
Attached are checks for the prize winners in your recent Southern District Show held in Bryan. Also attached is a list of these prize winners by name and county.

GENERAL INFORMATION AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING
EXHIBITS AND AWARDS DURING STATE SHORT COURSE, 1941

Competitive Display

- I. All girls or women contesting in this department must be members of regularly organized Home Demonstration Clubs in Texas conducted under the supervision of Negro county home demonstration agents.
- II. Only one entry in a class may be made by an exhibitor.
- III. A. All canned products must be in standard glass jars.
B. All canned products must be this year's work. (Since August, 1940)
- IV. Labeling: - CANNED PRODUCTS - Use Texas 4-H labels, having name of product, name of exhibitor, name of county and name of club. Place label in center, one fourth of an inch from bottom, on plain side of jar. Labels must be typewritten or printed with India ink. Articles improperly labeled will be penalized.
- V. A. Products will be judged and placed in three classes according to quality. All products scoring above 90 will receive a value of three points each; all between 80 and 90 a value of two points each; and all between 70 and 80 a value of one point each. The county receiving the highest number of points will win first place; the next highest number of points second place and so on.
B. Sweepstakes premiums will be awarded those ten (10) counties receiving the greatest individual recognition.
C. Counties filling the score card (at least one (1) entry in each class) and failing to win a premium will receive \$2.00 per county.

Dear Mr. Williams:


