calling his time as Waller County Extension Agent many years ago, and cited several friends and workers who helped make those years profitable for everyone involved in the program. ## Major Battle Fought In Waller War on Drugs!

Last Tuesday night saw a significant battle fought in the Waller War on Drugs campaign, and the participants are confident that they will win this war.

Several hundred interested citizens of the Waller area gathered at the high school cafeteria for a sumptuous barbeque dinner with all of the trimmings last Tuesday night, October 22nd, followed by what one might term as a highly emotional and very educational meeting in the auditorium. The young ladies of the Waller Future Homemakers of America assisted in feeding the large group, and the Waller Teen Drug Awareness Group made their presence felt throughout the evening, helping where needed. This was all a part of Drug Awareness Week, which has been in the forefront of activities in all of the Waller schools throughout the past week.

The highlight of the evening came when Mr. Harry Edwards, renowned Toxicologist from Freeport, Texas, spoke to the group, giving examples of the

horrible things he has witnessed on the drug scene over the past several years. Edwards cited cases where the human body and mind has been virtually destroyed by illegal drug use, and told about how it is often futile to try and save a person who has severely overdosed on the wrong combinations of the drugs available on the streets today.

Mrs. Martha Overby, who spearheaded the Waller War on Drugs last spring, after her family's personal involvement with drugs awakened them to the local problems, gave a personal testimony of the battle that they waged as a family unit, and how she determined that one person CAN make a difference in this fight. Mr. & Mrs. Overby, and other interested parents and citizens organized their

anger into the powerful group now functioning in Waller.

The week of October 21-25 saw "Drug Awareness Week" in all of the schools of the Waller ISD, with various grades participating in essay contests, skits, poster contests, etc., all to heighten awareness of youth and parents to the dangers of illegal drugs. Holliman Elementary held a series of the contests, with the following results: 3rd Grade Essay Winners were Kendra Seals, Cari Robison and Tony Rivera, and Poster winners were Serena Thomann, Heath Clarkston and Jennifer Doyal. In the 4th grade, the poster winners were; Scott Bartee, Felecia Pool, and Justin King, with Amy Sitton receiving Honorable Mention. Roberts Road Elementary 4th Grade held a Poster Contest, with the winners

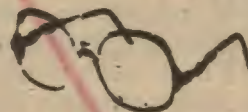

and Waller led 7 - 0. QB Richard Robertson nailed Hawkins with a slick pass in the 3rd quarter, which Hawkins took in for 6, thus

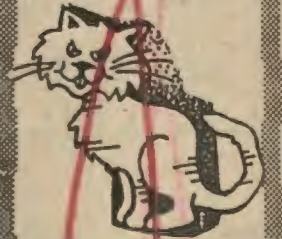
