TO ALL COUNTY EXTENSION AGENTS:

Releases from the War Food Administration in early November indicate the need for continued high agricultural production in the United States. Until the war is finished and even thereafter, we dare not have "too little food too late."

Every person should want to help by doing something about his own food in 1945. We are having printed another leaflet similar to the attached for you to use in helping them. Its title will be "Your 1945 Home Food Program - What Must it Be?"

The subject matter will give, in brief form, the high points on planning a good home food program, and getting started on it early in the year.

Since the lcaflet can be printed in large numbers at a very small cost, we can make as many copies available as you can use effectively. We do not, however, want to print more than will be used the first quarter of 1945.

May I ask that the several agents in each county get together, and make some plans for reaching all the people early in 1945 with an enthusiastic appeal for good home food work. If you want to use copies of this leaflet, fill out the enclosed eard and return it to me immediately, so that we may have only as many copies of the leaflet printed as will be needed. It will be available around February 1, 1945.
