Prairie View has often been referred to as "cultural hill."

This happens because the college has what might be termed as a controlled environment, and a great deal of emphasis is placed upon the personal welfare of the individual student.

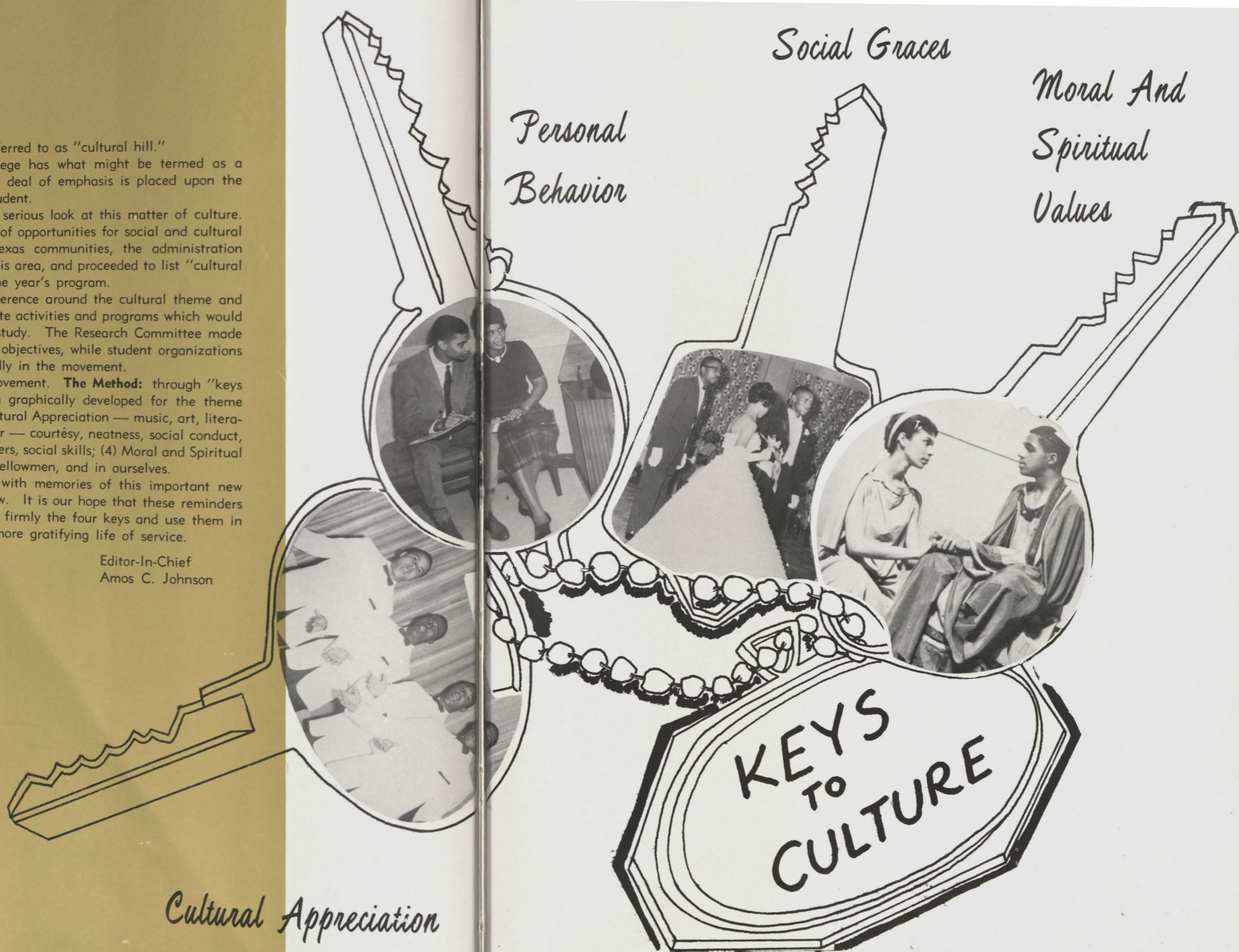
In 1960-61, the college took a serious look at this matter of culture. Viewing with alarm the serious lack of opportunities for social and cultural growth of our young people in Texas communities, the administration decided to step up its emphasis in this area, and proceeded to list "cultural development" as a major goal of the year's program.

The faculty set its annual conference around the cultural theme and established a committee to co-ordinate activities and programs which would be an outgrowth of the conference study. The Research Committee made its annual study to fit in with these objectives, while student organizations and government joined wholeheartedly in the movement.

The goal: Cultural-Social Improvement. **The Method:** through "keys to cultural improvement," as shown graphically developed for the theme of this Yearbook. **The Keys:** (1) Cultural Appreciation — music, art, literature, the dance; (2) Personal Behavior — courtesy, neatness, social conduct, standards; (3) Social Graces — manners, social skills; (4) Moral and Spiritual Values — a belief in God, in our fellowmen, and in ourselves.

Pantherland — 1961 is filled with memories of this important new dimension in our lives at Prairie View. It is our hope that these reminders will always help each of us to grasp firmly the four keys and use them in entering the doors to a richer and more gratifying life of service.

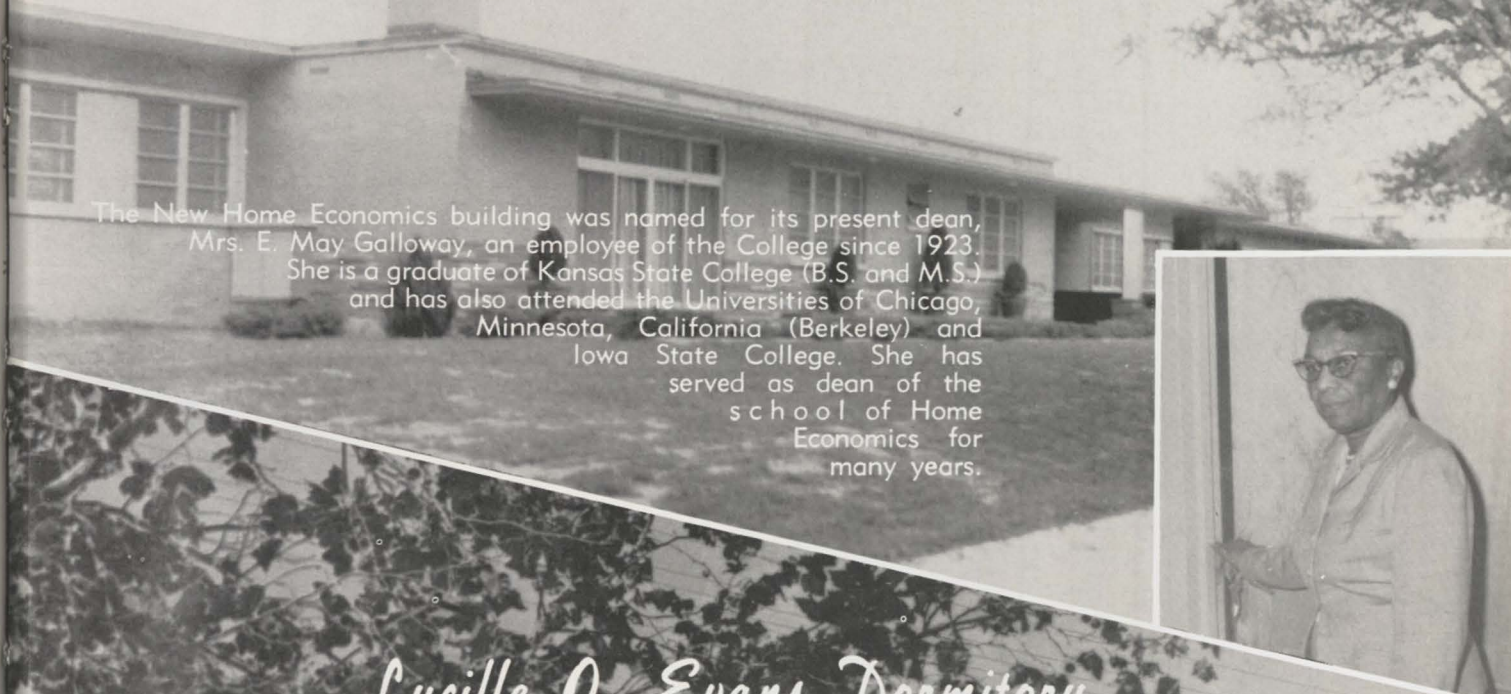
There is a plan far greater than the plan you know;

