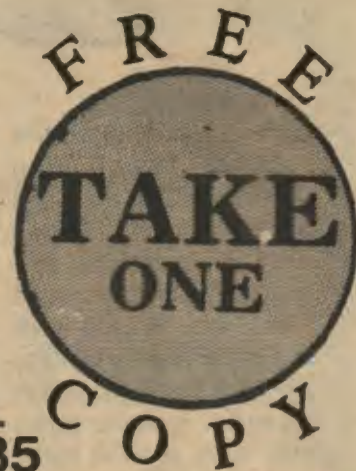

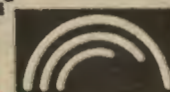

College Scholarships Now Available

Up to \$2,000 in scholarship funds is available for certain students who've been planning ahead for their financial future.

If you hold a life, health or annuity contract with the leading national fraternal society, Lutheran Brotherhood (LB), you have a chance to compete for valuable scholarship awards that can help pay for your education next year.

The organization has provided educational support to its members and other Lutheran students for over 30 years. The nearly 200 scholarships available in the 1985-86 LB Member Scholarship Program fall into two categories:

- **LB Member Scholarships** are awarded each year to members entering their first year at junior or senior college or vocational-technical school. These renewable scholarships are awarded to eligible students on the basis of academic record, SAT or ACT scores, extra-curricular activities and leadership skills.

- **LB Member In-College Scholarships** are awarded to LB members who are currently undergraduates pursuing a baccalaureate degree. These non-renewable awards are presented on the basis of academic record, extra-curricular activities and leadership skills.

Up to \$2,000 per year is available to member scholarship winners who attend a Lutheran institution. Winners who attend private non-Lutheran institutions are eligible to receive up to \$1,000 per year, while winners who attend publicly supported institutions may receive up to \$500 per year.

Applications for scholarships will be accepted now. All phases of the scholarship competition are administered by the College Scholarship Service, Princeton, New Jersey. 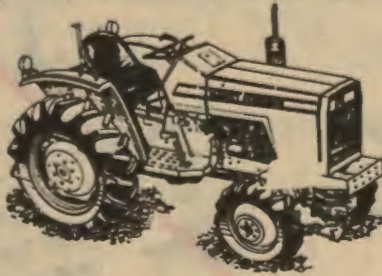

American Democracy In Action

November is a notable month in the history of democracy. In November, 1777, the Articles of Confederation and Perpetual Union, uniting the states under a common government were adopted by the Continental Congress and submitted to the states for ratification. November 26, 1789, was another special day in American history: President George Washington set this date aside as a day of national thanksgiving for the adoption of the United States Constitution.

November, 1985, may well someday be considered another landmark date in the history of democracy. Representatives from the Trade Commission of Cameroon, an independent republic in Africa, will be in the United

States to buy American products and technology in an effort to strengthen their economy. The mission is led by minister of Industry and Commerce, Minister Ongolo.

The Cameroonians are seeking to diversify their sources of raw materials and equipment and to benefit from US expertise in various areas of business and marketing. Several joint Cameroonian and American investment projects are expected, involving the dairy, housing and natural gas industries, among others.

Many Americans welcome the visit by the Cameroon Trade Mission. The Cameroonians want to buy American—and that means more exports and a more favorable

trade balance. That's good news for our economy and may mean more jobs will be made available in many industries.

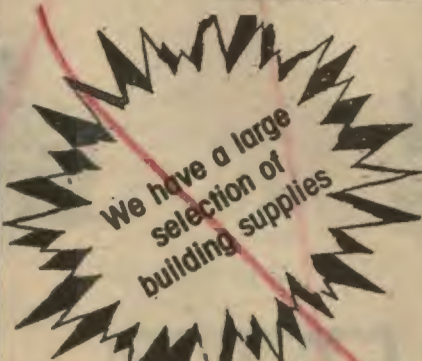

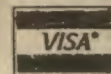

ECGs—The Beat Goes On

About 40 million Americans are affected by heart and blood vessel disease each year. Many of these can be treated successfully if diagnosed early. That's where ECG tests come in. Having such a test is painless, safe and quick and could save your life.

It works by measuring changes in the heart's electrical charge. The heart is a muscle with four separate chambers, that carry electrical charges which change as the heart beats. When the heart contracts, it has a positive charge, when it relaxes it has a negative charge. In a normal ECG recording the waves follow known patterns. Variations from the normal pattern may indicate heart disease or abnormality.

During an ECG, a person lies down on a table with arms, legs and chest bared. The technician applies solution or pads to the skin and then straps on the electrodes. Wires are connected to each electrode. The electrodes are applied in about six different

positions. After the machine records the electronic impulses on a paper tape, the patient is unplugged and the tape is studied by physicians.

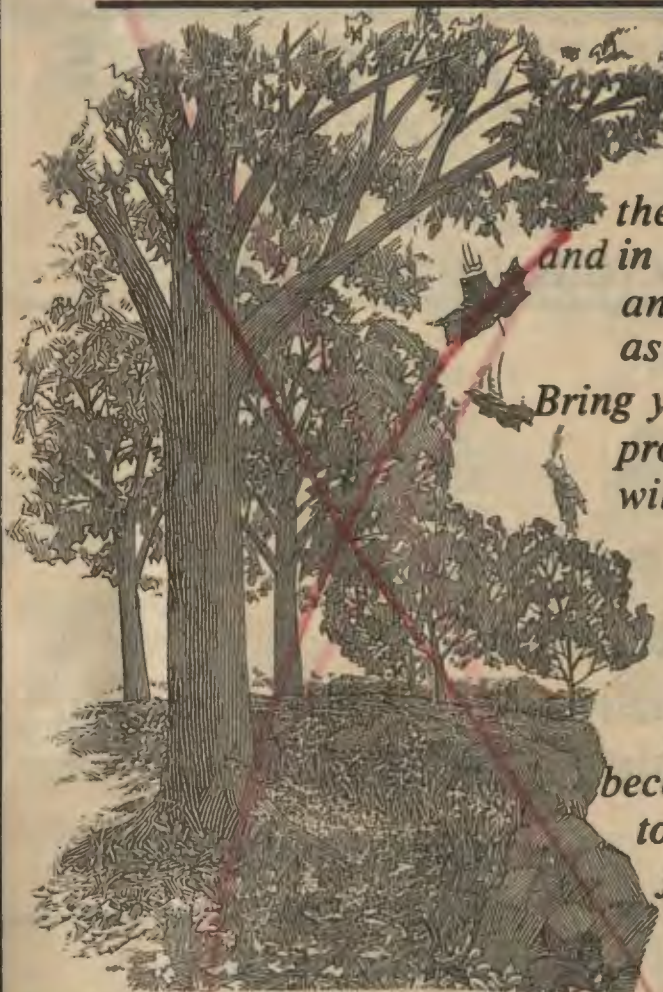

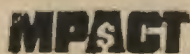

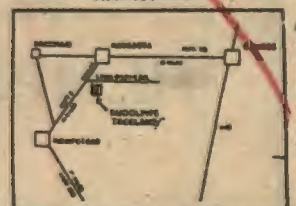

Dr. Richard Redfield Answers Questions About

The Eyesight Of Texas

Richard Redfield, O.D.

Q. My 12 year old daughter was sent home from school with a vision report saying she had to have her eyes examined. The report said her vision was 20/40. Is 20/40 vision really bad enough to have her eyes examined?

A. During a vision screening, a school nurse will refer a child to an eye doctor if his or her vision is 20/40 or worse. The Texas Department of Health has recommended to all school districts that vision of 20/40 or worse warrants the attention of an optometrist or ophthalmologist. Many times, the vision may be better than 20/40 but other signs of eye disorders may be present, that the nurse feels needs attention; such as an eye that points in the wrong direction. This is done to alert parents to the possibility of vision that may be hindering the child's ability to perform well in school.

20/40 is a way used by eye doctors to designate a certain level of visual acuity. In this situation, it means that your daughter must be twice as close to the blackboard to see the same thing a child with 20/20 vision has to be. If your daughter could only see 20/60, she would have to be three times closer.

The Texas Department of Public Safety also used 20/40 as a guideline. If your vision is worse than 20/40 you would fail the vision exam part of the driver's test.

If your child does bring home a referral form from the school nurse, it is a good idea that she be examined, not only for visual acuity, but for things pertaining to eye health, color vision and eye muscle ability. It is recommended that all children be examined by age four anyway, to rule out eye disorders that can interfere with learning.
