

Hempstead's quarterback Mike McDade lead the Cats attack by completing 12 of his 16 pass attempts for 321 yards, no interceptions, and four touchdowns. Waco's star of the evening was Chris Drake, who rushed for 114 vards.



General Sam Houston. when he decided to take his small Texian Army and execute a series of strategic retreats rather than face the large Mexican Army head-on, received a great deal of ridicule from both the people and the newly elected government of the Republic of Texas. Much of the verbal harassment came while he was encamped along the Brazos River at the Groce Plantation. An example of the abuse heaped upon him is seen in the letter which came from President Burnet while the General was at Groces. In part it read: "Sir: The enemy are laughing you to scom. You must fight them. You must retreat no farther. The country expects you to fight. The salvation of the country depends upon your doing so."

All of which reminds me of the old adage: He who fights and runs away will live to fight another day!




Tax Workshop



Fair Ass'n Meets The annual stockholders meeting of the Waller



Both Waco and Hempstead scored once in the 4th period, and both failed their extra point in attempts, so the game finished up at Hempstead 33 and Waco 12.





every month in the Assemby Room at the Waller County Courthouse at 7:30 PM. They are in the process of raising funds to support their operation. and to fund a reward system which will be set up soon. They have appealed to each city in the area, as well as the Waller County Commissioners Court, for money to help them get started. They also appeal any businesses and individuals in the area for funds in any amount. These donations can be given to any Director, or mailed to: Waller County Crimestoppers Inc., P. O. Box 1148, Waller, Texas 77484

One of their first efforts will be to print stuffers for use by banks, grocery stores, and anyone else who will stuff them in their mailing. These mailout pieces will tell everyone about the new organization, why it exists, and how they can become involved with this very important group. A telephone line for the exclusive use of Crimestoppers has been installed and the number is (409) 826-8266. Collect calls will be accepted, and this phone will allow citizens to get in touch with them right away. Information gathered in this manner will benefit all law enforcement bodies in the area, regardless of their home county. Lack of money prohibits their having a direct line from the south end of the county at this time, but plans call for the installation of such a service when funds permit. Crimestoppers has begun what should prove to be a very unique, fun and interesting method for raising additional funds. They intend to install a portable "jail" in each town, which will be used in this manner. You may, for a \$25.00 donation, swear out a warrant for the arrest of anyone you wish; hopefully a friend, and a volunteer police officer will "arrest" that person, and bring him to the jail where he or she will have a "fine" imposed upon him. This fine will consist of his having to call others for pledges of donations, in a

preset amount, and he will be released only when his quota has been met. He then may have someone of his choosing "arrested" in the same manner. This is all in fun, and it is hoped that the citizenry will participate in the spirit in which it is intended. No person will be held against his or her will.

The Crimestopper system has worked very well in many places around Texas and other states, and it should perform a vital service to us as citizens of Waller County. We all need to support this effort, both financially and by participating to the fullest extent possible when asked to do so. This way, we will all come out "winners" the the fight to reduce crime in our area.






