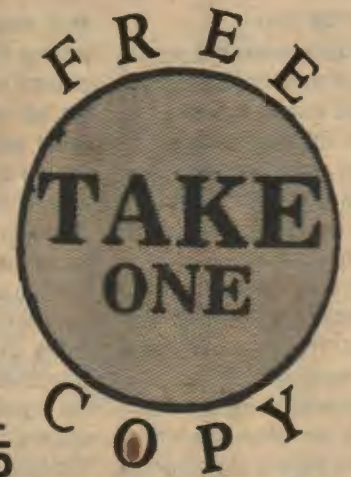

UP-N-DOWN 290 By Marty

About a hundred years ago, when I was a boy, one of my fondest memories is of my Grandpa taking us kids for a ride in his 1938 Chevrolet Sedan on Sunday afternoons. We would go out in the country, down beautiful back roads, and sometimes end up at Uncle Harry's farm by the river.

On the way home, we'd often stop at Schmick's Dairy farm and Store, where we would each be treated to a double-dip of any flavor ice cream cone we wanted. They had a wonderful choice of flavors in those days: vanilla, chocolate or strawberry. That was really the good life, even if it did set Grandpa back 5 cents a dip, and it was well worth the expense.

However, I remember on part of those trips that used to make me real nervous. Grandpa never did drive very fast, even during the week, and on Sunday, his day off, he liked to enjoy the scenery along his route, and the only way he could do that was to go slowly.

All roads in those days, even the main highways, were two-lanes, often with one-lane bridges, and we had lots of curves and corners to negotiate, not mention the small towns every few miles. Cars and trucks used to pile up behind Grandpa for a fearsome distance, and we kids liked to try and count them as we went around the curves, always watching for a new world's record. Several were set during those Sunday rides. When the small open gaps appeared from time to time in the oncoming traffic, the tailgaters would make their move to pass us, often just barely squeaking back into line in time to incur the honking wrath of an oncoming car. Grandpa never seemed to notice this dangerous situation unless there was a close-call, at which time he'd take his pipe out of his mouth and mutter "damned fool!"

Things would really get hairy when someone else's grandpa would work his way up the line until he was behind us, and would settle in at our speed so he could enjoy the

Five Candidates Running For City Council



Herbert Johnson

Herbert Johnson has served on the Hempstead City Council since 1981 and is proud of his record in helping the city to achieve some of its major goals during this period.

He was instrumental in organizing the first police department and the Industrial Development Corporation, created to lure industry to Hempstead. As vice principal of Hempstead High School, he is director of federal programs for the district and has brought his knowledge of grant procurement to the council, helping considerably in gaining the \$600,000 Community Development Grant which was approved and will eventually provide

sewer systems to the residents of Baptist Hill and the Southwest part of town. He was also instrumental in applying for and getting approval of a 1982 CD grant of an additional \$300,000 for sewer service to residents in the Cemetery Road area and North to and including the Annis Subdivision.

Of his bid for re-election, Johnson points out that there are many projects begun which he would like to see to completion during the next two years.

Bobby Repka, a long-time Hempstead businessman and owner of Repka's Hardware, has already served two years on the City Council

and is seeking re-election "to get back on the water tower issue." He feels that much has been accomplished during his tenure on the council, but much is left to be done. Pointing out that "money is always a problem - we're always either rebuilding or remodeling, which takes money that could be put to good use."

Repka sees the challenges before the council as the completion of the sewer system and the water tower, the bond issue for which was voted down. In the meantime, he says, the city has the land, the water supply diminishes and insurance rates go up.

James Woodley is a doctor of veterinary medicine, with clinics in both Hempstead and Waller who seeks re-election because, as he notes, "I care about the community." Woodley adds that he could probably find more financially profitable ways to spend what spare time is available from his busy practice, but adds that he could probably find no more rewarding work.

"I'd like to see the town grow - I think we all would, but it has to be run in a business-like fashion, with the taxpayers getting their money's

worth."

A proponent of "small, efficient government," Woodley is proud of his work on the council to date, including the development of the city's first full-time professional police department. As a councilman, Woodley was also instrumental in securing the first certified city audit and helped institute several cost control and money-saving methods within city government.

Admitting that "money has always been a big problem" when the city council seeks to make

Whichever lane I'm in, I hope I'll have the good fortune to see you, up-n-down the road.

Antiques, Yesterday And Today

Tips for recognizing glass types and styles and reproductions.

Art Glass - Look for free-blown or mold-blown glass with subtle color shading and enameled decoration.

Agata - This glassware is opaque pink shading to white, often in a mottled blackish finish that resembles stain (no reproduction).

Albertine Has an enameled ivory, pink, or blue background with enameled decorations (no reproductions).

