


Dear Mr. Yancy:

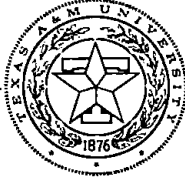


Dear Mr. Yancy:

We the members of District IIAAA would appreciate a clarification of the following cases that were brought up in our district meeting.

1. The high school department (9-12) has been dissolved at Downsville High School, Rt. 9, Waco. The students in the upper four grades are being transferred to another high school in the County. Are these students eligible to participate in interscholastic league activities?
2. A boy attended school for one semester and made his grades. He was sent to Gatesville in February and remained until August. He returned to the first school in September of the following year. Is he eligible to participate in league activities?
3. A boy attended school "A" and withdrew and went to school "B" in a different city during the same school year. He is now enrolled in school "C" of a different city. He did not participate in athletics in school "A" or "B". Is he eligible to participate in league activities at school "C"?