Elizabeth M. May Home Economics Building

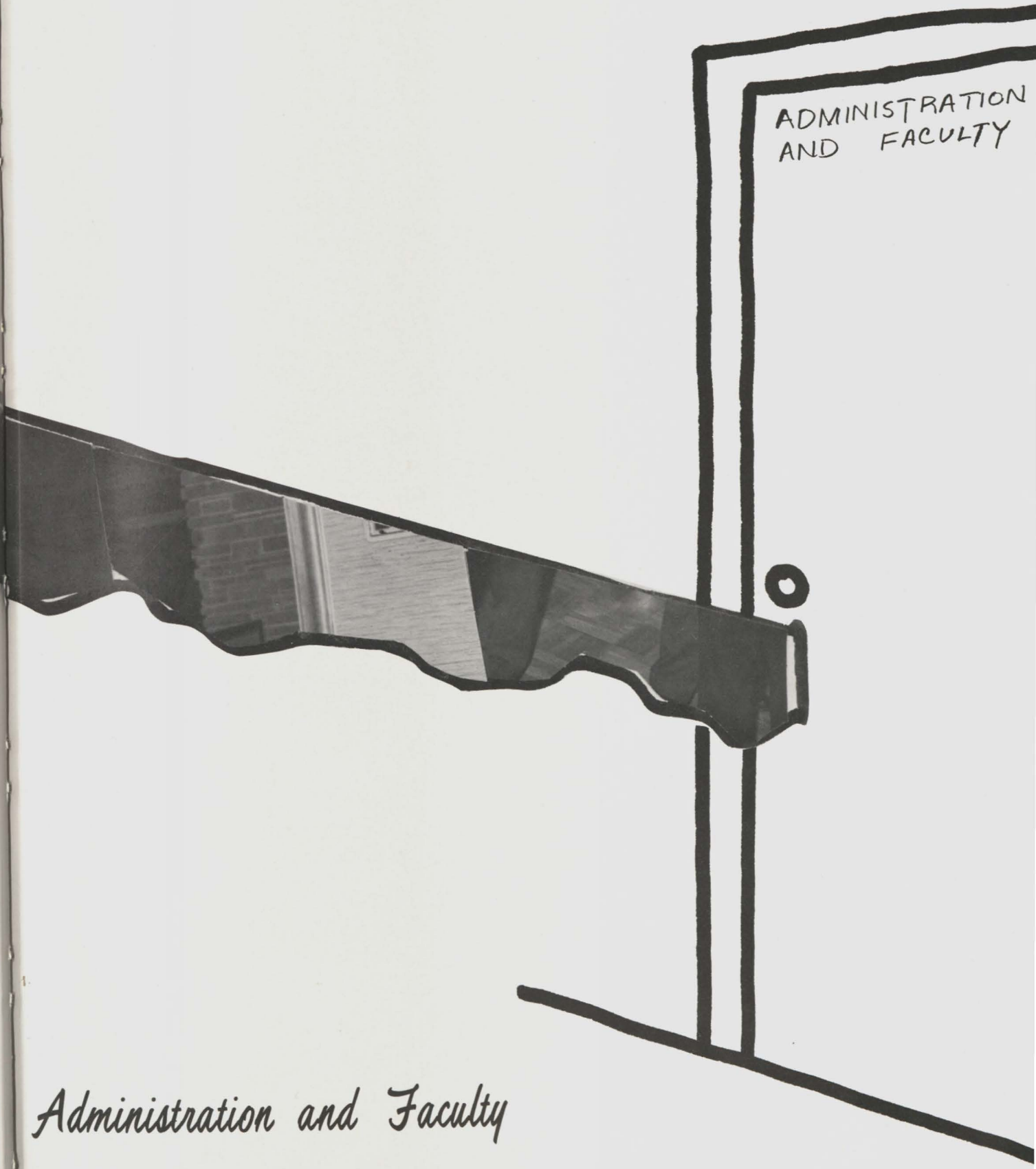

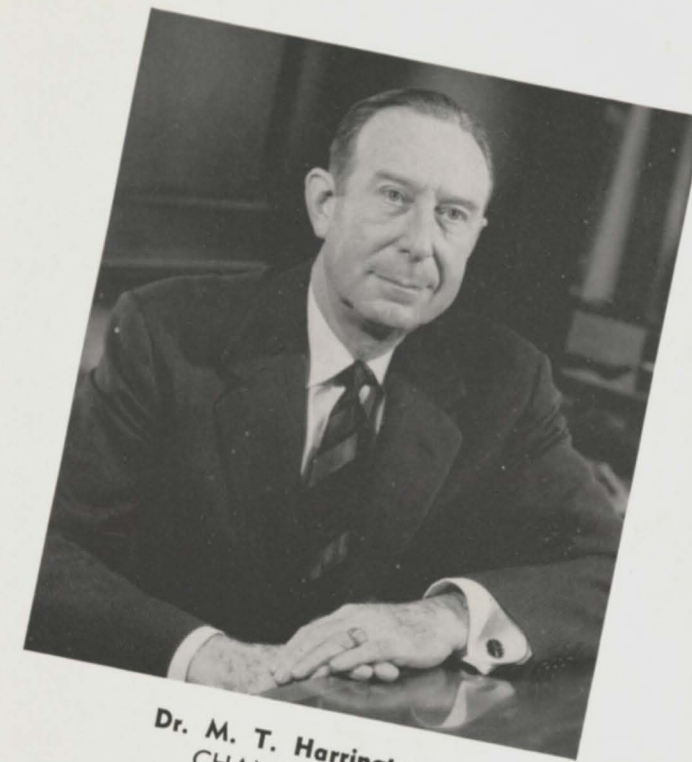

A SALUTE

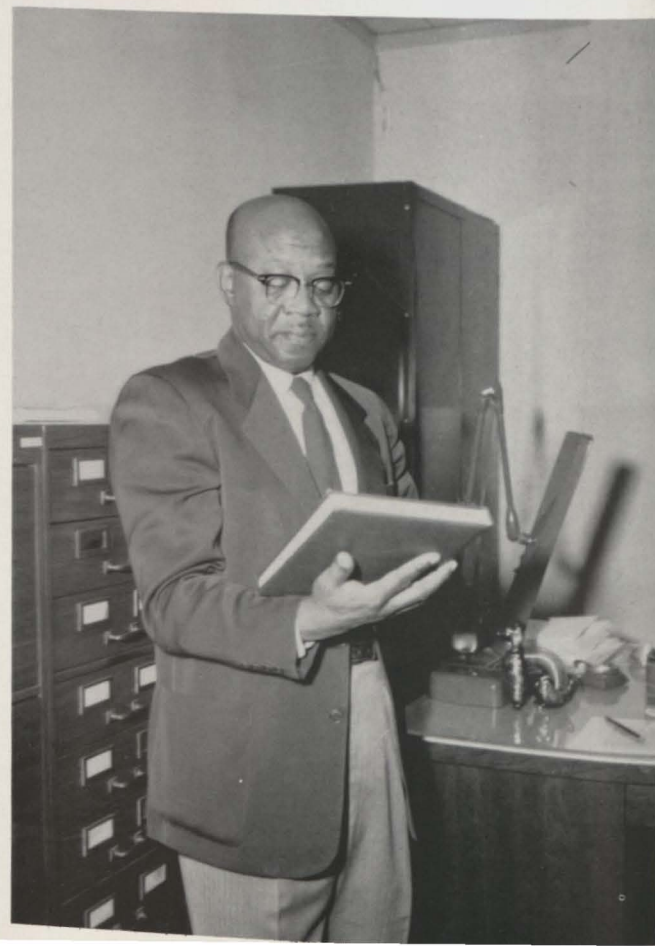

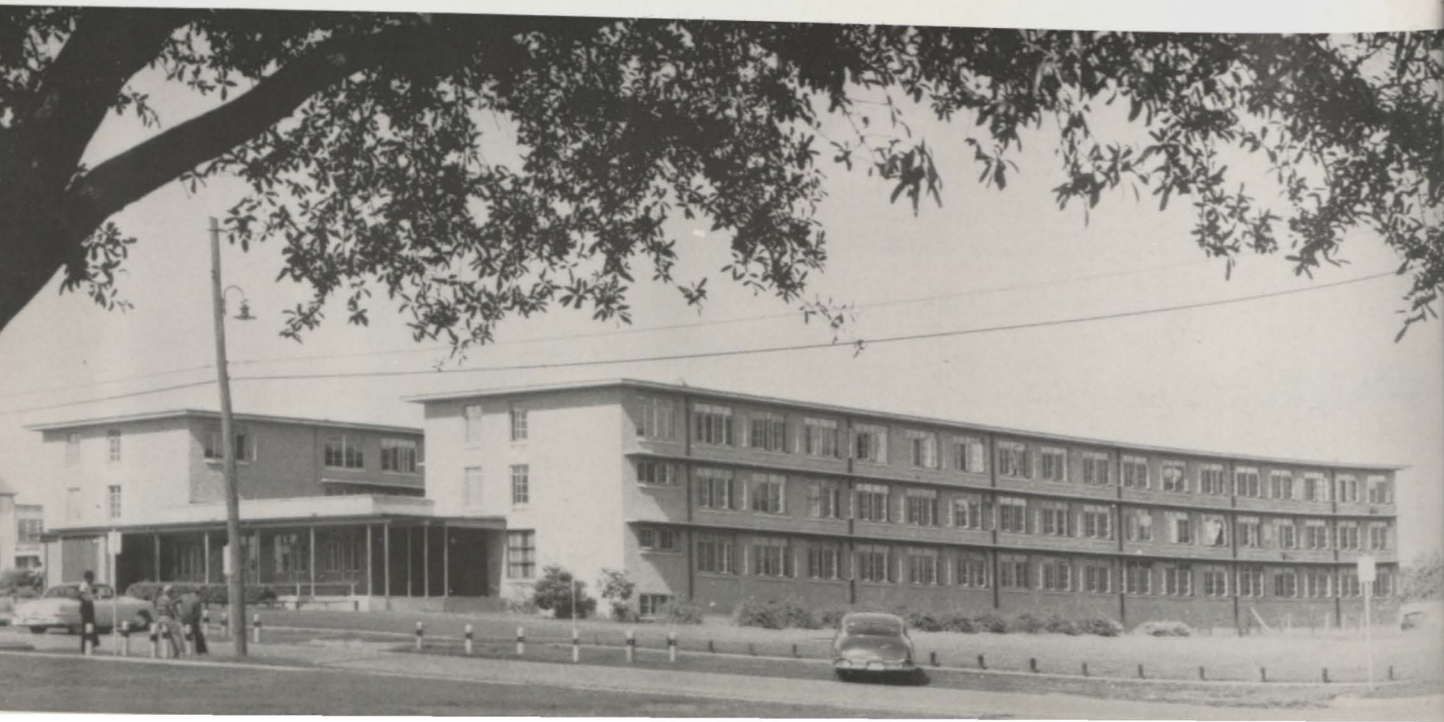
W. R. Banks was asked to come to Prairie View by the officials of the General Education Board and the President and Board of the parent school because of his long experience in school administration and his fitness to execute the program of teacher preparation found to be the first need of Negro education in the South.

