TSU—UNIVERSITY PROFILE

When Dr. Granville M. Sawyer arrived at Texas Southern University in 1968, he stated most emphatically that he "did not come to preside over the demise or dissolution of TSU." Since 1968, TSU has emerged as a model institution of higher learning for urban programming with a student body of over 9,000. Since 1968, TSU has "carved out a mission of moving Blacks, its predominant clientele, more easily and more realistically into the American mainstream." The trek to this plateau was officially launched in 1973 when the Texas Legislature designated Texas Southern University as a "special purpose institution of higher education for urban programming."

Located on a 72 acre site in the heart of the inner city of the fastest growing city in the world, TSU is dedicated to improving the quality of life in the inner city while providing excellent training for its students in programs offered in the University's nine schools and the Weekend College. TSU has emerged, in a period of less than a decade, as the third largest predominantly Black university in America and the largest single pool of minority resources in the Southwest.

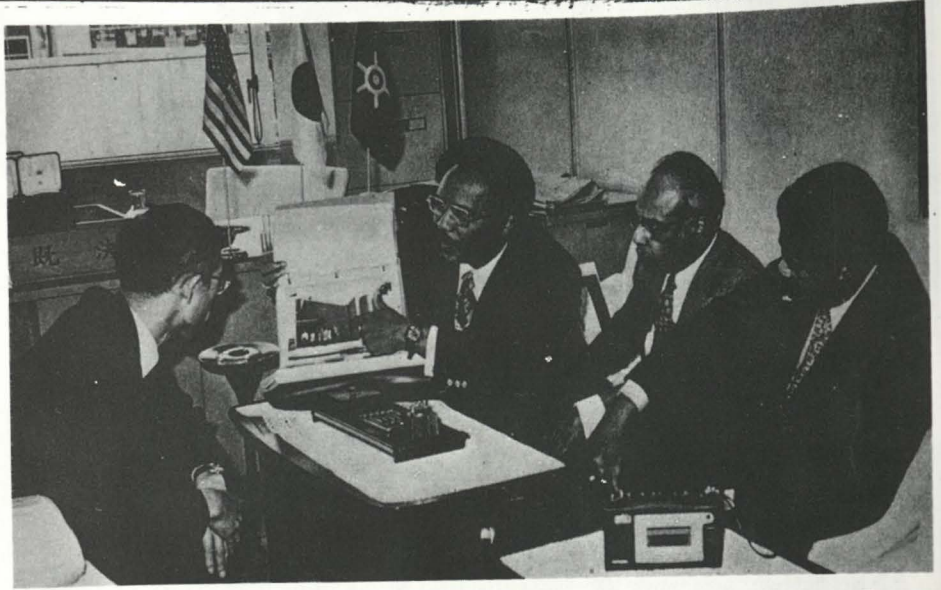


The TSU Student Life Center — the hub of activity at urban university.

TSU—ADMINISTRATION

Texas Southern University, like other state institutions of higher education, is a member of the Texas Colleges and University System. TSU's governing body, the Board of Regents, acts upon recommendations submitted by the officers of general administration and sets policies and rules according to provisions enacted by the Texas legislature.

Presently there are eight members on the Board. Dr. George L. Allen is chairman and also a Dallas County Justice of the Peace. Ernest S. Sterling, a Tyler, Texas banker and businessman is vice-chairman. Other members of the TSU Board of Regents are juris-consult Wells Stewart (Houston); physician and entrepreneur Dr. John B. Coleman (Houston); industrialist Richard Reyes (San Antonio); educator and businessman B. Dubois Brown (San Antonio); city councilman and businessman Judson W. Robinson, Jr. (Houston) and housewife Mrs. Naomi Cox Andrews, active community leader and former Miss TSU (Houston). A doleful event struck the university on June 24, 1976, when Regent

TSU—COACHING STAFF

Defensive coordinator is **James A. Sorey**. A former NFL Buffalo Bills Defensive tackle, he was an assistant coach at TSU before working as an assistant coach and defensive coordinator at Mississippi Valley State University for seven years before returning to TSU this season.

Working with the TSU linebackers this year is **Barry Faulkner**. Barry has coached at the University of Texas at El Paso, Rice University and Cameron University in Oklahoma. He has also coached high school teams in Amarillo and Houston.

Former TSU All American quarterback **Audrey Ford** is the secondary coach. For the past 18 years he has been coaching in La Marque, Texas. Ford was one of the first of six inductees into the TSU Hall of Fame in May of this year.

Offensive coordinator and former TSU quarterback is **Henry Harvey**. Harvey has coached high schools in Willis, Cuero and Ft. Worth, Texas. He will also be responsible for coordinating TSU's pass receiver corps.

Larry Rayes is the offensive line coordinator and has coached in Oklahoma, Kansas and Florida. A former Langston University all-conference performer he was an assistant coach at Florida State University before arriving at TSU.

Lewis Richerson, Jr. is coordinator of the offensive backfield this year and is a former All American and All State quarterback at Waco Moore. He was an assistant coach at University of Wisconsin at River Falls, where he played his college ball.

Albert Qualls, a former scout for the University of Oklahoma, will be working with the defensive ends. Qualls is also a former second team All Big Eight player for OU.

Andrew Rice has completed ten years of professional playing with the Kansas City Chiefs, Houston Oilers and the Cincinnati Bengals. A former All SWAC star of TSU, Rice will be working mainly with the defensive line.

Ron Sterling's professional football career spans the NFL, WFL and the Canadian League. He played college ball at North Texas State University in Denton, Texas. Sterling will assist in the development of the offensive line.

The head athletic trainer for the Tigers is **John Harvey**. Besides working at Prairie View A&M University, Houston Independent, Addine and Austin school districts, Harvey has worked with several professional football teams.
