UP-N-DOWN 290 By Marty

When we first moved out here to Waller County, one of the "country" things we wanted to do was to have a beautiful garden. We had been living in the city for many years, and had always bought our vegetables in the supermarket. They were okay, but we envied the folks who could pick their food fresh for each meal, right out of their own garden.

I had bought a small tractor and shredder to tend my pastures with, and it was a simple matter to borrow my neighbor's one-row middle buster plow, select a spot down behind the house, and prepare a garden plot. I was told by all of my friends here to keep it small, so I tried to hold the size down. I ended up with about a half-acre patch, which caused a few smiles from the local folks, who knew how much work a garden can be. I was working in Houston in those days, so had to do most of my gardening on the weekends.

Next, I went down to Honey's and Waller Crop, to look over and buy my seeds. I was pleased to find that a modest investment of about \$5 bought me ten or twelve packets of vegetable seeds, and another \$10 bought plenty of bedding plants at Dlorio's.

Into my garden they went. All the same day. Boy was I proud of that garden. I had all of the rows carefully labeled, so I could watch in the right places for my new growth. All of the rows were neat, straight and clear of weeds, at least at the start.

As the growth came, just as Mother Nature has always promised. The neat rows of small green plants began to appear, right on schedule. However, so did the not so neat crop of weeds. The first several days were spent pinching out the weedlets with thumb and forefinger. Next came the handful of weeds I was getting behind, so a new hoe was purchased and pressed into service. I still couldn't keep up, so I bought one of those one-wheeled cultivators. Now that

Good Sams Plan Benefit

The Trail Blazers Sams Chapter of the Good Sam Club will sponsor a barbeque dinner to benefit Camp Periwinkle, a Texas summer camp established for children suffering from cancer. The dinner will be held on Wednesday, April 3, from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. in the Newman Center, Prairie View. Donations are \$3 per person.

In announcing the benefit, Mrs. Willie Smith, president of the Trail Blazer Sams, said the club had been in touch with Dr. Paul Gerson, president of the Periwinkle Foundation, who wrote to the club to thank them for their interest in helping child cancer victims and to explain how the camp was formed.

The Periwinkle Foundation was created in 1983 in order to provide for the welfare of children with cancer. Most of the members of the group work at Texas Children's Hospital and most of the children served are patients at Texas Children's Hospital.

The primary project of the foundation is the creation and maintenance of Camp Periwinkle, which held its first one week session in

August, 1984. Sixty children attended that first camp and 100 will go to camp the week of Aug. 19 - 25 in 1985.

The Periwinkle Foundation has also arranged outings for the children, such as trips to the circus, the Michael Jackson concert, and plays. Members also sponsored a Christmas party and a camp reunion party for the children.

The foundation staff consists of volunteer doctors, nurses, social workers, child-life specialists and medical students. Any money received by the foundation goes directly to the children. There are no salaries and no expenses.

Dr. Gerson added that any financial help the Good Sams could give would be appreciated, since this summer's camp will cost about

In answer to the letter, members of the Trail Blazer Sams decided to put on a benefit barbeque, with hopes of raising about \$1500 for the children.

The local chapter was organized in February of 1984, according to Mrs. Smith, its founder, when it was joined together with the Inter-

national Family of RV'ers who operate in the United States and in 31 other countries. The Good Sams (Good Samaritans) Organization as a whole, was established in January, 1966 and has a present total membership of 500,000 persons. Mrs. Smith explains that the name was chosen because "each member is required to participate in one or all of several humanitarian projects."

Among the projects Good Sams throughout the world are involved in are "Dogs for the Deaf," a project that raised more than \$70,000 in 1983 and resulted in the placement of 23 dogs for the deaf. The latest addition to the Good Sams program is the purchase of heart machines and defibrillators for use at rallies and meetings.

"Good Sams are fun, educational and spiritually uplifting," Mrs. Smith says. "The opportunities for travel, making new life-long friends and helping people are tremendous. Good Sams are good neighbors in the community and on the road." (see Good Sam's Page 2)

was work. Cultivating a half-acre with a 4-inch blade took some doing.

As spring wore into summer, the vegetables and the weeds stayed tied for first place in the contest, no matter how hard I worked. It seemed as though I spent every daylight hour that I was at home, working in that garden. Some of the romance was quickly going out of my country dream.

I think that the high point of my gardening career came on the Saturday that I went out to my pride and joy and discovered that I had about 20 bushels of green beans, all mature and needing to be picked *that day*. Two thousand radishes and equal quantities of other vegetables were also standing by, impatiently waiting to be taken up

and out of the garden. It all had to be done right now! We picked and we picked until all of the containers we could find were full. We washed, froze, canned, ate, and gave away just as fast as we could, and still we fell behind. I think our neighbors must have been sneaking additional vegetables into my garden at night, just to see if I could cope with all of them at once. I can not remember ever having gotten myself into such a mess before, and I couldn't bear to see any of that food go to waste, so I carried several sacks of my produce in to the Houston office, and left them on peoples' desks before they came in each day.

Finally, the season passed, and I was able to slow down and take stock of my desires as a gardener. If you come by the house this

week, I'll show you my 1985 garden. It consists of four tomato plants, four pepper plants, one small bunch of shallots and a parsley plant, all neatly distributed along Cheri's flower beds. You see, Cheri can't stand to see weeds in her flower beds, and she pulls them out every day. I'm looking very much forward to harvest time this year, when I can go out and pick or ull up one handful of vegetables as needed.

I've finally gotten this gardening thing down to a science, and there's nothing to it. Gardening is fun. Try it, you'll like it!

The Untold Story

The County Judge and the County Commissioners in my opinion have consistently shown us that mismanagement of our tax dollars and favoritism is business as usual at the Courthouse. Now they show us their callous disregard for the health and safety of our community.

Not only have they allowed a life-threatening situation (the closing of the Waller County Hospital) to develop, they are apparently making absolutely no effort to provide the most meager emergency facility.

Memorial probably didn't manage the hospital as well as it should have and the new people did back out on short notice but why didn't the Commissioners have a backup?

Part of the problem was that the Judge and the Commissioners didn't take the time to personally involve themselves. But let's look closer.

The existing Commissioners Court hasn't shown any real interest in medical opportunity in Waller County for years. Just last year they let the ambulance services lapse into a

crisis.

Why don't they care about the Hospital that Commissioner Zach's own son was taken to after being injured in a Hempstead football game?

In my opinion the callousness toward the medical facilities is due to a perception that it is a Welfare Cadillac.

All communities have some indigents that need care and it is our

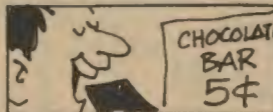
responsibility to determine ways to deal with this situation, the best of which is jobs but, the Waller County Hospital served a broad slice of our society and in times of emergencies everyone.

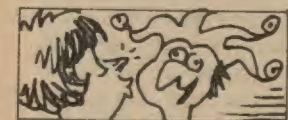

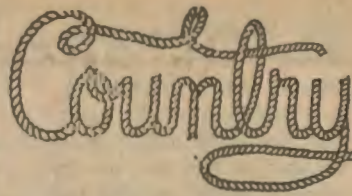

The Eyesight Of Texas

Dear Dr. Redfield,
Does vision change with age?
May Hopkins

Dear Ms. Hopkins,
Yes, it does but not always for the worse. For example, infants see mostly light and dark but toddlers should be well on the way to developing all their vision skills. This is something that can be checked with an optometric examination by age three.

Nearsightedness usually develops during the school and teenage years. In our forties, our eyes begin to lose their ability to focus, making reading and other close work difficult without reading glasses or bifocals. This condition is called presbyopia.

After 55, eye diseases like glaucoma are more common and a

good number of us get cataracts. Sometimes cataracts bring a temporary "second sight," letting us get by without glasses for a time. But any change in vision, even if it's for the better, means something and should be evaluated by your doctor of optometry.

Symposium For Beef Producers April 12th

The first and, we hope, an annual Beef Cattle Symposium will be held on April 12, at Bear Creek Park, two miles south of Hwy. 290 on Hwy. 6, says David McGrogor, Waller County extension agent, agriculture, with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, Texas A & M University. Bear Creek Park is now known as the Houston Farm & Ranch Center. Registration fee is \$10 and participants begin to register at 8:30 a.m. This symposium is sponsored by Waller, Harris, Galveston, Liberty, Chambers and Harden Counties.

This symposium will include the following topics: Integrated Livestock Management. This is a long-term program for Gulf Coast Beef producers to help identify and solve problems in beef cattle production. Value of Progeny and Performance Testing the importance of records on production will be discussed and the application of these records to management decisions. Marketing Tips will include ways to increase income through management practices implemented before and at marketing time. Live animals will be shown and discussed. Whole herd management - the concept of increasing production through implementation of several economic management practices will be discussed along with results of whole herd management demonstration.

Also being discussed during this symposium will be breeds and size of cows. This section of the program will place emphasis on characteristics of different breeds of cattle and how these characters affect production level of these breeds in the Gulf Coast area. Live animals will be used in the discussion. Hay Ammoniation - the process will be demonstrated and the value of this technique will be discussed. Last, but not least, the value of high quality hay. Management practices ruled in producing high quality hay will be covered as well as a discussion on the effect of hay quality on animal performance.

Fire Ants On The Prowl

If you have walked across your lawn lately, then you probably have noticed that fire ants are beginning to forage, says David McGrogor, county extension agent. As fire ant foraging increases, problems with controlling these ants increases, therefore, it is best to control the ants early when they first begin to forage, McGrogor says.

Many homeowners are calling and asking whether or not the cold weather has killed most of the ants off. To answer their question and others, the ants are doing fine. The cold weather drives them farther into the ground where the soil is warm. Since the weather conditions seem to be getting warmer, the ants are coming out to the surface and moving around. When the ants are disturbed, they sting, leaving painful, permanent markings on the body. They sometimes can cause death.

Right now the best product on the market to control fire ants is AMDRO. AMDRO has been proven by researchers and demonstrations conducted in the Waller County area. Cook's Corner

SAY "PEANUTS, PLEASE..." FOR COMFORT AND WARMTH

Peanut butter is a childhood favorite but it would be a pity to let children have all the fun! The versatility of peanut butter coupled with its universal appeal make it a wonderful base for a variety of grown-up treats.