Amberina - Transparent red shading to amber. Glass made after 1917 will have an acid-etched Libby trademark. There are reproductions, they have harsher or paler colors.

Burmese - Opaque salmon-pink shading to yellow. Reproductions marked Fenton.

Crown Milano - Has an enameled ivory or beige background (no reproductions).

Frances Ware - Frosted colorless with amber decoration (no reproduction).

Peachblow - Opaque yellow shading to red on outside and opaque white on inside (no reproduction).

Pomona - Frosted and transparent with etched patterns and stained yellow rim (no reproduction).

Art Nouveau Glass

Free blown or mold blown glass in iridescent colors and unusual shapes, sometimes opaque and transparent are combined. Among the best known American Art Nouveau glass makers are Tiffany, Stuben and Durand.

Aurens - Iridescent blue or gold and usually signed Aurene near the pontil mark, or Stuben with Fleur-de-lis. There are reproductions, they show unusually large Stuben.

Carnival - Pressed glass in opaque iridescent colors, such as orange-amber-green-dark

blue-purple-or red. Most reproductions made in the 1950s have an impressed 10 for Imperial Glass or F for Fenton Art Glass. A smooth area on the base may indicate that the trademark was ground off. This 1950s type is now very collectable.

Cut Glass - Look for a polished pontil mark or a cut design, such as a sunburst or hobstar, beneath the foot or base. Simple designs with only a few motifs in a repeat pattern are typical mid-19th century.

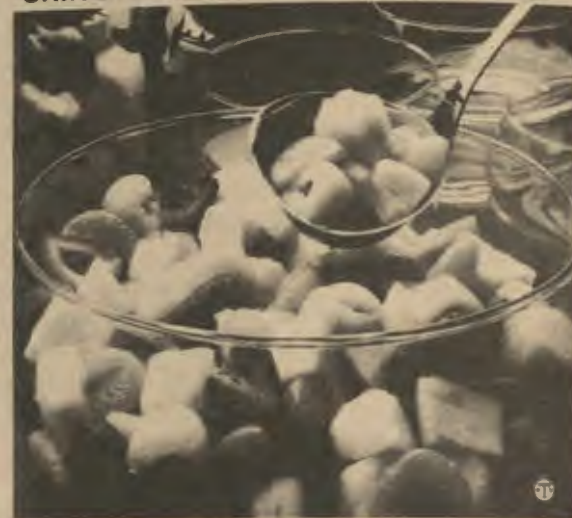



Bits and Biting Clinics at A&M May 3

Clinics on bits and biting and on the reining horse will highlight the annual Horse Short Course at Texas A&M University, May 3 - 5.

The short course will also feature a Central Texas Select Quarter Horse Sale, a meeting of the Texas Reining Horse Association, and national Reining Horse Association Added Money Reinings.

The annual short course is being conducted by the Extension Service in cooperation with Texas A&M's Department of Animal Science.

The opening session at 1 p.m. the first day will include discussions on pastures for horses, services of the Large Animal Clinic of Texas A&M's College of Veterinary Medicine, and the business component of a horse operation, and the bits and biting clinic.

Greg Damall, professional custom bit maker from Big Sandy, will discuss various type of bits at the clinic and the bridling process. He will demonstrate the influence of various bits on horses' behavior and performance.

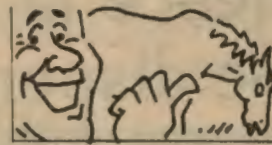
That evening, Doug Mitholl-

The Eyesight Of Texas

Dear Dr. Redfield,
Is farsightedness the opposite of nearsightedness? Can a far-sighted person see clearly at a distance, but not close up?

Sam P.

Dear Sam,

To answer your question in two words: Not Always. However, a further explanation will help you understand what farsightedness actually is.

Farsighted people can see better at a distance than they can close up, but that doesn't necessarily mean that they can see clearly.

With extra effort, mildly farsighted people may be able to adapt enough to get by without glasses, especially if they do not do much close work and have good focusing ability.

Anyone who gets tired or has headaches after doing close work, has aching or burning eyes, or is irrit-

able after a long period of concentration, however, probably needs help.

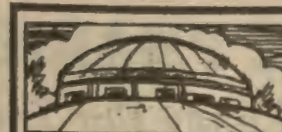
A thorough vision examination is needed for the doctor of optometry to determine whether reading glasses, bifocals, contact lenses or vision therapy is the answer.

