Going up-n-down our stretch of highway 290 the past few days has proved to be a real test of wisdom and patience. The weathermen on TV and radio have done their best to keep us informed as to the road conditions, but there is no way we can be prepared for the actions of other drivers on icy roads. I'm sure that most of you can relate some interesting, if not frightening, tale about how the slippery driving conditions affected you or someone around you

David the Aggie started south out of College Station last Thursday afternoon, and by the time he had gone just a few miles, he decided he should turn back and forget the trip. Trouble is, he tried to ease off the road into a roadside rest to turn around, and found out that he couldn't use his brakes without losing control of the car, so he just kept easing along. He was surprised when a little red sports car went sailing past him, with no apparent regard for the icy road. He wasn't surprised when, a few miles down the road, he saw the little red car in the ditch. Very predictable outcome.

Friday morning, I drove from Waller to the shop in Hempstead on an almost deserted highway, and the few drivers I observed were all doing the right thing. They were proceeding at a slow and steady pace, avoiding sudden moves, and watching both the road and other vehicles carefully. The wisdom displayed by school officials was obvious. By closing the schools, they prevented their buses from having to get out on the highways and back roads where driving a large yellow bus filled with kids could prove to be a nightmare in a hurry.

As I was getting out of my truck, I heard the whine of spinning tires, and looked up in time to see the red pickup come sailing around the corner onto Austin Street. He wasn't going in excess of the posted speed limit, but it was obvious that he was moving too

Bar-B-Q Team To Compete Feb. 16-17

Waller County people have always bragged about their bar-b-que skills, and now's the time for all braggers to prove themselves, by entering the 1985 Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo cook-off.

For the sixth straight year, Waller County bar-b-que chefs will enter the contest, says Area Go Texan Ambassador Danny Marburger.

"A lot of people around here have their own special ways of barbecuing and I'm hoping most of them will be there to see the competition on the first weekend of activities, Feb. 16 - 17."

To add to the hotly contested competition, Eastern Airlines is sweetening the pot for the winners. Members of the Championship Bar-B-Que team will receive trips for two anywhere on the Eastern Airlines system, with the exception of South American destinations.

Depending on the travel site the winners choose, the value of these trips can be \$4000 - \$5000 for each winner," said John Ruzich, manager of sales and services of Eastern Airlines in Houston. "After all, Eastern Airlines serves some 110 cities on two continents and the winners can choose from Latin America, the Caribbean, Bermuda.

John Warren Jr. Nets "Big Bucks" First Prize

Waller High School sophomore John Warren Jr. has won the \$200 first prize in Lone Star Gun Sales' "Big Buck" contest. The announcement was made last week by gun shop owner Allen Miller.

According to Miller, young Warren bagged a 10-point buck with a 17 and 5/8" spread in Harris County, near his home in Hockley.

More than 100 entered the contest which officially began a half hour before sunrise on Saturday, Nov. 17, 1984, and ended a half hour after sunset on Sunday, Jan. 6, 1985. Miller did the judging, using measurements of main beam, inside spread and number of points, with length of points a consideration.

Warren's buck, which was shot on the morning of the last day of the contest, received 384.625 total points.

The son of Nancy and Johnny

Warren, the 16-year-old winner told The Hotline that he planned to take a portion of the \$200 first prize in cash, "to buy gas." He'll take the rest in hunting supplies and clothing.

Louis Schiel took both second and third prizes of \$100 cash or merchandise and \$50 cash or merchandise respectively. Both of his bucks were shot in South Texas

A special area has been set aside in the Northwest corner of the Astrodome parking lot on Kirby

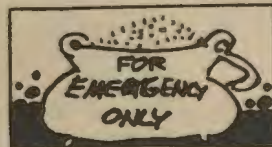

around the 13th of December.
His second place deer was a nine-pointer with a 17 and 1/8" spread, for a total of 355 points.
The third place buck had eight points and a 17 and 3/4" spread, earning him a total of 322 points.
Fourth place of \$25 in cash or merchandise went to Winston Sheffield, who shot his 11-point deer in Waller County on Nov. 23. The buck had a 13 and 3/4" spread and earned 286 750 in total points.