The influence of the General Education Board was felt in terms of money for needed college projects and buildings which

included the Dining Hall, the Hospital, dormitories, classroom building, gymnasium, Mechanic Arts building, over sixty cottages for families, and finally the Library building which bears the name of W. R. Banks.

Banks believed that "Prairie View must serve the State of Texas at the points of her greatest needs." He sought to make every Negro citizen in the state his student — to make the Prairie View program the model for the nation.

The Sunday School

The College Sunday School is non-denominational and non-compulsory, which meets each Sunday morning at 9:15. It is a student organization with voluntary faculty participation and supervision. All officers — superintendent, assistant superintendent, secretary, assistant secretary, treasurer, and others — are elected from the student body and by students in attendance. They perform in keeping with the duties of the office to which they are elected.

There are two divisions of the Sunday School: (1) Senior, which is composed of college students and faculty members; (2) Junior, which is composed of campus and community children of kindergarten through senior high school ages. Faculty members serve as teachers of the college classes, whereas housewives supervise and teach in the junior department.

The objectives of the Sunday School are: (1) To give the students a philosophy to live by based upon the principles of Christianity and democracy as exemplified in the life of Christ and other religious leaders; (2) To give the students an opportunity to develop their talents by participating in organizing and conducting different types of duties and programs; (3) As we are non-denominational and freedom of speech and expression are allowed, they become tolerant of different denominations and religious concepts and practices.

We believe that recreation and education should be the responsibility of religious organizations. We have, in the past, sponsored the following: Educational tours to

Mexico, Mardi Gras and other historical points; Religious Dramatic plays have been produced by members of the Sunday School; visiting lecturers; parties and picnics have been a part of the program.

Most recently, we have sponsored campus wide campaigns for cultural development such as, "No Profanity Week," "Club-Day at Sunday School," and others.

In honor of the late J. M. Alexander, a sum of \$25.00 to \$50.00 is awarded each year to the student (s) who contributed most to the welfare and growth of the Sunday School. The person is selected by popular vote of its members.

Mr. Thomas Burton of Hawkins, Texas, a former Prairie View and Sunday School student feels the value of Christian training by way of the Sunday School to be so great that he has given without publicity a cash award to one of our students for the past two years for having had a perfect attendance record. He recently sent a \$10.00 check for an award for perfect attendance for the current year. It will be necessary to use criteria other than attendance due to the large number of persons with a perfect attendance record.

Working with Dr. T. P. Dooley, faculty supervisor, are Mrs. Zelia Coleman, who teaches a sophomore class; Mr. Eric Johnson, who teaches freshman group; Dr. A. A. Dunson has a class of juniors and seniors; Mr. George Sinkler has a class of high school juniors and seniors; and Mr. A. Peters has a group of faculty employees.

(Mathematics) (Club + Colloquium) is at the heart of all Mathematics majors and minors.

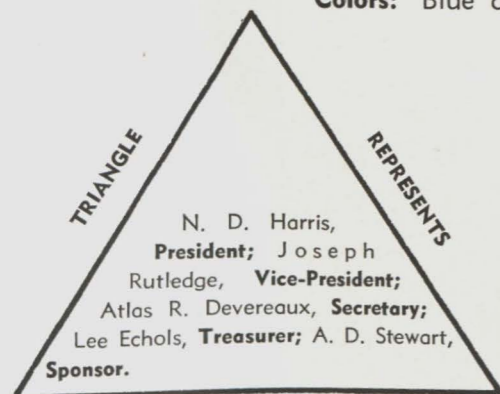
The Mathematics Club is composed of only majors and minors in the Mathematics Department. Each year new students may become members at the Annual Mathematics Freshman Initiation Tea.

Panthers 1960-61 Season In

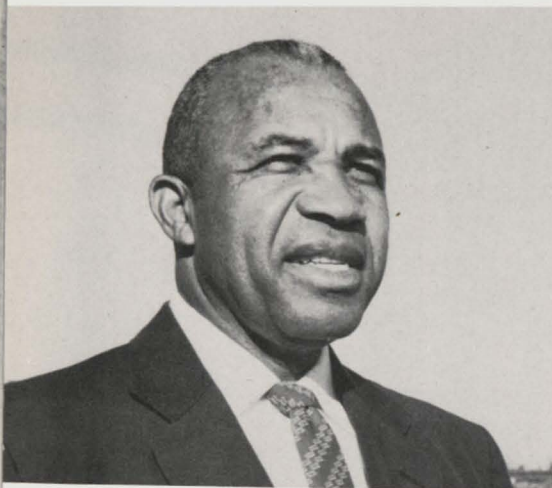
Prairie View's Athletic Department has produced over the years many of the best athletes and teams in the nation.

