

Mr. Regenbrecht is not in the office at this time but I feel sure that he would advise as he has done previously in situations of this nature — that you breed the remainder of the gilts in the program to some suitable boar in the county. A reasonable breeding fee should be determined by you and the owner of the boar, prior to breeding. A reasonable fee should not exceed \$5.00 per gilt.

When all onimals are successfully bred you should submit an invoice in favor of the breeder in the amount covering the number of gilts bred.
