SUMMARY OF MILITARY OCCUPATIONS

10. TITLE—DESCRIPTION—RELATED CIVILIAN OCCUPATION
CABLE SPLICER, TELEPHONE AND TELEGRAPH-- Maintained military wire communication system by splicing insulated wires to join multiple conductor cables in order to preserve the continuity and insulation of each conductor. Completed splices by drying out moisture with paraffin or desiccant, wrapping according to method used, and covering with lead sleeves. Tested the sheath by means of gas or air pressure; Tested conductors for continuity and insulation by means of buzzer system or other test instruments after splice has been made.