The story of sports at Prairie View A & M parallels the history of Negro athletics in the great Southwest. President E. B. Evans was one of the founders of the Southwestern Athletic Conference, a league always considered one of the strongest anywhere. His leadership and keen athletic interest has inspired the Panther teams to give their best in each contest.

The year 1929 stands as a landmark in PV athletic history. The great Cotton Bowl Classic, held each year was started at this time as well as the Prairie View Bowl, the second oldest bowl game in the nation. The Panthers had great football teams in those days, as they do now, but track and tennis were also sports in which the college excelled.

In **Football**, the Panthers have won nine (9) conference championships— in 1931, 1933, 1941, 1951, 1953, 1954, 1958, and co-champions in 1960. This year is one of the best for Panther basketball teams. The only other championship for PV was in 1950.

Prairie View has won numerous track and tennis titles throughout our athletic history. Eight SWC conference track titles have been won in recent years — 1948, 49, 50, 51, 53, 56, and 1958. Six (6) singles and six doubles tennis championships have been won since 1947. In Golf's short history among varsity sports in the SWC, PV has won one title — in 1960.

One Of Best In PV History

FOOTBALL — **Head Coach, W. J. "Billy" Nicks** (Morris Brown College). Coach Nicks is regarded everywhere as one of the top football coaches in the nation. His lifetime record is 145 victories, 22 tied and 47 losses. His teams have won three (3) National Championships, and a total of six Conference Championships in his 21 years as head football coach.

BASKETBALL — **Head Coach, Leroy Moore** (Langston University, 1948). Coach Moore has developed the nation's number one small college team in his four years on the staff. He also coached football and basketball at Arkansas State before coming to PV.

BASEBALL — **Head Coach, Eolus Rettig** (Wilberforce University, 1933). Coach Rettig is known best for his defensive coaching in football. His baseball team in 1960 was one of the best in the conference.

GOLF-TENNIS — **Head Coach, Norman Johnson** (Kentucky State, 1941). Coach Johnson's team won the SWC Golf Championship in 1960. Tennis teams have won honors every year for the past ten years.

TRACK — **Head Coach, James Gamble** (Prairie View, 1957). The newest member of the Panther organization, Gamble is one of PV's all-time great track stars. This year's track team is his second.

