Mr. Young was not even present at our district meeting lest fall when the district met. Mr. Young sent word by Mr. Moore of Temple. Our district acted upon this word of Mr. Young through Mr. Moore and declared all our district games forfeit and declared our boy ineligible to play basketball, track, and baseball.

We called Mr. Meredith again concerning this ruling referred above. Mr. Meredith said his basketball team is going to Waco this week and he was going along with the team and ask Mr. Young to show him the tournament official scorebook to see if Josh Bedford's name appears thereon.

Is it ok for our boy to play basketball until the district proves him ineligible beyond a word of mouth statement?

Dear Mr. Cotton:

I have your letter of January 10, 1966, relative to your efforts and the general attitude of the member schools of your district.

It appears that the "Basketball Code" has no meaning to the schools involved. It states, ". . . . Victory is no great matter. The important thing in sports is the manly striving to excel and the good feeling it fosters between those who play fair and have no excuse when they lose."

I was of the opinion that you were headed in the right direction from your first letter. That is, to have it clearly understood that unless the member schools of the district could agree to set up a schedule and follow it, the schools not be considered members of the Prairie View Interscholastic League and would be subject to suspension.

There is no provision made, however, for schools to sever their relations with member schools of their district and continue to be a part of the Prairie View Interscholastic League.

May I suggest that you check again the duties of the District Executive Committee, follow the duties as outlined and certify to the State Office a district winner, on time. In the event you are not successful in carrying out the duties as outlined under the <u>Basketball Plan</u>, there will be no district representative from your district. The schools in violation are subject to suspension by the State Executive Committee, for failure to abide by the <u>Basketball Plan</u>.

For the sake of the students involved, please continue to strive for a good district.

Dear Mr. Dockery:

I have your letter of recent date, relative to the eligibility of a student who transferred from one school to another school. According to Article VIII, Section 11, Changing Schools -- "A pupil changing schools is not eligible in League contest whose parents (or quardian) reside outside the school district, until he shall have been in attendance at the school or in the school system to which he changes for one year immediately preceding the contest; ... There are some conditions which this rule does not apply given under the same rule.

Article VIII, Section 12, One Year Rule, states: "A pupil who has represented a high school (other than his present school) or academy in either football or basketball is ineligible for one calendar year in a school to which he changes

According to Article IX, <u>Disputes</u>- All protest must be made in writing, written twenty-four hours after the contest. Eligibility protest, however, are not subject to the 24 hour limitation.

May I suggest that you read the Duties of the District Executive Committee under Boys' Basketball Plan. Rule 6, page 88, will answer your last question.

In the event you feel that a decision by the District Executive Committee is unfair, you may appeal to the State Executive Committee. A written statement of facts must be presented. These facts will be reviewed by the committee and a decision will be rendered based upon the facts at hand.

It is our hope that your dispute will be settled by the District Executive Committee.