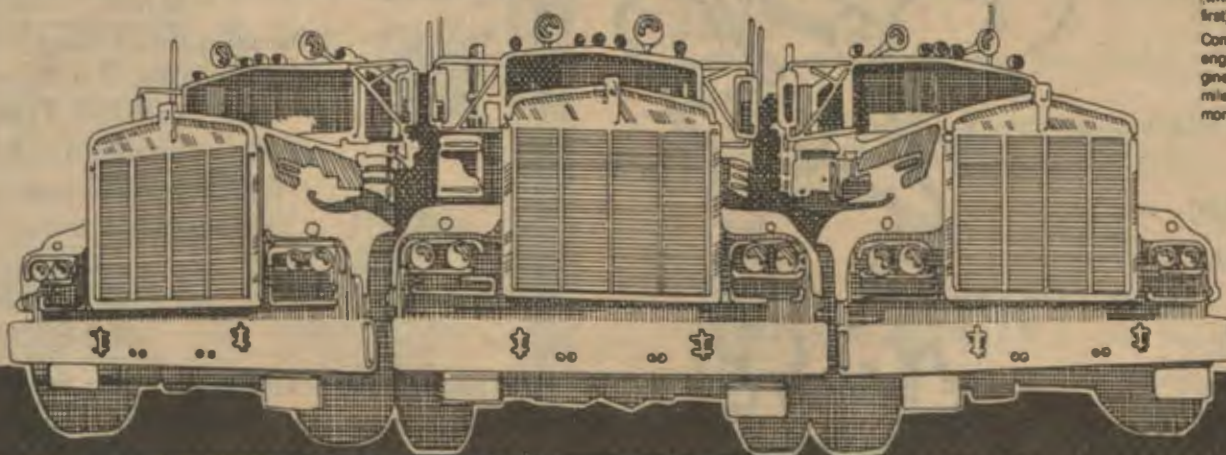

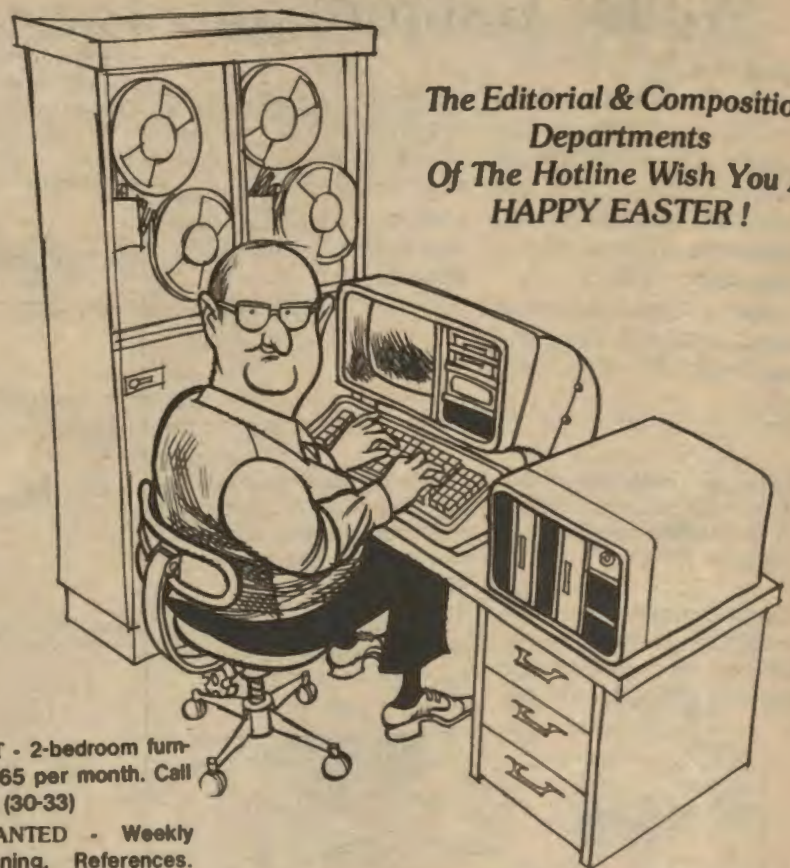

necessary changes, the incumbent adds that he has learned much in the course of his membership in city government. "Sometimes the goals have to be tempered by the funds available and the wishes of your constituents."

"I think we can successfully accomplish our goals without having a hundred people on the payroll."

"I feel that I have to practice what I've preached...Get Involved."

Connie King is former editor of the Waller County News-Citizen who has been attending meetings of the Hempstead City Council, both as a reporter and as interested citizen for some time. King states that she feels the council needs a mediating force, a person who will truly represent the people, rather than spec-

ial interest groups.

"I feel very strongly about self-government and think that the city council needs a representative of the people," King explains. She adds that she has witnessed bickering among the members of the present city council as each member "tries to promote his own cause."

King states that she seeks election in order to ask questions, learn and pass this knowledge on to the voters. I have so many questions," she adds, "and I think this has been misrepresented as disruptive. If anything, I would like to heal the rifts and make intelligent decisions."