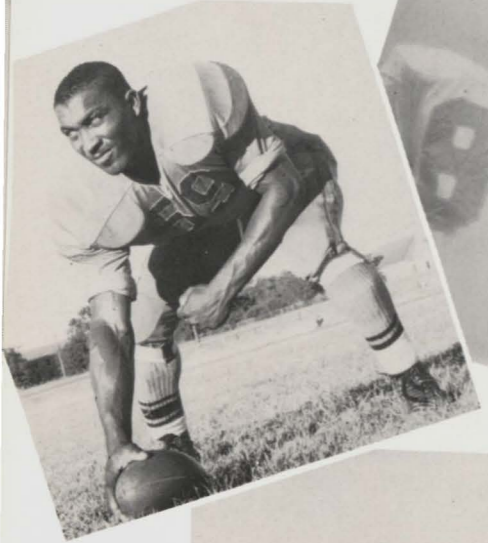
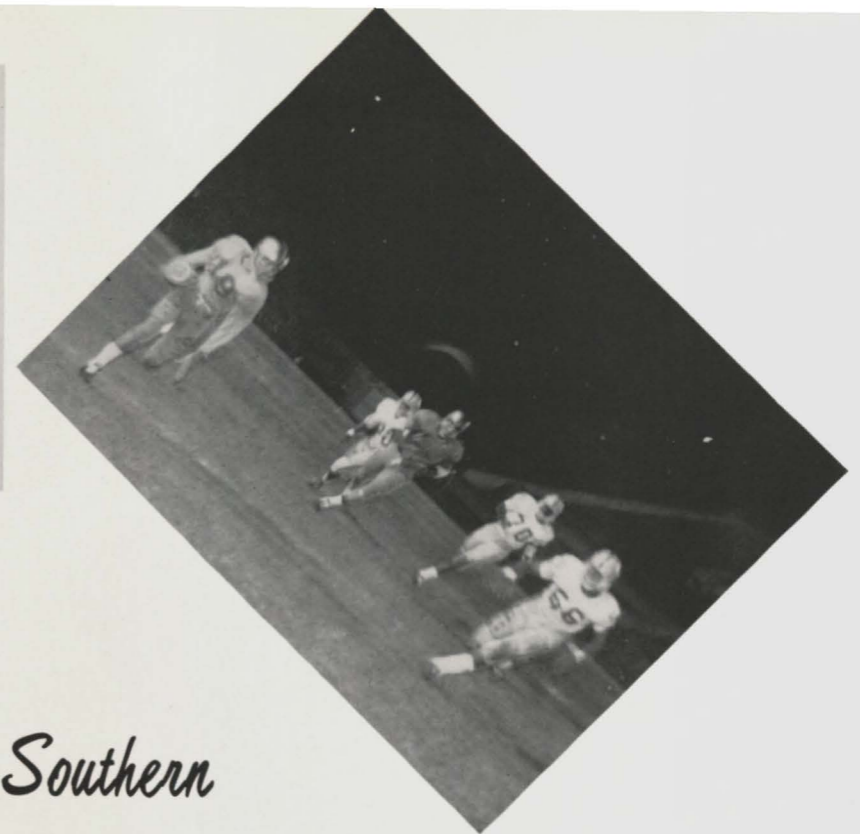
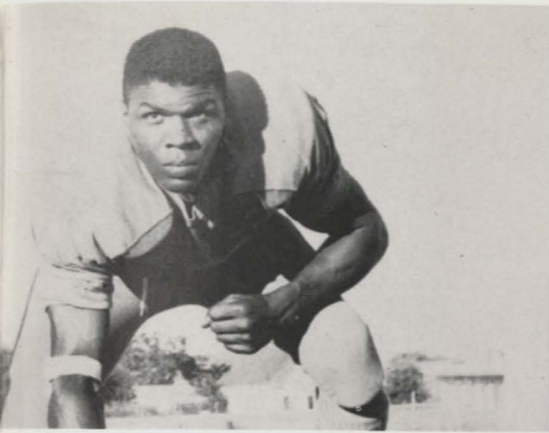
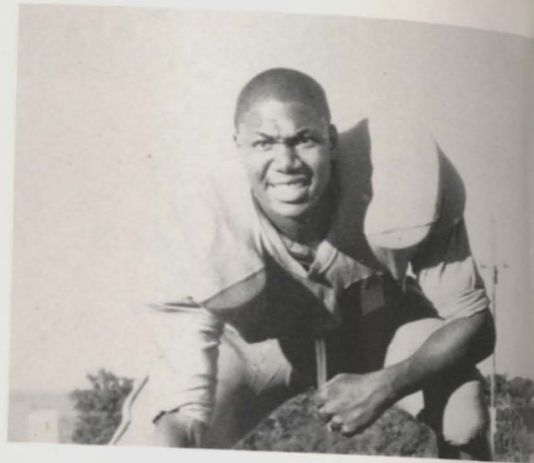
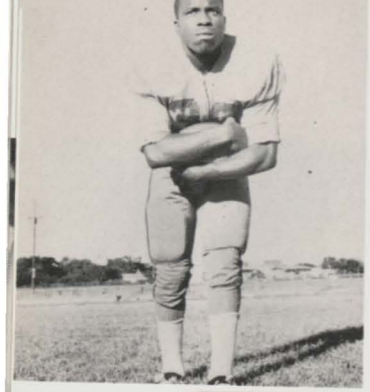
PV, Florida, Grambling Southern In 4-Way Tie

The fighting Panthers defeated Southern University 23-15 on November 26 in a thrilling Southwestern Conference championship battle before 10,000 spectators in Houston's Jeppesen Stadium.

Southern's defeat threw the tight SWC race into a three-way tie with Prairie View, Grambling College and Southern sharing the prize with identical 7-1 records for the season. The victory places Prairie View, with a 9-1 total record, in top position in the National Negro Collegiate gridiron race. Before the big Southwest clash Southern was riding the crest with important victories over powerful Grambling and Florida A. and M. The Panthers had eliminated Tennessee State a week earlier.

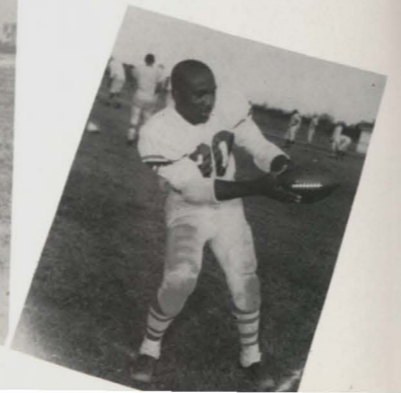
Southwestern Conference fans now view the 1960 national grid race as a four-way deadlock, with Prairie View, Southern, Grambling and Florida sharing the prize equally. All four teams ended the regular season with nine wins against one defeat. Each loss by these teams was to one of the other four. Prairie View lost to Grambling, Florida and Grambling dropped decisions to Southern and finally Prairie View whipped Southern.