Bill Thompson placed fifth with his eight-pointer with a 19 and 5/8" spread. He received 286 375 total points and \$15 in cash or merchandise for this buck, shot in Waller County on New Year's Eve.
Other local entries who placed well in the contest include Glen Krolczyk, with 211 4375 points, E. W. McSwain, with 249.625 points, Dean Ellis, with 229.1875 points, Ronald Satcher, with 131 25 total points, and James Lloyd, with 231 625 points.
This was the first "Big Buck" contest sponsored by Lone Star Gun Sales, which is located on Hwy. 290 in Waller.

The term pottery does not seem as elaborate and luxurious as the fragile, delicate China to many antique lovers. But, those that study the history and have become collectors of pottery do not agree. In fact, the older, rare items in pottery made by some of the most famous manufacturers are usually treasured highly and bring high prices from these interested collectors.

It pays to know your pottery - one of which was, and still is, the famous "Roseville Pottery."

Roseville Pottery Company was established by George F. Young in Roseville, Ohio. He did not have adequate facilities, so the company moved to Zanesville in 1898. A new building was erected and the most modern equipment available installed.

By the year 1900, Young felt that he was ready to enter into the stiffly competitive art pottery market.

Roseville's first art line was called "Rozane." Rozane featured dark blended backgrounds with slip painted underglaze art work of nature studies, portraits, birds, and animals.

"Azorean" developed in 1902, line on a blue blended background. "Egypto" (1904) featured a molt glaze in a soft shade of old green, modeled after examples of ancient Egyptian pottery. These early lines were followed by many others of highest quality.

Their most famous was "Della Robbia," introduced in 1906, which was decorated with designs of florals, animals, birds, and scenes of Viking warriors and Roman gladiators.

Very limited, but of great importance to collectors today. "Rozane Olympic" (1905) was a red ware decorated with scenes of Greek mythology.

During the second decade of the century, new lines were added regularly, each reflecting the taste of the time. The plant closed 40 years later.

Some of the middle period lines were "Donatello" (1915), "Futura" (1928), "Pine Cone" (1931) and "Blackberry" (1933).

The floral lines of the later years have become highly collectable. Pottery from every era of Roseville production attest to the high quality and artistic merit.

Scarcity is a prime consideration when searching for this quality of art work, which varied from one artist to another. Studies of animals and portraits bring higher prices than the floral designs. Artists' signatures increase the value of any item.

This popular, yet hard to find "Roseville" pottery brings very high prices at auctions. The dealers, as well as collectors, feel like they have found a really rare treasure. This is true and they are ready to pay its value. In doing some recent research on Roseville, I found that 113 different patterns are listed.

Just in case you are interested in buying or selling Roseville pottery, you will not find it just anywhere. It is wise to have a good book on this pottery with a price guide. The prices are astounding.

The most expensive item I found in research was a "Rozane" vase. Ovid shape, 14 inches, bull picture and artist signed, it was \$2750. Now, that is a pretty penny, I would say.

There are many listed in the high hundreds, some less expensive - under one hundred. You Roseville lovers take heed. The piece you let pass may be that good one!

There was plenty yesterday and there is plenty today. Just keep hunting!

Where Was Zadow?

Where was Zadow? From the National Archives there is evidence that the post office at Zadow, Texas was established June 11, 1900. The National Archives gave no site location for Zadow, but does show evidence that the order establishing the office was rescinded October 16, 1900. What is the significance of the name? Where is the location? Who was responsible for establishing the office?

Frederick William Zadow, a Confederate soldier, was mustered out at Hempstead, bought property in the town in 1866 and est-

ablished a successful boot and shoe making business, a bank, and some other enterprises. His wife was Katie Elnor. There were no children from this marriage. Both the Zadows are buried in Hempstead Cemetery. Insofar as is known, these two people were the only ones in the area to bear the name Zadow.

A John F. Latham was the appointed postmaster of Zadow. Latham owned property some ten to twelve miles northwest of Hempstead and along the Brazos River. Was Zadow post office near

his property? Or was it near the Pine Island Road as some have surmised? The Zadow story is based on information in the book, **FORMER POST OFFICES OF WALLER COUNTY**, published by Waller County Historical Society in 1977.

Persons taking the 40-hour course will be instructed in areas of ambulance work including Cardio

Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR), taking vital signs, bandaging, splinting and various other basic life support and emergency medical techniques. Those finishing the course will be tested by the Texas Department of Health for a four-year certification and will be eligible to join their local ambulance service.

