The report of the Committee on Educational Information which was adopted by the conference on the 1944 food production program at College Station, Texas. October 7-9, 1943, was requested by certain agents. I hope it will be useful to all.

> REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON EDUCATIONAL INFORMATION Chairman, Geo, E. Adams, Director, Extension Service

Mhat is to be done:

(a) Dissemination of information concerning 1944 food production needs to the farmers of Texas in such manner and with such effect as to meet 1944 production needs.

What we need for presentation to farmers;
(a) Definite, concise statements of reasons for goals.
(b) Dependable information upon the difficulties which must be met by producers.

Prospects for labor Machinery Feed for livestock Fertilizer Transportation Storage facilities Marketing facilities Seed and Insecticide Price supports and ceiling for war crops

That we are to take to the farmer:

(a) Goals for particular crops, livestock and poultry, as they apply locally

Reasons for the goals. (b)

- (c) Price supports or ceiling for such crops, livestock and livestock products.
- (d) Prospects for labor.
- (e) Feed for livestock.
- (f) Machinery and fertilizer.

Suggestions adapted locally on attainment of goals for particular crops:

(a) Conservation practices.

(b) Production efficiencies.

- (c) Conserving and utilizing of farm products to prevent waste and to increase efficiency of production.
- Proper preparation and handling of perishable products for marketing. (d) (e) Efficient use of farm machinery and transportation facilities in local

(f) Groups working together through exchange of labor.

Suggestions for getting information to farmers:

Essential information on the foregoing points should be assembled for distribution to local agricultural workers.

In all cases THIS INFORMATION MUST BE WORDED SIMPLY AND CONCISELY. (b)

(c) This material should be received and used through local adaptations and illustrations by all agency representatives.

(d) Farmer leadership, both men and women, should be used in the presentation of this material to other farmers' families.

- It is the responsibility of agency representatives to acquaint farm leaders with the 1944 production needs, problems, and attainments and to assist them in working out plans for carrying this information to other farmers.
- (f) Agency representatives should assist the farm leaders in carrying this information to farmers in the communities or counties.

Recommendations:

(a) It is recommended that the services of all agencies be employed in the preparation of informational material.

It is recommended that this information be carried to non-farm people in appropriate form.

Arrangements have been made with the OPA for the Food Distribution Administration to issue a maximum of ten ration points of meat, fats, etc., to demonstrators for each authorized food demonstration. This arrangement has been made in view of the need for nutrition education on the use of extenders and alternates, and on the preparation of foods to conserve all the nutrients.

If you experience any difficulty in securing ration points, please notify your district agent of your problems.
