After the meeting at Prairie View I transmitted the proposed pig program to Mr. Haynes with the recommendation that it be inaugurated, if at all possible. I have received the attached reply from him, which is self-explanatory.

I, of course, regret very much that Sears, Roebuck and Company was not in position to make the expansion that you requested, and I know that it will be a disappointment to a number of your agents. At the same time I recognize the uncertainty of business during this war emergency, and I am sure that Mr. Haynes' decision is a wise one.

I believe the thing we should do is to proceed with the 20 counties we had in the program last year. His letter, I think, gives us the authority to continue with the original 20 counties on the same basis as last year and it may be that when the war is over we can make further expansion.

Hogs in the Pig Chain

Dear Club Boy:

We are planning a pig show for October 31st, at which time you are expected to show your hog or your sow and pigs. It is expected that these animals will be in first class show condition. We expect to pay good prizes for the best animals in the show. I am trying to arrange it so every boy who enters a hog in the show will receive a prize, but every boy must see to it that his hog or hogs are in the show.


There will be three classes of hogs in the show. 1st sows and litters, 2nd boars, and 3rd fat hogs. Gilts that have not been bred before September 1st will be shown as fat hogs.

WARNING-- Do not feed your sow too much rich feed just before or just after she brings pigs. Too much rich feed might cause your sow to have milk fever.

Be sure you are able to handle your hog as that will be considered by the judges in making placements. It might be well for you to come to your county agent for tips on preparing your hog for the show.

Each boy is expected to have a 6'X6' pen to show your hog exhibit in. Be sure to start working on your hog now, so yours might be the best in the show.


We had planned our Fall Pig show for November 7th for at that time most of the pigs coming from sows in our chain will be weaning age, but in an effort to coordinate the pig and poultry show or arrange so both shows can be held on the same day; we have decided to have the joint show on October 31st. As we have it planned now we will show pig, peanuts, potatoes, poultry, sorghum syrup, canned chicken, and three kinds of canned vegetable. The show will be called "Victory Food Show" or Food for Freedom Show.

As it stands now, we expect to show about 100 pigs, 16 sows, 3 boars, and 3 fat hogs. We plan to get the Lockhart Business Men's Club to sponsor the show. The show will be held in the down town section, if it is possible I will use the Foundation Farm tent to house part of the exhibit.

We would like to have you and Dr. Evens be with us on that day. As soon as we complete arrangements for the show I will give you additional information. Please contact Dr. Evens and see if he will be able to come and let me know as soon as possible.

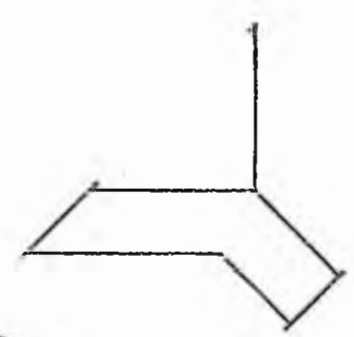


Well, I leave for the United States Army reception center at Dodd Field to be inducted, on Saturday October 31, 1942.


TO COUNTY EXTENSION AGENTS:
