SUBJECT: Re-Classification and Districts for 1966-67

I am enclosing the District Assignments for 1966-67 football, basketball and spring meets competition.

You will observe that general changes have been made in connection with the classification and districting of schools.

These changes are in accordance with previous announcements and communications and the adoption of a rule to make such changes on even years. They become effective at the beginning of the 1966-67 school session.

In making these changes, an attempt was made toward:

1. Improving competition where possible by tending to equalize the average membership of the competing schools.
2. By relieving as far as possible, the overcrowded conditions in the extra large districts, especially football.
3. By reducing travel mileage where possible, keeping in mind the best interest of all schools.

We regret that in a few cases we have not been able to find a solution to existing problems due to the location of certain schools in relation to that of other schools of the same classification. Also of importance, is the matter of keeping play-off brackets even and avoiding byes where possible.

These assignments have been made after careful study and work by your Director and State Executive Committee, and we sincerely hope that you will be able to cooperate with us in every way possible in making it work to the best advantage.

Again, I thank you for your usual cooperation in meeting these changes.