Dr. Richard Redfield Answers Questions About

The Eyesight Of Texas

Dear Dr. Redfield,
I have heard a lot about glaucoma and how serious it is.

What can you tell me about glaucoma and how often a person should be checked for it.

Mark Little

Dear Mr. Little,

Glaucoma is a condition of the eye in which the pressure inside the eye rises high enough to result in loss of peripheral or 'side' vision - to the extent of blindness in some cases. In fact, glaucoma, of which there are many forms, is the third major cause of blindness in the U.S. and affects more than one million citizens.

Glaucoma may develop at any age, but it is more prevalent in the elderly, affecting an estimated 1% (or one in a hundred) or more of the population over the age of 60 years. In persons over the age of 40 years, between 0.5% and 1% have the disease, and in infants and children, it is a significant cause of blindness.

Glaucoma is a chronic condition stemming from different causes. The inside of the eyeball is filled with a substance not unlike the consistency of melted jello. The eye continually replaces itself with new fluid and allows for the old to escape through a built-in filter. In glaucoma, for one reason or another, this filter becomes plugged and cannot allow the old fluid to escape, resulting in an increase in pressure within the eyeball.

Many forms of glaucoma often exist with no symptoms. It is like high blood pressure: you may have it and not even know it! However, if glaucoma is detected at an early stage, it can be dealt with successfully, in most cases, with eye drops. If the glaucoma condition is allowed to progress, surgery may be the only alternative.

If you are over 40 years of age, it is of necessity to be examined by your eye care professional for signs of glaucoma once a year. If you hap-

pen to be under 40, a complete visual analysis with a glaucoma evaluation should be done once every other year.

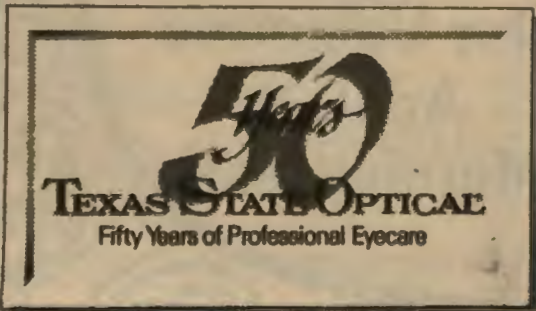

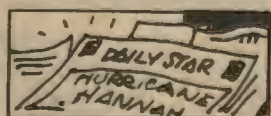

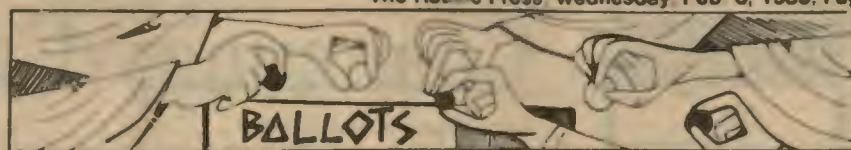

4-H Beef, Sheep, Swine Projects

By Cathy H. Broun
Waller County Extension Agent
4-H members can gain basic skills in animal production and marketing through beef, sheep and swine projects.

These projects offer learning skills and living experiences as well as a host of opportunities for education and exploration, points out Cathy Broun, county 4-H program coordinator with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, the Texas A&M University System

- Specific objectives of programs in beef, sheep and swine are these:
- 1 To learn basic principles of animal science by owning, caring for and keeping records on one or more head of livestock.
 - 2 To demonstrate a knowledge of sound breeding, feeding and management practices.
 - 3 To identify types and grades of animals and fleece and employ efficient marketing methods.
 - 4 To develop integrity, sportsmanship, decision

- making ability and public speaking skills through participation in demonstration, tours, judging and exhibits
- 5 To learn the value of scientific research in its influence upon animals and the meat and fiber industries
 - 6 To identify quality in wholesale and retail cuts of animals and animal products and understand their relationship to management practices
 7. To improve management skills to increase wool production and fiber quality (sheep program)

4-H youth who excel in these programs have an opportunity to capture a host of awards, including scholarships and trips to the National 4-H Congress supported by Clayton W. Williams Jr., the Independent Cattleman's Association of Texas, the Texas Sheep and Goat Raisers' Association, and the Texas Pork Producers.