King adds that "this is not an election without issues, we do have serious issues to discuss." She invites voters to her home at 906 14th St., upstairs, to ask questions and help her seek answers. She adds, "The only side I'm on is the voter's side."

Lions' Chili Cook-off

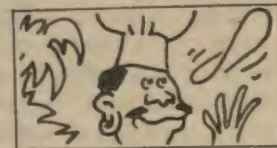

Beef Sale Planned March 30

On March 30 at 2 p.m. at the Grimes County fairgrounds in Navasota, the Grimes County Extension Beef Committee will be holding a Commercial Heifer and All Breed Registered Bull sale. The sale promises to turn into an annual event in this area if David Hustfeld and Rueben Tamez have anything to do with it. And as co-chairmen they have a lot to do. Dr. Hustfeld, and his wife Carol, run the Navasota Veterinary Hospital and David has been raising Brahma cattle for 20 years. Ruben Tamez is a successful Houston businessman who began working with Simmental cattle 7 years ago and has stayed with it ever since. Both are members of the Grimes County Extension Beef Committee and have been appointed co-chairmen for this first important sale. This sale was prompted by a need for local cattle raisers to have a local marketplace in which to sell their livestock. They want to offer this as an alternative to public

auctions which are currently the main marketing source for smaller and local breeders. Ruben Tamez describes the two main objectives of the sale as follows: 1 To provide an outlet for local breeders to sell local animals and allow smaller breeders an opportunity to make buyers aware of the livestock they handle. 2 The youth of the area put a lot of hard work into the animals they buy raise and grow by putting some money back into their ventures and let them support and profit from their work.

Plans to date have over 170 heifers and 30 bulls on consignment. Dr. Hustfeld is confident that the sale will do well and says that it has attracted good buyer prospects. Mr. Tamez adds that profits of the sale will be put back into the community. After the normal expenses of portable pens, workers, clerical personnel, etc., the majority of the profit will be donated to the Grimes County Fair as added premium money for Youth Exhibitors in

the Beef-Heifer division. The are hoping this will encourage the youth by showing that all the time, hard work, and money they devote to their animals is worthwhile. The attraction of more Youth Exhibitors from surrounding counties is also one of their goals.

The Grimes County Extension Beef Committee has put a great deal of effort into making this sale a success for the area breeders. They are dedicated to two of the most important aspects of a community; the well being of local business and the growth and support of area youth. Two such goals can't help but make this sale a successful one. Everyone is urged to support these efforts and be at the Grimes County Fairgrounds at 2 p.m. Saturday March 30 for the Commercial Heifer and All Breed Registered Bull Sale.

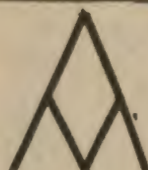

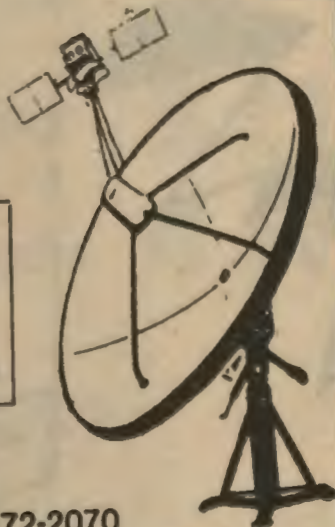

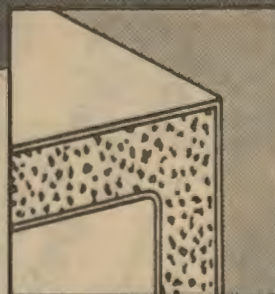

Brilliant-cut patterns of 1880 - 1915 cover almost the entire surface with cut motifs. Many pieces made after about 1895 have an acid-stamped trade mark or signature. In most cases, acid-stamped trademarks are hard to see. Turn the piece slowly to allow the light to show the cut.

Deression Glass - Relatively thin pressed glass with mold lines. Depression glass pieces are in characteristic 20th century shapes, such as uncovered sugar bowls, sandwich servers, handled soup bowls and cups and saucers. Reproductions often use a trademark different from the original. Look for unusual colors. Check the pattern for differences - sketchier des-

igns, sharper ridges, changes in pattern detail.

Chocolate Glass - Opaque light brown on the outside and milky brown on the inside. Reproductions are muddy brown.

Custard Glass - Opaque cream white. Reproductions are bright white and thin.

Holly Amber - Opalescent white and transparent amber. Reproductions are harsh colors.

Milk Glass - Opaque milk white. Some reproductions are marked WG for Westmorland Glass Works, a major source for milk glass reproductions.

There are lots of reproductions. You just have to learn what is and what isn't.
