

CONROE BESTS BULLDOGS

In what could only be described as a classic defensive battle, the Waller Bulldogs remained scoreless to be defeated by Conroe Oakridge, 7 to 0 in Waller last Friday night.

Scoring was limited to one fourth-quarter touchdown, when quarterback Karey Vaught completed a 17 yard pass play to Tommy Sammons for the score. This play ended a drive of 55 yards and 10 plays. Oakridge made their extra point kick, so with 6:30 left, they went in front of the Bulldogs to stay.

The numbers speak for themselves in this game: Rushing - five Bulldog runners carried 29 times for 117 yards total, and QB Darrell Hawkins completed 2 passes in 7 tries, for a net yards gained in the air of 5. Hawkins also punted 6 times, gaining 204 yards, and compiled a 34 vard average per punt. Billy Johnson returned two punts for 10 yards, and one kickoff return for 32 yards. There were no interceptions by the dogs.

Oakridge ran the ball 42 times, picking up 128 yards, and completed only 2 passes for 26 more.

Since I have lived in this great state, I have come to appreciate the interesting laws that exist here, especially in our state constitution, but also in our counties and towns. Everything seems to be geared to the interest of the individual first, then to the group; just the opposite of the laws in other areas of America.

I have enjoyed reading parts of Texas's history over the years, and I am especially interested in the great reading coming out everywhere, now that we are about to celebrate our sesquicentennial birthday.

A lot of very fascinating things have happened in this state that make it fun to study, and Michener is famous for going all the way back to the beginning of time when he writes a book about a place or a people. He lays everything out in perfect order, some of the great capsules

explaining what happened and why, and it really helps to get you ready before you come up on something famous, that you may already know about. I mean things like our famous battles, the larger-than-life men who fill our past and who built this state into what it is today, and the strange way we pronounce some names of places or things.

The bottom line so far in the book, seems to be that Texas is unique in a thousand ways because we were at one time a free and independent nation, even though it was for a brief period in the state's history, and the men who made it all happen were sometimes scoundrels, but they possessed the bravery and brains to make it all come together into what we have today; a great and world-famous state.

I hope that if you don't get a chance to read Michener's "TEXAS", you will at least take the time to read of Texas history that are already being published in every paper, magazine, and book that will be printed in Texas in the next 14 months. You will probably be as fascinated by it all as I am, and if you're a Texan-By-Choice like me, you owe it to yourself to become as knowledgeable as possible about our state's history. You'll be a better Texan because of it, and you'll have a lot of fun doing it.

Of course, all of this stuff isn't off-limits to native Wouldn't you Texans. hate to think that there are Texans-By-Choice running around out there who know more about our state than you do?

Sen. Bentsen Fights Drug Trafficking In Texas

LLoyd Bentsen

More than 100 pounds of cocaine, valued at some \$3.5 million, was seized by U.S. Border Patrol officers from a 47-year-old Cuban national detained recently at a South Texas checkpoint

This confiscation brings to \$16.7 million the street value of narcotics seized this fiscal year in the Border Patrol's McAllen sector alone.

It is clear that the drug smugglers are back in business, despite a decline that resulted from the border crackdown earlier this year following the brutal murder of Drug Enforcement Administra-Enrique agent Camarena Salazar in Guadalaiara, Mexico.

In letters to the DEA and Customs in June, I expressed my concern about reports that drug traffickers are increasing their use of Texas on the "Mexican trampoline," a smuggling route from South America

through Mexico into the United States.

I asked these agencies to inform me of the shift in drug operations that smugglers seem to be South making from Florida to Texas, and the

that bounges cocaine plans to deal with it.

Customs officials informed me that cocaine and heroin smuggling are indeed on the rise in their Southwest Region, which includes Texas.



cocaine seized in the region jumped from 65 pounds to 3,310 pounds. That's a 50-fold increase. In the same timespan, heroin confiscations went from 13 pounds to 44 pounds.

Confiscations for 1985, as of August, stood at 2,117 pounds of cocaine and 21 pounds of heroin.

In addition to actual confiscations, Customs estimated that some 6,250 pounds of cocaine were smuggled into the United States through the Southwest Region during 1984. For 1985, that figure is expected to jump to 9,260

In response to this increased threat, Customs officials have advised me that they intend to commit more anti-narcotics resources to Texas.


But I am concerned that this effort by Customs will not be enough, especially

in light of the fact that the number of field agents assigned to Texas by the Drug Enforcement Adremained ministration virtually the same between 1979 and 1984.

During that time, while the amount of cocaine seized was increasing 50fold, DEA added only four agents to its Texas force, increasing it from 180 in 1979 to 184 in 1984.

I have written again to DEA Acting Administrator John C. Lawn, asking him this time to assign more agents to Texas and strengthen the federal efforts is our state in the war against drug trafficking.

We are not winning this war and we must get more agents in the field if we expect to turn the situation around.



credit cards.

a deficit greater than the maximum allowable ceilings set out by law.

This legislation is imperative to the cause of a balanced budget and reduced deficit. The Congress has shown over the 713/926-1161, Home past thirty years that it has neither the will nor the incentives to make the difficult choices necessary to reduce the deficit. Under this legislation, if the Congress or the President fails to act, then an automatic mechanism is triggered, reducing the spending overage for that year proportionally and across the board throughout the budget.

Several months ago it became clear to me that if we were ever going to take control of runaway federal spending and deficits, decisive action would have to be the key. We must act now. Dr. Richard Redfield Answers Questions About

The Eyesight

O. I'm a secretary. By the end of the day, my eyes are tired. I already wear reading glasses. Could the office lighting be the problem?

Joyce Slav

A. It might be, but your eyes might also be the cause, especially if your glasses are over a year old. If you have become more farsighted in the last several months, there may not be enough power in your lenses.

Or, you may be a candidate for bifocals or trifocals to give you different powers for different vision needs like typing, proofing and filing.

Before you see your eye doctor, measure the distance from your eyes to the different work tasks with a tape measure or a piece of string. This information will help your doctor prescribe glasses that will meet your individual needs. If your present lenses do not have the proper power they may be focused at a distance other than your

causing eyestrain. As for lighting, be sure your work area is well lit


