Dear Mr. Yancy:

Mr. Yancy, if we are not able to continue our participation in District VI-C, I am asking that your office refund our entry fee of §5.00, and drop us from District IV-C completely. It is just too far for us to participate in when there is a district here by us where schools are on the same competitive level as ours. Our check dated 10-23-54 said "not negotiable unless applied to District VI-C".

The State Executive Committee met in the Office of the Director at 10:00 A. M., December 8, 1965.

The meeting was called to order by the Director and the business of the hour was presented. There was a dispute, evidenced by two telegrams, as to who was the winner of the Quarter-Final game, played between Mayflower High, Tatum and Carver High, Garland on Saturday night, December 4, 1965 in Longview, Texas.

The first telegram was sent by the Official Refree for the game, Mr. S. A. Anderson, to the office of the State Director, Monday morning, December 6, 1965. This telegram declared Mayflower, Tatum as winner on the basis of the following statistics:

Score--Mayflower 12, Garland 12; Penetrations--Mayflower 2, Garland 2; First Downs--Mayflower 8, Garland 7; Net Yardage--Mayflower 190, Garland 182; Garland claims a third penetration.

On the play in question, Garland reached the Mayflower 19-yd. line. Garland was penalized on that play, however, and the penetration was not allowed. They failed to reach the 20-yd. line again. Mayflower claims a third penetration. Or the play in question, Mayflower scored a touchdown, but received a penalty which carried them back outside the 20. They scored again on the same drive. They claimed two penetrations. Since both penetrations came on the same drive, one was not allowed. That leaves the penetrations tied at two each. I can verify this because a record of penetrations was kept by me on the field. The other statistics listed above were taken from the records of the official statistician. These statistics were verified Saturday night following the game after consulting the Prairie View Interscholastic League of Texas Rules and Regulations, page 82, paragraph 14.

The second telegram was delivered Tuesday morning, December 7, 1965.

This telegram was sent from the Superintendent's office at Marshall, Texas. This second telegram stated that:

The initial de**ci**sion made by the statisticians was correct, and that Garland won 3-2 on penetrations. The Refree had previously

rendered a decision of 2 penetrations each based on the unofficial statistics kept by the Refree on the field and the record of the Home Statistician.

The Home Statistician questioned one decision on a Garland penetration, which has since been resolved in his mind. Since the two statisticians are now in agreement, the refree has no official capacity in determining penetrations and the decision of the statisticians should be accepted as final.

The Committee deliberated over the two telegrams and conflicting reports made by the officials. The final decision of the Committee in the interest of good relationship for the two schools and the districts, the interest of the students involved and the fact both schools and the officials involved did not get a clear and announced decision before leaving Longview, Saturday night, December 4, 1965, reached the decision that there would be no representative from the quarter-finals of Districts III-A and IV-A and that the winner of quarter-finals of Districts V-A and VII-A (O. J. Thomas High, Cameron), move to the Finals.
