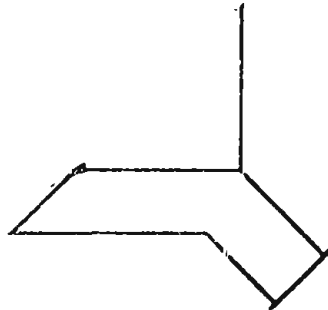
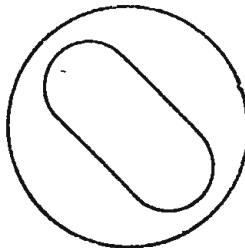
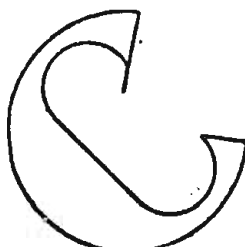
Dear Mr. Mayes:


Referring to our phone conversation of today, am reiterating that I am attempting to enter the United States Army via enlistment as a Voluntary Officer Candidate. In this direction, have been given a verbal O. K. by the local draft board, a phone permission by you, and have had a preliminary physical examination by the designated local doctor upon which am expecting a subsequent report, and have secured the approval of other persons concerned.

However, in order that I be able to leave my accounts in good order, am requesting that you see that what ever steps as are necessary be taken to make available to me my accumulated savings with the Teacher Retirement System. It would seem that this should entail very little effort, as the stipulations provide that an agent may receive his savings upon the condition that he leaves the Extension Service. Am sure this can be done in the right way.

Would like also to be assured that a job with the Service be tentatively open to me after the war. I like Seguin and would like to be stationed here again, if possible, providing of course that care has been exercised by the local agent succeeding me to preserve a wholesome regard for the work here.

It is to be remembered that this letter is conditioned upon the presumption that I am accepted in the army, which, to date, is not the case.