Here are three ideas for soothing the soul and pleasing the adult palate: a hearty vegetable soup, a sinfully rich popcorn, and a very adult soufflé.

PEANUT VEGETABLE SOUP

- 1/4 cup butter
- 1/2 cup julienne carrots
- 1/2 cup julienne zucchini
- 1/2 cup julienne red or green pepper
- 1/2 cup shredded red cabbage
- 1/2 cup chopped onion
- 3 tablespoons flour
- 5 cups chicken broth
- 1 cup creamy peanut butter
- 1 cup light cream or milk
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- Chopped salted peanuts

In a large saucepan or dutch oven, melt butter. Add carrots, zucchini, red pepper, cabbage and onion; saute 3 minutes. Add flour and stir until smooth. Gradually stir in chicken broth; bring to a boil. Stir in peanut butter; reduce heat and simmer 15 minutes. Remove from heat. Stir in cream, salt and pepper. Garnish with chopped peanuts. Makes 8-10 servings.

PEANUT BUTTER POPCORN

- 2 tablespoons vegetable oil
- 1/2 cup unpopped corn
- 3 tablespoons butter or margarine



Creamy Peanut Vegetable Soup, a meal in itself, features ingredients like peanuts and peanut butter, carrots, zucchini and cabbage.

- 4 tablespoons honey
- 1/2 cup creamy peanut butter

Pop the corn in oil according to package directions; transfer to a large bowl. In a small saucepan, stir butter and honey over medium-low heat until melted. Add peanut butter; stir to blend. Bring to a simmer, remove from heat and pour over popcorn. Stir to coat evenly. Serve warm. Makes 2 1/2 quarts.

SUMPTUOUS SOUFFLE

- 1 tablespoon butter
- 4 tablespoons sugar
- 4 eggs, separated
- 1 tablespoon Cointreau (optional)
- 2 tablespoons water
- 3 tablespoons creamy peanut butter
- 1/8 teaspoon cream of tartar

Grease a 1 1/2 quart soufflé dish. Sprinkle bottom and sides of dish with 1 tablespoon sugar.

Combine egg yolks, Cointreau, water and 2 tablespoons sugar in top of double boiler. Beat constantly over hot, not boiling water, until mixture is thick and forms like a ribbon. Remove from heat; continue beating until cooled slightly. Beat in 3 tablespoons peanut butter until smooth, beat egg whites with cream of tartar and remaining 1 teaspoon sugar until stiff but not dry. Fold whites into yolk mixture. Spoon into prepared soufflé dish. Bake in a 350 F. oven for 25 minutes. Meanwhile, prepare chocolate sauce. Serve at once with sauce. Makes 6 servings.

CHOCOLATE SAUCE

- 8 oz. chocolate chips
- 2 tablespoons hot water
- 3 tablespoons rum
- 4 tablespoons half and half

Mix all ingredients together in a sauce pan or double boiler and stir over very low heat until melted. If too thick, add more hot water.

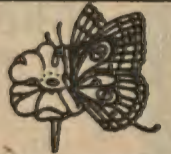

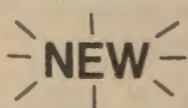

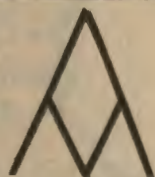

Council Studies Sewer Plant Improvements

Dr. Herman Clay Jr. from the engineering firm of O'Malley and engineering firm of O'Malley and Clay, attended the March 11 meeting of the Waller City Council, to discuss and open bids on improvements to the city sewer plant. Dr. Clay will take the bids back to check for accuracy and then the council will meet later to award the contract.

The council also discussed the sewer leak survey, which was recently completed. After maps are made up, the city will advertise for bids to repair the leaks.

Mayor Danny Marburger gave each council member a copy of a report and corresponding maps prepared by O'Malley and Clay on the gas lines located on the campus of Prairie View A&M. He asked them to study these in order to consider the proposal to the college to buy these lines. The mayor advised the council that he and the representatives from 9-1-1 will meet on Thursday to discuss the building needed to house this equipment.

Council members were also given a copy of a report from the Texas Municipal Retirement System con-

cerning a retirement system for the city. He asked them to study this and it will be discussed again at the next council meeting.

In other business, the council gave its approval to the recently revised by-laws of the Waller Volunteer Fire Department. They also discussed ordinances banning the sale and discharge of fireworks within the city limits. The city attorney has been instructed to draw up an ordinance banning the sale and discharge of all fireworks.

Allen Mayberry from Houston Lighting and Power presented a map and gave a brief talk on what growth is occurring between Houston and Waller. The council also approved the hiring of Glenn Cullins as a new officer with the Waller Police Department. Cullins will be sworn in April 1.

Tim Phelan, president of the Waller Chamber of Commerce, presented the city with a check for \$2000 from the chamber, to purchase park equipment. The chamber had raised the money to buy the equipment, and since the city has taken over the park, the chamber voted to give the money to the city for the purchase.
