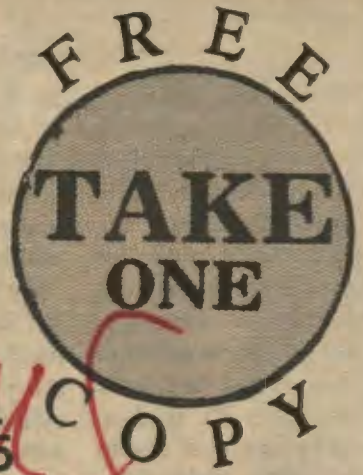

## Extension Service To Reduce Staff

College Station—Faced with a \$4.5 million budget shortfall for the next two years, the Texas Agricultural Extension Service is reducing its statewide staff while continuing to pursue top quality programming.

The shortfall resulted from a \$3.2 million reduction in general revenue appropriations coupled with unfunded salary increases and estimated increases in such operating expenses as utilities and postage.

"With a budget shortfall of this magnitude, we basically had two choices," said Dr. Zerle L. Carpenter, Director of the State Educational Agency that is responsible for agriculture, home economics, community development and 4-H programs.

"We could maintain our present level of staffing and drastically reduce programming, or we could

reduce our staff and direct funds from these positions into high quality educational programs for clientele.

"We chose the latter because we felt the citizens of Texas should not be deprived of quality educational programs," Carpenter emphasized. "Our goal, as always, will continue to be to address the needs if the state's citizenry within the resources allocated."

To continue top quality programs within the constraints of a drastically reduced budget, the Extension Service initiated a Reduction in Force effort on September 1.

"A substantial number of specialist and county agent positions will be eliminated in the near term, with some additional positions to be eliminated by September 1, 1986," Carpenter said. "Ad-

# Bentsen Bill Denies Trade Break To Terrorist States

Washington, D.C. Senator Lloyd Bentsen introduced legislation Monday that would deny to countries that support terrorism special trade privileges reserved for nations friendly to the United States.

The Bentsen bill would effectively double most of the tariffs Iran, Syria and Libya pay on exports to the United States by revoking the Most Favored Nation status of those countries.

"We are all grateful that four men allegedly involved in the hijacking of the Italian cruise ship Achille Lauro have been apprehended and will stand trial for the murder of Leon Klinghofer, an American citizen," Bentsen said in remarks accompanying his legislation.

"It is fair to say, though, that terrorism directed against U.S. citizens and property in the Middle East will not be ended by the successful apprehen-

sion of these men, because much of the terrorism in that war-ravaged part of the world is state-sponsored. Much of it can be attributed to three countries: Iran, Libya and Syria."

"The Iranians, we can say to a moral certainty, were the force behind the bombings of the U.S. Embassy and embassy annex and the U.S. Marine Barracks in Beirut. The Libyans and Colonel Qaddafi have established themselves as supporters of terrorism not just in the Middle East, but here in the United States as well. And the Syrians, despite the help they may have given us during the TWA hijacking last summer, are strong supporters of the PLO."

"Each of these countries has been named by the U.S. Secretary of State as a supporter of international terrorism."

The Bentsen bill would deny trade preferences including Most Favored Nation status, to any country listed by the Secretary of State as a supporter of terrorism.

During the first seven months of this year the three countries affected by the legislation exported goods valued at almost \$280 million to the U.S. The bill would double duties on crude oil from Iran and naphtha from Libya, among other items, and it would triple the tariff on Syrian tobacco.

"By ending the favorable tariff treatment of these terrorist-supporting nations, we will give additional credibility to the action we took last Thursday night in bringing the four PLO hijackers to custody where they can be tried for their crimes," Bentsen said.

"This legislation tells nations that support terrorism: You cannot do so with impunity. You cannot do so and continue to enjoy the trade benefits we give our friends," Senator Bentsen said.

Dr. Richard Redfield Answers Questions About

# The Eyesight Of Texas

Q. Why can't I see as clearly at night as compared to daytime? I do not wear glasses.  
Paula Hughes

A. Many people see very well during the day and do very well on the usual eye chart. However, there may be factors present in your visual system that can cause your visual acuity to worsen under dimmer conditions.

When illumination is lower such as driving at night, some people tend to assume a slightly nearsighted (or myopic) posture. This condition is referred to as "night Myopia". When there is lowered lighting, there may be fewer visual cues for your eyes to naturally focus. In response to this the eyes may overfocus (or overaccommodate) in attempts to see clearer. As a result, instead of making things at night easier to see and clearer, the eyes can make your vision more blurry. Researchers also feel that the bigger your pupils get in the dark, the more we tend to be nearsighted.

To help with this problem,

your optometrist can do special tests to determine what type of optical power may be needed. Usually, the spectacles will end up being low in power and may be used by the patient only at night or under dimly lit situations. This relatively simple solution can offer needed relief to people who do experience night-myopia.

Some people experience a very drastic difference in their ability to see in darker situations. For example, if you have a very difficult time walking around in a dimly lit restaurant, you may be a victim of an eye disease called Retinitis Pigmentosa. Your optometrist can tell if this is your problem by examining the inside of your eyes. Retinitis Pigmentosa is a hereditary

disease that leads to severe vision loss and at this time, has no effective treatment.

PAT kick, and the Hempstead Bobcats went to the showers with a comfortable 20 to 0 game under their belts.

Mark Contreras (sorry for calling him Mike last week) did an outstanding job on punting during the game. He booted two punts which accounted for 98 yards of field position, the longest being a 51 yard bullseye that rolled out of bounds at the Falcon 2 yard line. It doesn't get any better than that!

Regardless of what the Royal Falcons tried by way of ground gaining, their efforts were dashed by the stunning Bobcat defense, which played with almost unerring efficiency all night. ## Prussic Acid Poisoning Presents Problem in Livestock

Frost will be hitting Waller County before long, and this could lead to prussic acid poisoning in livestock grazing certain pasture grasses and forage, points out Mr. David McGregor, County Agent with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, The Texas A&M University System. Our average frost date is around November 24th.

Although many plants contain the toxic material that causes poisoning, those causing the highest

mortality in livestock when grazing after they have been frozen and wilted are Johnson and Sudan grasses and sorghum or hybrids of these.

The most dangerous time as far as the grazing of these plants is concerned is following frost when the plant material begins to wilt, emphasizes McGregor. Livestock should not be allowed access to the wilted material until it has dried completely. This usually takes three or four days of good sunlight. New plant growth usually becomes nontoxic and can be grazed within 10 days to two weeks following a rain.

As far as prussic acid poisoning is concerned, the poison acts rapidly and can kill animals within minutes. In most acute cases, animals become affected within 10-15 minutes after eating toxic material and can die in two to three minutes. Symptoms may include a brief period of stimulation followed by depression and paralysis. Signs of colic may be present. Stupor (loss of sensibility), difficult breathing and frequent convulsions may result. Death is caused by suffocation since oxygen remains in the blood and is not exchanged to the tissues. This also causes the blood to appear bright red.

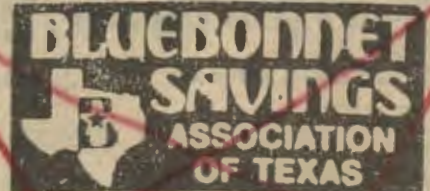
To prevent prussic acid poisoning in livestock, McGregor outlines these

steps:

1. Allow plant material affected by frost to dry thoroughly before grazing. This may require a week or more of good sunlight.

2. Feed animals hay or a supplement before turning them in on plants that may contain prussic acid. Animals that are not hungry will not be affected as seriously by toxic material since their intake will be limited.

3. Remove all animals

ditionally, a number of administrative and support positions have been eliminated over the next two years from our staff, about a 10 percent reduction.

"To accomplish this obviously painful task of staff reduction, we began with a careful study of state, regional and county situations," Carpenter noted. "We looked at a number of factors, such as number of farms, cash receipts, com-

plexity of program needs in various counties and regions, plus special clientele needs."

Regarding clientele needs, Carpenter pointed out that a number of regional conferences had been completed that involved some 250 key leaders over the state. These conferences were aimed at identifying critical issues facing Texans—issues which are within the

scope of the Extension Service's mission.

these conferences and the detailed studies noted above, a statewide staffing plan was developed, Carpenter said.

"Be assured that it is the goal of the Texas Agricultural Extension Service to provide high quality educational programs to address the needs of the state's citizens," Carpenter said.

"Furthermore, it is our intent to meet this goal within the framework of prudent and wise management of resources made available by federal, state and local governments."

The nationwide system of the Cooperative Extension Service was established in 1914 with the passage of the Smith-Lever Act. The Texas legislature established the Texas Agricultural Extension Service a year later as a part of the Texas A&M University System, completing the triad of research, education and extension programming that is the framework of today's land-grant university system.



# STATE SESQUI-NEWS

A stroll down a brand-new riverwalk paved with bricks initialled by sponsors will complete Orange County citizens' gala Sesquicentennial observance next March 1 & 2, when Phase I of a \$125,000 downtown plaza improvement project is completed. This "facelift" for the Sabine river is just one example of the many permanent civic improvement projects that are underway in honor of Texas' 150th birthday in 1986, with hundreds of thousands of dollars being spent statewide on lasting reminders of Texas' proud year. From the renovation of Fair Park in Dallas, financed by city bonds, to the ambitious museum/ Buffalo Bayou renovation project of the city of Houston, even the larger cities are getting into the act.

And plans for the actual celebration, scheduled to begin in January, are proceeding at a breakneck speed as hundreds of thousands of community and association organizers gear up to stage the nearly 10,000 events that will take place through-out 1986.

"There is no doubt that the Texas Sesquicentennial will be the biggest celebration in the history of the state, with events and activities planned by nearly 2,000 communities and statewide associations," said Lynn Nabers, Sesquicentennial Commission Executive Director. As of the last meeting of the Commission, 1,800 community and association committees were either pending official sanction or had already received sanction from the Commission as Texas Independence Communities, Counties or Associations.

Plans of the local committees are as varied and colorful as Texas itself. From the Consultation on the Poesta in Beeville, where citizens will consider "seceding" for the sesquicentennial, to

the Spring Festival and Outhouse Races in Trinity, the only limit to Sesquicentennial activities is the Texas imagination. Tying it all together is a 3,000-mile Wagon Train, which will circle the state during the first six months of 1986 and pass through nearly 100 communities.

"The Sesquicentennial Commission has operated from day one on the basis that we were panning a grass roots celebration to be executed on the local level by the committees. And it is evident that each of these committees has done a superb job," said Nabors. "The Sesquicentennial will be the biggest, most exciting celebration Texas has ever seen."

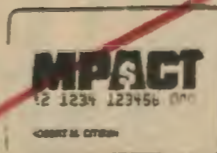

from the pasture if one in the herd shows any signs of poisoning.

4. Call a veterinarian immediately if an animal appears to be poisoned. An antidote to treat affected animals is highly efficient if given early.

This product is available from veterinarians.

5. Have suspect plant material checked by the Texas Veterinary Medical Diagnostic Laboratories at College Station or Amarillo. Local veterinarians will be happy to submit samples for you.

The overall key to prevent prussic acid poisoning in livestock is to be aware of plant materials

that may cause poisoning and then to keep cattle from grazing such plants until a safe period has passed, points out McGregor.

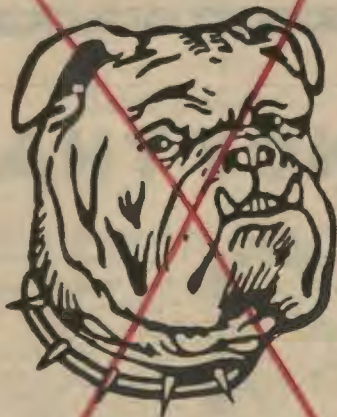

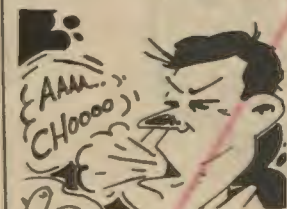

In the struggle to get the new county created (now Waller County), there was a petition for Groce County, which would take slices off Austin, Harris and Grimes Counties to make up the new county.

This plan drew a counter petition from Grimes County protesting any action that would create a new county at the expense of Grimes County territory, noting that Grimes was already a small county and there was objection to the proposed loss of any land - even one square rod! However, the bottom of the petition carried a notation that some citizens of Grimes County did not object to taking a few square miles along the southern boundary to straighten the line between Grimes and the proposed new county. And this is what was done!