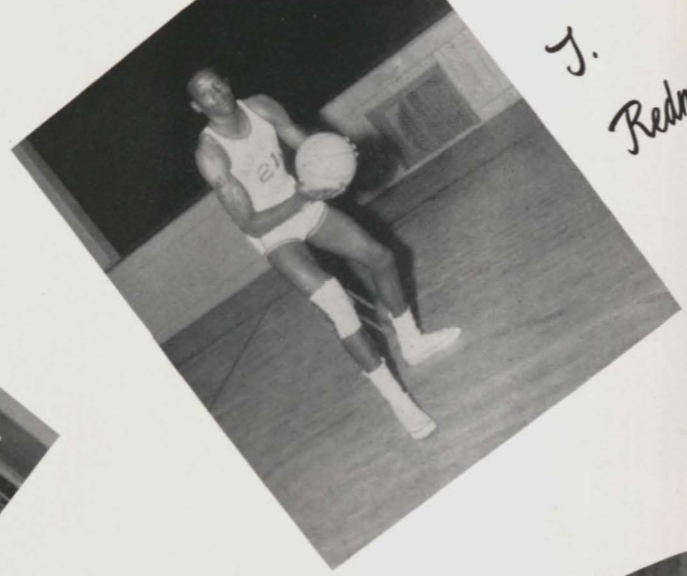

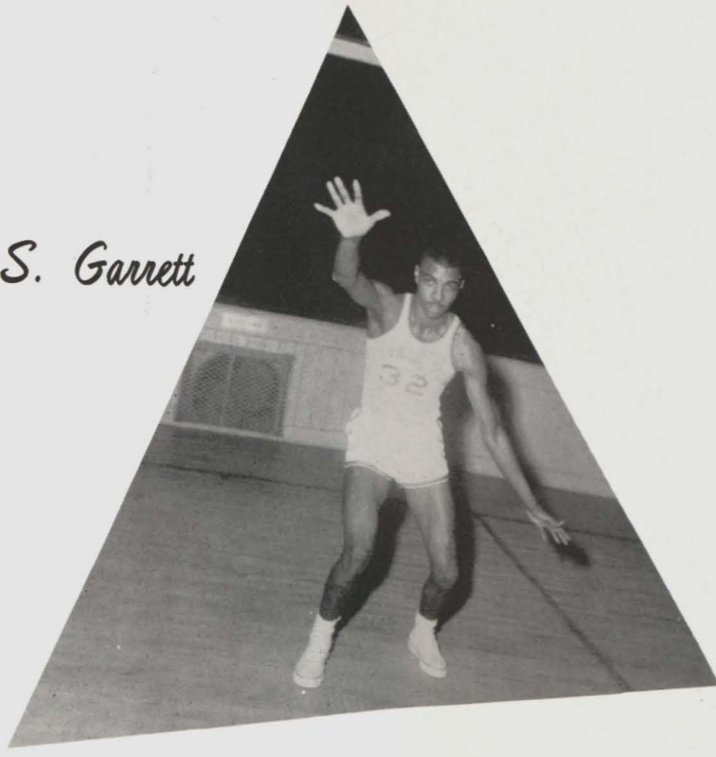

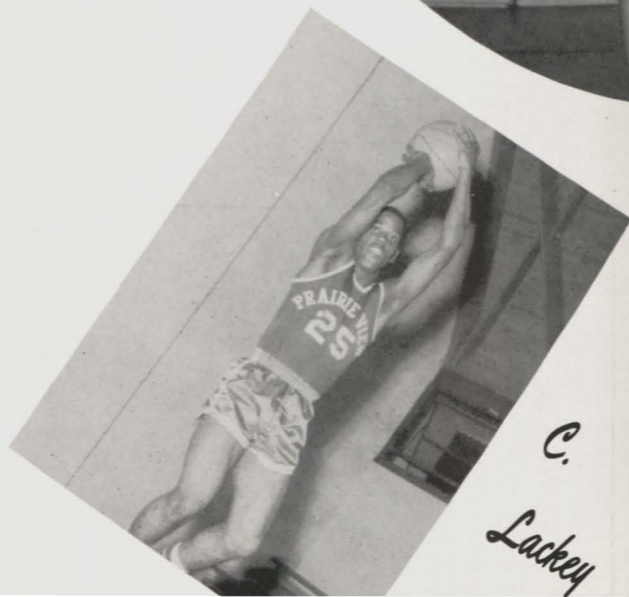

Cagers Win SWC Basketball Title

The nation's front running small college basketball team — Prairie View A. and M., finished their league schedule Monday night at Baton Rouge, whipping Southern University 98-90 for a clear title to the coveted Southwestern Conference cage crown.

Battling in a league of champs, the Panthers, coached by Leroy Moore, needed one victory on their final two-game road trip to cinch their first cage championship since 1950. Breathing down their backs was powerful Grambling of Louisiana, seventh ranked nationally, with only two conference losses. Dropping a 100-98 hair-raiser to Jackson State College Saturday night, the Panthers had to win at Southern Monday to remain on top.

Oddly enough the same situation existed in late November, when Prairie View's gridgers whipped Southern to gain a share of the three-way conference tie and a four-way deadlock in the national football race. Zelmo Beaty, 6 foot 9 center at Prairie View, led the league and the nation in rebounding with a 22.0 average. His scoring average is 24.3. Cornell Lackey, an excellent ball handler, is the Panthers' second high scorer.
